# NOTICE OF A PERMIT GRANTED UNDER THE ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION (SEA DUMPING) ACT 1981

Pursuant to section 25 of the *Environment Protection (Sea Dumping) Act* 1981, notice is given that a permit was granted on 31 May 1996 that allows the Townsville Port Authority to dump at sea up to 500,000 cubic metres of dredge spoil arising from maintenance dredging works at the Port of Townsville. The permit is granted for a period of one year.

#### **NOTICE PURSUANT TO SECTION 14**

Cadmium In Cocoa Products (A298). The Authority received an application (A298) on 22 December 1995 from The Confectionery Manufacturers of Australasia to amend the Australian Food Standards Code. The application is for approval to increase the maximum permitted concentrations of cadmium in cocoa from 0.5 to 1.0 mg/kg, and in cocoa paste from 0.35 to 1.0 mg/kg.

The Authority has made a preliminary assessment, accepted the application and will make a full assessment. To assist this process, the Authority invites written submissions on matters relevant to the application by 24 July 1996.

#### **NOTICE PURSUANT TO SECTION 16**

CaNa<sub>2</sub>EDTA in Canned Fish (A282). The Authority received an application (A282) on 8 August 1995, from Unifoods to permit the addition of up to 250 mg/kg of calcium disodium ethylenediaminetetraacetate (CaNa<sub>2</sub>EDTA) in canned crustacea and canned molluscs. The Authority proposes to extend the use of CaNa<sub>2</sub>EDTA to all canned fish, including canned tuna and canned salmon to further promote consistency with international food regulations.

The Authority has completed a full assessment of the application, has prepared a draft variation to Standard D2 - Canned Fish, Canned Fish Products, and will now conduct an inquiry to consider the draft variation.

To assist in this process, the Authority invites written submissions on matters relevant to the purpose of the inquiry by 24 July 1996.

# NOTIFICATION OF A REVIEW OF THE RATE OF INTERIM DUTY APPLICABLE TO DIOCTYL PHTHALATE EXPORTED FROM JAPAN AND TAIWAN

#### AND

NOTIFICATION OF A REVIEW OF NORMAL VALUES AND NON INJURIOUS FREE ON BOARD PRICES OF DIOCTYL PHTHALATE EXPORTED FROM BELGIUM, FRANCE, GERMANY, REPUBLIC OF KOREA AND VENEZUELA

In accordance with the requirements of section 269ZB(1)(a) of the *Customs Act* 1901 (the Act), the Australian Customs Service advises that it proposes to review the rate of interim dumping duty attaching to dioctyl phthalate (DOP) exported from Japan and Taiwan.

DOP is classified to sub-heading 2917.32.00 (statistical code 17) in Schedule 3 to the Customs Tariff Act 1987.

The review follows an application by ICI Australia Operations Pty Ltd (ICI) under subsection 269Z(1) of the Act, requesting a review of the rate of interim duty. ICI claims that a variable factor relevant to the determination of interim duty applicable to DOP exported from Japan and Taiwan has changed.

The application indicates that changes to the price of raw materials necessary to manufacture DOP have affected variable factors (normal values and non-injurious prices) relevant to the determination of interim duty on DOP from Japan and Taiwan. Consequently, Customs will be examining the variable factors relevant to the determination of the interim duty.

ICI in its application also requested a review of the normal values (NVs) and non-injurious free on board (NIFOB) prices in respect of DOP imported from Belgium, France, Germany, Republic of Korea and Venezuela.

Customs considers the application provides sufficient evidence for it to conduct an enquiry, with a view to recommending that the Minister re-ascertain, in accordance with section 269TAD of the Act, NVs for exports from these countries. When Customs carries out a review of NVs it also conducts a simultaneous review of NIFOBs

It therefore proposes to review the NVs and NIFOBs in respect of DOP exported from Belgium, France, Germany, Republic of Korea and Venezuela.

The Anti-Dumping Authority has decided to hold an inquiry, under the provisions of section 8A of the Anti-Dumping Authority Act 1988, into whether it should recommend to the Minister that anti-dumping measures continue to apply on exports of dioctyl phthalate by certain companies in Belgium, France, Germany, the Republic of Korea and Venezuela.

On 20 March 1996, the Authority announced that the anti-dumping measures imposed in 1991 in relation to dioctyl phthalate are due to expire on 27 November 1996 and invited interested parties to apply for the continuation of anti-dumping measures.

The Authority has received an application from the Australian manufacturer of dioctyl phthalate, ICI Australia Operations Pty Ltd, for the continuation of anti-dumping measures until the year 2001.

During its inquiry, the Authority will address the claim made by the applicant that the termination of duties would cause severe price suppression and price depression, and would result in recurrence of material injury by dumping.

Interested parties are invited to make a submission to the Authority as soon as possible, but certainly no later than 22 July 1996. Submissions should address the central issue before the Authority, which is: whether the continued application of the anti-dumping measures is necessary to prevent the continuation or recurrence of material injury caused by dumping.

The Authority will report to the Minister by 7 October 1996.

Any person proposing to lodge a submission with the Authority should first obtain a copy of the information sheet prepared for this inquiry. 


