Notice Under paragraph 170VO(1)(c) - Filing Requirements for an AWA

I, ALAN ROWE, Employment Advocate, acting under paragraph 170VO(1)(c) of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, GIVE NOTICE that employers who file an Australian workplace agreement (AWA) with the Office of the Employment Advocate must provide the information described below to allow me to fulfil my functions.

For the convenience of employers, a standard form called the Employer Filing Application is available, together with an Employer Guide to AWAs, from the Office of the Employment Advocate. Completion of that form will satisfy the information requirements set out below.

Information requirements for filing an Australian workplace agreement

Employer Details

- 1. The legal or registered name of the employer.
- 2. The Australian Company Number or Australian Registered Business Number of the employer (if applicable).
- 3. The registered business address of the employer (if applicable).
- 4. The address, or addresses, of the worksite(s) at which the Australian workplace agreement (AWA) will operate.
- 5. The trading name, or trading names, of the employer (if applicable).
- 6. The postal address for future correspondence.
- 7. The name, position, telephone number and, if available the facsimile number of the employer's contact officer in relation to the AWA.
- 8. The sector that the employer's business operates in: the public sector (Commonwealth or State Government), the private sector (private industry) or in the non-profit sector (Churches, charitable organisations etc.).
- 9. An indication of the type of activity conducted by the employer's business (for example a brief outline of what the business makes or does).
- 10. The number of employees employed in the employer's business (approximately).
- 11. Details of the steps taken by the employer to explain the effect of the AWA to the employee(s), and when these steps were taken, include details of any written information provided to employees and any group or individual discussions that took place concerning the AWA.

- 12. Whether employees had the opportunity to ask questions about the effect of the AWA.
- 13. Whether an AWA in the same terms was offered to all employees doing the same kind of work as the employee(s) party to the AWA.
- 14. The reasons for not offering the AWA in the same terms to all employees doing the same kind of work (if applicable).
- 15. A signed, and dated, declaration by the employer:
 - that the information which accompanies the AWA is provided in good faith and is, to the best of the employer's knowledge, true and free from error; and
 - that the AWA between the employer and employee which is presented for filing complies with section 170VG of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996*; and
 - that all employees entering into an AWA were given a copy of the information statement prepared by the Employment Advocate; and
 - whether or not the employer has offered an AWA in the same terms to all employees of the employer who do the same kind of work as the employee(s) party to the AWA.

Employee details (details are required for each employee covered by the AWA or AWAs that are filed with the Employment Advocate)

- 1. The full name of the employee covered by the AWA (provided the employee is aware that this information will be given to the Employment Advocate).
- 2. Whether the employee is male or female (provided the employee is aware that this information will be given to the Employment Advocate).
- 3. The employee's date of birth (provided the employee is aware that this information will be given to the Employment Advocate).
- 4. The employee's home address (provided the employee is aware that this information will be given to the Employment Advocate).
- 5. The employee's contact telephone number (provided the employee is aware that this information will be given to the Employment Advocate).
- 6. Whether the employee is covered by a State or federal award (or awards).
- 7. The name of any designated award that has been nominated by the Employment Advocate for the purpose of assessing whether the AWA meets the 'no-disadvantage test'.
- 8. When the employee is covered by a State or federal award (or awards), the name of the award(s) covering the employee's work.

- 9. The employee's job title or award classification (if applicable).
- 10. The main tasks that the employee does in this job.
- 11. Whether the employee is covered by any enterprise bargaining agreement certified by the Australian Industrial Relations Commission (certified agreement).
- 12. The name and expiry date of any certified agreements that apply to the employee.
- 13. If the AWA changes any employment conditions contained in State laws that apply to the employee, the name of the State law(s).
- 14. A description of how the AWA differs from any awards that apply to the employee, or any designated award, or any relevant State laws that apply to the employee in the areas of pay, hours, leave or any other matter (such as new classifications, superannuation).
- 15. Whether the employee is undertaking an apprenticeship or traineeship under a formal apprenticeship or traineeship agreement, and, if the employee is undertaking an apprenticeship or traineeship under a formal apprenticeship or traineeship agreement, a copy of the training agreement.
- 16. Whether the employee is undertaking the apprenticeship or traineeship under modified award wage arrangements that are provided for in the Workplace Relations Act 1996.
- 17. If the employee is undertaking an apprenticeship or traineeship under modified award wage arrangements that are provided for in the Workplace Relations Act 1996, whether the wage rate in the AWA is calculated by applying a determination of an approving authority to a relevant or designated award.
- 18. If the wage rate contained in the AWA for an apprentice or trainee has been calculated by applying a determination of the approving authority to the relevant or designated award rates, the percentage of the award rate, as determined by the approving authority, that has been used.
- 19. If the wage rate contained in the AWA for an apprentice or trainee has not been calculated by applying a determination of the approving authority to the relevant or designated award rates, whether the AWA includes wage progression criteria determined by the approving authority which are different from the progression criteria in the relevant or designated award.
- 20. Whether the rate of pay for the employee is based on the Supported Wage System for people with disabilities and if the rate is based on the Supported Wage System, a copy of the wage assessment form.
- 21. The number of hours per week that the employee usually works (excluding overtime).
- 22. Whether the employee is employed on a casual basis.

