PR-46: Glasshouse and field analysis of transgenic tobacco plants for resistance to Australian cucumber mosaic virus strains from lupins

Name of Organisation Proposing Release: Murdoch University

Address of Organisation: WA State Agricultural Biotechnology Centre, School of Biological and Environmental Sciences, Murdoch University, Perth WA 6150

Name of Organism: Tobacco (*Nicotiana tabacum*)

Purpose of the Release: Transgenic tobacco plants modified for resistance to cucumber mosaic cucumovirus (CMV) will be field tested as a model for lupins. CMV is the most economically important virus disease of lupins and the final aim of the work is to develop CMV-resistant lupins. The aim of the current proposal is to identify existing DNA constructs (e.g. coat protein, defective replicase) which can confer resistance in tobacco to CMV strains which infect the Australian lupin crop. The trial will establish whether results from glasshouse tests for CMV-resistance are reproduced in field tests and provide information on design and effectiveness of constructs for later transfer to lupins.

Brief Description of the Nature and Effect of the Genetic Modification: The introduced genes, either the coat protein gene of CMV or a copy of a defective replicase gene of CMV, are expressed throughout the tissues of the transgenic plants. On subsequent infection with virus particles, the expression of these genes interferes with viral replication, making the plants resistant to the virus.

Location and Size of Trial: Murdoch University, Perth, WA. 40 plots of transgenic plants, 16 plots of non-transgenic plants; in 1.5 m x 0.8 m plots.



DECLARATION OF A CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY STANDARD

Consumer Protection Notice No. 2 of 1994

PORTABLE RAMPS FOR VEHICLES

I, JEANNETTE McHUGH, Minister for Consumer Affairs, pursuant to section 65E(1) of the *Trade Practices Act 1974*, hereby:

- (a) Revoke the declaration of a product safety standard for portable ramps for vehicles notified in the *Gazette* dated 29 November 1985;
- (b) Declare that, in respect of the goods specified in Division 1 of the Schedule to this Notice, the standards specified in Division 2 of the Schedule, as varied by the variations specified in Division 3 of the Schedule are consumer product safety standards for the purposes of section 65C of the *Trade Practices Act 1974*; and
- (c) Declare that the standard first mentioned in Division 2 of the Schedule shall cease to have effect on and from 1 January 1996.




It is desirable that the role of the AD Commissioner temporarily be performed pending a permanent appointment,








(g) the Directors of Schools in the Institute of the Arts, none of whom holds another office specified in section 26 of the Act; and

(h) 2 members elected from among their number by the members of the academic staff of the Institute of the Arts, being persons, neither of whom:

(i) holds an office specified in section 26 of the Act; and

(ii) holds office as a member of the Board under paragraph (f) or (g).

2.5 Subsection 3 (3):

Omit "paragraphs (1) (c) and (d)", substitute "paragraphs (1) (c), (d) and (h)".

2.6 Subsection 3 (3):

After "of a faculty", insert "or of the Institute of the Arts".

2.7 Subparagraph 3 (3) (a) (i):

Omit "tutor", substitute "associate lecturer".

2.8 Subparagraph 3 (3) (a) (ii):

Omit "or senior research fellow", substitute ", senior research associate, fellow or senior fellow".

2.9 Subparagraph 3 (3) (b) (i):

After "faculty", insert "or the Institute of the Arts".

2.10 Subparagraph 3 (3) (b) (ii):

Add at the end "or the Institute of the Arts".

2.11 Subsection 3 (4):

Omit "paragraphs (1) (c) and (d)", substitute "paragraphs (1) (c), (d) and (h)".

2.12 Subsection 3 (4):

After "faculty", insert "or the Institute of the Arts".

3. Section 4 (Membership-students)**3.1 Subsection 4 (1):**

Omit "15B (1) (k)", substitute "'26 (j)".

3.2 After paragraph 4 (1) (a), insert:

"(aa) 1 member elected from among their number by the undergraduate students of the Institute of the Arts; and".

3.3 Subsection 4 (2):

After "bachelors degree", insert "or any other undergraduate award referred to in subrule 2 (3) or (5) of the Degrees, Diplomas and Certificates Rules".

3.4 New subsection 4 (2AA):

After subsection 4 (2), insert:

"(2AA) For the purposes of paragraph (1) (aa), a person is an undergraduate student of the Institute of the Arts if he or she is enrolled in

(a) a course of study for a bachelors degree or any other undergraduate award referred to in subrule 2 (3) or (5) of the Degrees, Diplomas and Certificates Rules that is; or

(b) a combined course for 2 bachelors degrees 1 of which is;
a degree responsibility for which is vested in the Institute of the Arts."

3.5 New subsection 4 (2AA):

After subsection 4 (2A), insert:

"(2B) A person is not eligible for election as a member referred to in paragraph (1) (aa), by the undergraduate students of the Institute of the Arts, if the person is:

- (a) a member referred to in paragraph (1) (a); or
- (b) a candidate for election under that paragraph; or
- (c) a member referred to in paragraph (1) (b); or
- (d) a candidate for election under that paragraph."

3.6 Subsection 4 (3):

Add at the end:

;or (c) enrolled in a course of study for a bachelors degree, or for any other undergraduate award or any other undergraduate award referred to in subrule 2 (3) or (5) of the Degrees, Diplomas and Certificates Rules responsibility for which is vested in the Institute of the Arts."

4. Section 5 (Terms of office)

4.1 Subsection 5 (1):

Omit "Subject to sub-sections (2) and (3), the member referred to in paragraph 15B (1) (g) of the Act and the members referred to in paragraphs 3 (1) (b), (c) and (d)", substitute "The members referred to in paragraphs 3 (b), (c), (d), (e) and (h)".

4.2 Subsections 5 (2) and (3):

Omit the subsections.

5. Section 7 (Power of Board to make recommendations to Council)

5.1 Subsection 7 (2):

Omit "sub-section 15B (2)", substitute "subsection 25 (2)".

INTERPRETATION AMENDMENT STATUTE NO. 5

1. Amendment

1.1 The Interpretation Statute is amended as set out in this Statute.

2. Section 1 (Application of *Acts Interpretation Act 1901*)

2.1 Omit the Rule, substitute:

Application of *Acts Interpretation Act 1901*

"1. Nothing in this Statute prejudices the application to the Statutes of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1901*."

3. Section 2 (By-laws, rules and orders)

3.1 Subrule 2 (3):

Omit the subrule, substitute:

" (3) The *Acts Interpretation Act 1901* applies to by-laws, rules and orders made under statutes as if:

(a) they were statutes; and

(b) each by-law, rule or order were a section of a statute."





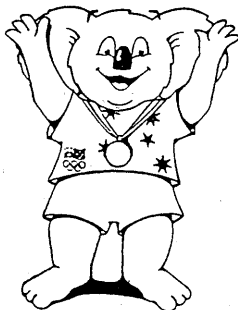

SCHEDULE

AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE AWARD
OF THE NATIONAL MEDAL**1. Regulation 2**

1.1 Omit the regulation, substitute:

Definitions

"1A. In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears:

'qualifying date' in relation to a service organisation referred to in subparagraph 2(1)(a)(i), (ii), (iii), (iv), (v) or (vi), means the date referred to in the subparagraph;

'service organisation' means:

- (a) an Australian police force; or
- (b) an Australian fire service; or
- (c) an Australian ambulance service; or
- (d) the Australian Protective Service; or
- (e) an Australian correctional service; or
- (f) an Australian emergency service.

Conditions for Award of the National Medal

"2. (1) The National Medal may be awarded to a person who:

- (a) has served diligently:
 - (i) as a member of an Australian police force on or after 14 February 1975; or
 - (ii) as a member of an Australian fire service on or after 14 February 1975; or
 - (iii) as a member of an Australian ambulance service on or after 14 February 1975; or
 - (iv) as a member of the Australian Protective Service on or after 1 April 1986; or
 - (v) as a member of an Australian correctional service on or after 30 April 1987; or
 - (vi) as a member of an Australian emergency service on or after 30 April 1987; and
- (b) has served in a service organisation for at least 15 years, or for periods that, in the aggregate, amount to at least 15 years, worked out in accordance with regulation 2A; and
- (c) has during the period or periods of service:
 - (i) maintained a level of training sufficient to fulfil the primary function of the service organisation; and
 - (ii) maintained a level of physical fitness sufficient to fulfil the primary function of the service organisation; and
 - (iii) performed, or been ready to perform, the primary function of the service organisation.

“(2) A clasp to the National Medal may be awarded to a medal holder who has:

- (a) served diligently as a member of a service organisation for a further period of at least 10 years, or for further periods that, in the aggregate, amount to at least 10 years, worked out in accordance with regulation 2A; and
- (b) has during the further period or periods of service:
 - (i) maintained a level of training sufficient to fulfil the primary function of the service organisation; and
 - (ii) maintained a level of physical fitness sufficient to fulfil the primary function of the service organisation; and
 - (iii) performed, or been ready to perform, the primary function of the service organisation.

“(3) Service may be taken into account for the purposes of subregulation (1) or (2) whether the service was rendered on a full-time basis or on a part-time basis and whether the service was paid or unpaid.

“(4) Service must not be taken into account for the purposes of subregulation (1) or (2) if it is service for which an award for long service, good conduct or efficiency has already been made by, or in the name of, The Sovereign or by the Governor-General.

Calculating Length of Service

“2A. If a person who was a member of a service organisation on or after the qualifying date for the organisation has served more than one period in the organisation, or has also served in one or more other service organisations, or both, then, when calculating the length of the person's service for the purposes of paragraph 2(1)(b) or subregulation 2(2), each period served by the person in each service organisation in which the person has served at any time may be taken into account.”.

“Aboriginal body” means a body established by the Act;

2 *ATSIC (Misbehaviour) Determination No. 2***Behaviour taken to be misbehaviour for the purposes of the Act**

3. (1) For the purposes of subsection 4A (1) of the Act, the following behaviour is taken to be misbehaviour for the purposes of the Act:

- (a) behaviour of a person at a meeting of an Aboriginal body that:
 - (i) has a seriously disruptive effect on the meeting; and
 - (ii) continues after the person who is presiding at the meeting requests the first-mentioned person to refrain from the behaviour;
- (b) contravention of subsection 90 (2) of the Act;
- (c) provision of incorrect or misleading information for the purposes of, or that results in, the payment of remuneration or allowances under a law of the Commonwealth;
- (d) harassment or intimidation of, or interference with:
 - (i) a member, or an employee, of an Aboriginal body in relation to the performance of the duties of the member or employee; or
 - (ii) another person in relation to the performance of the duties of a member, or an employee, of an Aboriginal body;
- (e) behaviour that is found under the *Sex Discrimination Act 1984* to be sexual harassment within the meaning of Division 3 of Part II of that Act;
- (f) behaviour of a member of an Aboriginal body in the capacity of member of that body that brings the body, or another Aboriginal body, into public disrepute;
- (g) bribery or attempted bribery;
- (h) behaviour of a member of an Aboriginal body for the purposes of, or that results in, influencing another member, or an employee, of the body or another Aboriginal body in the performance of his or her duties to gain an improper advantage;
- (i) serious misuse of the facilities, funds or equipment of an Aboriginal body;
- (j) commission of an offence (for which a person may, on conviction, be imprisoned) that results in a conviction.

ATSIC (Misbehaviour) Determination No. 2 3

(2) For the purposes of paragraph (1) (j), a person is taken to have been convicted of an offence if:

- (a) the person has been convicted, whether summarily or on indictment, of the offence; or
- (b) the person has been charged with, and found guilty of, the offence but discharged without conviction.