- 23. Whether the employee is a new employee.
- 24. For a new employee, the date on which the employee did, or will, commence work.
- 25. For a new employee, whether the employee received the AWA at least 5 days before signing it.
- 26. For an existing employee, whether the employee received the AWA at least 14 days before signing it.
- 27. Whether the AWA replaces an existing AWA between the employer and employee.





LOGBOOKS FOR TRAWLING

I, Richard Andrew Stevens, delegate of the Australian Fisheries Management Authority, make the following determination under subregulations 32 (1) and (3) of the Fisheries Management Regulations.

Citation

1. This determination may be cited as Logbook Notice No. NPFL 03.

Commencement

2. This determination commences on 25 March 1997.

Interpretation

In this determination:

"banana season" means the period commencing at 2200 UTC on 31 March in a year and ending at 0230 UTC on 15 June in the same year;

"distinguishing mark" in relation to a form of logbook, means the marking by which the logbook can be distinguished from AFMA's other forms of logbook;

"NP09 Trawl Log" means the form of logbook to be published by AFMA in February 1996, which provides for 16 daily entries per page and for which:

- (a) the title is "Northern and Torres Strait Prawn Fisheries Confidential Daily Fishing Log";
 and
- (b) the distinguishing mark is "NP09";

"NP09A Trawl Log" means the form of logbook to be published by AFMA in February 1996, which provides for 7 daily entries per page and for which:

- (a) the title is "Northern and Torres Strait Prawn Fisheries Confidential Daily Fishing Log";
 and
- (b) the distinguishing mark is "NP09A";

"NP10 Trawl Log" means the form of logbook published by AFMA in February 1997 which provides for 16 daily entries per page and for which:

- (a) the title is "Northern and Torres Strait Prawn Fisheries Confidential Daily Fishing Log"; and
- (b) the distinguishing mark is "NP10";

- "NP10A Trawl Log" means the form of logbook published by AFMA in February 1997 which provides for 7 daily entries per page and for which:
- (a) the title is "Northern and Torres Strait Prawn Fisheries Confidential Daily Fishing Log": and
- (b) the distinguishing mark is "NP10A";
- "Northern Prawn Fishery area" has the same meaning as it has in the Northern Prawn Fishery Management Plan 1995;
- "NWS02 Trawl Log" means the form of logbook published by AFMA in February 1997, for which the title is "Australian North-West Slope Confidential Daily Fishing Log" and the distinguishing mark is "NWS02";
- "SLR01 Return" means the form of logbook published by AFMA in February 1997, for which the title is "Seasonal Recording of Landings - Banana Season" and the distinguishing mark is "SLR01";
- "SLR02 Return" means the form of logbook published by AFMA in February 1997, for which the title is "Seasonal Recording of Landings - Tiger Season" and the distinguishing mark is "SLR02":
- "tiger season" means the period commencing at 0800 UTC on 1 August in a year and ending at 2230 UTC on 30 November in the same year; and
- "UTC" means Coordinated Universal Time, the time scale based on the second (SI), maintained by the International Bureau of Weights and Measures. For the purposes of this direction UTC is equivalent to mean solar time at the prime meridian (0 degrees longitude), formerly expressed in Greenwich Mean Time (GMT).
- [Note: Terms defined in the Fisheries Management Act 1991 and the Fisheries Management Regulations have the same meanings in this determination.]

Which logbooks must be used?

- 4.1 If any kind of fish, including prawns, bugs, scallops and squid but excluding scampi, are taken by any method of trawling using an Australian boat in the Northern Prawn Fishery area the following forms of logbook must be used to record information about the taking of the fish:
- from 25 March 1997 in respect of the banana season, the SLR01 Return and in respect of the tiger season, the SLR02 Return;
- from 25 March 1997 until the end of 31 December 1997 any of the NP09 Trawl Log, the NP09A Trawl Log, the NP10 Trawl Log or the NP10A Trawl Log; and
- from 1 January 1998 either of the NP10 Trawl Log or the NP10A Trawl Log. (c)
- [Note: The NP10 Trawl Log replaces the NP09 Trawl Log. The NP10A Trawl Log replaces the NP09A Trawl Log. The period from 25 March 1997 until the end of 31 December 1997 is the changeover period when either form of each logbook can be used.]
- 4.2 If scampi is taken by any method of trawling using an Australian boat in the Northern Prawn Fishery area, the NWS02 Trawl Log must be used to record information about the taking of the scampi.
- 4.3 If any kind of fish is taken by a boat using any method of trawling in the North West Slope Trawl Fishery, the NWS02 Trawl Log must be used to record information about the taking of the fish.

When must the logbooks be used?

- 5. Subregulations 33(1), 33(2) and 33(3) of the Fisheries Management Regulations apply in respect of:
- (a) the NP09 Trawl Log and the NP09A Trawl Log during the period beginning on 25 March 1997 and ending at the end of 31 December 1997; and
- (b) the NP10 Trawl Log, the NP10A Trawl Log, the SLR01 Return, the SLR02 Return and the NWS02 Trawl Log during the period beginning on 25 March 1997 and ending at the end of 1 February 2000.

- 6. Copies of the NP10 Trawl Log, the NP10A Trawl Log and the NWS02 Trawl Log can be obtained from the Australian Fisheries Management Authority at either:
