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## OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

**Public Service** issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service and the Services of the Australian Postal Corporation and Defence Force appointments etc. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 am on Thursday, and sold at \$8.95 each or on subscription of \$395.00 (50 issues), \$206.00 (25 issues) or \$103.00 (12 issues).

**Business** issues, published each Tuesday, containing Notices under the Corporations Law, Bankruptcy Act and Private Notices and sold at \$4.95 each or on subscription of \$220.00 (50 issues), \$116.00 (25 issues).

**Australian Securities Commission** issues contain Notices under the Corporations Law and are published on the first Tuesday of each month and are sold at \$14.95 each or on subscription of \$132.00 (12 issues).

**Special** issues include notices which require urgent publication. All costs associated with producing Specials will be borne by the responsible department or authority. A limited number of Special Gazettes will be made available for sale from the Commonwealth Government Bookshop, Canberra, on the day of publication. General distribution of these notices will be by their inclusion in the next published issue of the Government Notices *Gazette* or Business *Gazette* as well as in the next published issue of the series of the Gazette in which the notice would normally have been published.

**Tariff concessions** issues contain notices of tariff concessions proposed, granted or revoked in accordance with the provisions of Part XVA of the *Customs Act 1901*. ### **PUBLIC NOTICE PURSUANT TO REGULATION 13AD OF THE GREAT BARRIER REEF MARINE PARK REGULATIONS**

I, Richard Donald Braley have applied to the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority for permission to conduct research on cultured giant clams and on corals at Picnic Bay, Magnetic Island, Central Section of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park [zoned General Use A].

PROPOSAL TO conduct long-term (5+ yr) research on cultured giant clams using animal husbandry practices to breed f1 clams and follow survival and growth of their f2 offspring. Structures placed on the sand-silt bottom to hold clams will cover 341 m<sup>2</sup>.

Coral studies will include growth by fragmentation, and the effect on coral growth and survival by cropping macroalgae.

The 1 ha site which was applied for is at the Hawkings Point end of Picnic bay, within the GBRMP. The public will not be restricted from the area but would be restricted from handling clams, corals, or structures. Small floats will denote the location of underwater structures.

DECLARATION OF CONTROLLED SPECIMENS

I, ROBERT MURRAY HILL, Minister for the Environment, having considered comments as required by subsection 9B(3) of the *Wildlife Protection (Regulation of Exports and Imports) Act 1982* (the Act) and having taken into account advice from the Designated Authority on those matters specified in Regulation 5A(1) for the purposes of subsection 10A(5) of the Act, hereby declare *Dicksonia antarctica* (soft tree fern), *Polystichum proliferum* (mothershield fern) and *Blechnum nudum* (fishbone fern) harvested from Crown land in the Erica District of Victoria for export, by Fernworld of Springvale South, Victoria, to be 'controlled specimens' for the purposes of subsection 10A(2) of the Act, subject to the following conditions:

1. Harvesting is limited to Lot 9702 (1.5 km section of South Face Road and associated minor roadworks) Erica District, Central Gippsland.
2. Harvesting is to be conducted in accordance with harvest proposals submitted by Fernworld in February 1997 and as set out in permits 1/70/97/010 and 1/70/97/013 issued by the Victorian Department of Natural Resources and Environment.
3. All *Dicksonia antarctica* stems/plants over 15 cm are to be tagged and the tag numbers of those proposed for export are to be specified in the applications for permits to export.
4. For *Dicksonia antarctica*, the Victorian Department of Natural Resources and Environment is to provide the Designated Authority with tag numbers issued, the number of stem/plants under 15cm harvested and the quantity of 'dead' stems harvested for use as manufactured by-products such as pots and slabs.
5. A report on the total numbers harvested under this permit, by species and for *Dicksonia antarctica* by category (over 15cm, under 15cm and 'dead' stems) detailing both domestic and export quantities, is to be provided to the Designated Authority.
6. This declaration is valid from 7 February 1997 until 31 December 1997, or until approval of a Statewide management plan for the relevant species. This declaration replaces declaration number 9604763 published on page 975 of the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette*, No GN 16, 23 April 1997.

I, Bill Walsh, delegate of the Chief Executive Officer of Customs, have accepted an application which requests publication of a dumping duty and countervailing duty notice in respect of certain tubeless steel demountable rims exported from South Africa, and a dumping duty notice in respect of exports of the goods from Canada.

The application was lodged by the Arrowcrest Group Pty Ltd, trading as ROH Steel Wheel Co and ROH Wheels Australia.

The goods covered by this notice include 8.25" x 22.5" and 9.00" x 22.5" diameter tubeless steel demountable truck rims. The rims are described as an assembly of a steel rim and a steel adaptor bar. The adaptor bar is a formed band welded to the rim, to which the cast wheel or 'spider' on the vehicle's axle attaches. The rim has no centre and is held in place by clamps on the outer edge of the adaptor bar. The tariff classification of the goods is 8708.70.99, statistical code 71.

Customs will commence its investigation on 14 July 1997 and make a preliminary finding within 85 days (i.e. by 7 October 1997).

A positive preliminary finding that there are sufficient grounds for the publication of a dumping or countervailing duty notices may result in the imposition of securities under s. 42 of the Customs Act. Securities are taken in respect of any interim duty that may be payable on the goods, imported during the period leading to the Minister's final decision.

A positive preliminary finding must be referred to the Anti-Dumping Authority for inquiry and report to the Minister, within 110 days, as to whether dumping or countervailing duties should be imposed.

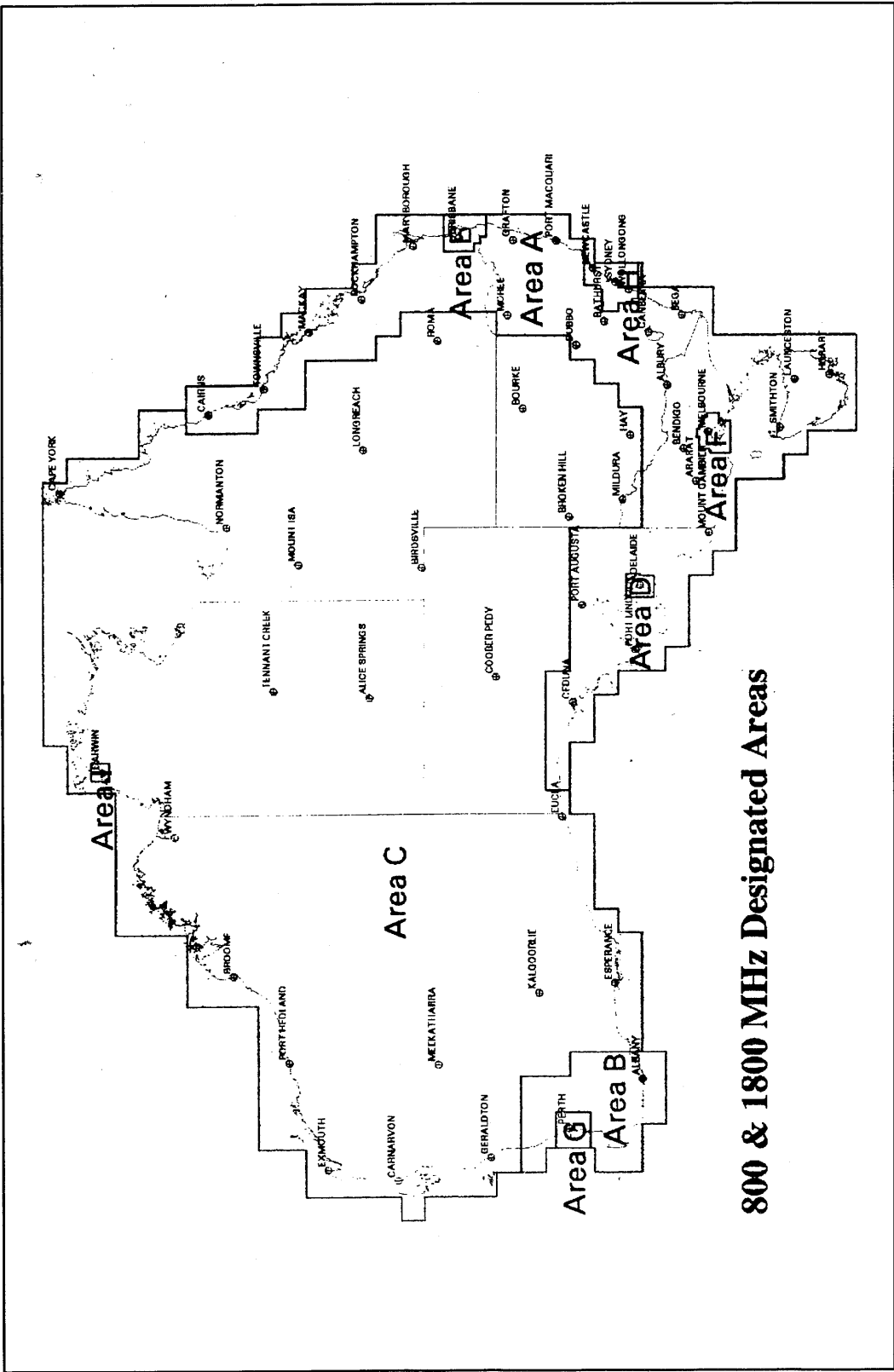

**Interpretation**

2. (1) In this direction, unless the contrary intention appears:

*Act* means the *Radiocommunications Act 1992*;

*associate*, in relation to a person, means:

- (a) for a body corporate:
  - (i) a director or secretary of the body; or
  - (ii) a related body corporate within the meaning of the Corporations Law; or
  - (iii) a director or secretary of the related body corporate; or
- (b) for an individual:
  - (i) the individual's spouse; or
  - (ii) another person who, although not legally married to the individual, lives with the individual on a *bona fide* domestic basis as the spouse of the person; or
  - (iii) a business partner of the individual; or
  - (iv) an employee or employer of the individual; or

- (v) a company in which the individual, whether alone or with a person referred to in subparagraph (i), (ii), (iii) or (iv), controls at least 15% of the voting power or holds at least 15% of the issued shares; or

  - (i) any other person (other than the ACA) with whom the first-mentioned person has, or proposes to enter into, a relevant agreement in connection with the use of spectrum as a result of the allocation of spectrum licences that relate to parts of the spectrum referred to in a re-allocation declaration; or
  - (ii) any other person (other than the ACA) with whom the first-mentioned person has, or proposes to enter into, a relevant agreement in connection with acquiring spectrum licences that relate to parts of the spectrum referred to in a re-allocation declaration;

**group of persons** means a person and all of the associates of that person;

**major capital city** means a designated area described in the Schedule to the Spectrum Re-allocation Declaration No. 2 of 1997, to the extent that the area is within the territorial limits of Australia;

**re-allocation declaration** means Spectrum Re-allocation Declaration No. 1, 2, 3 or 4 of 1997 made under subsection 153B (1) of the *Radiocommunications Act 1992*;

**relevant agreement** means an agreement, arrangement or understanding:

- (a) whether formal or informal or partly formal and partly informal; and
- (b) whether written or oral or partly written and partly oral; and
- (c) whether or not having legal or equitable force and whether or not based on legal or equitable rights;

**Telstra** has the same meaning as in the *Telstra Corporation Act 1991*.

(2) In this direction, each frequency band includes all frequencies that are greater than the lower frequency, up to and including the higher frequency.

**800 MHz Band—general**

3. The ACA must determine procedures under subsection 60 (1) of the Act that impose limits that ensure that, as a result of the allocation of spectrum licences under Subdivision B of Division 1 of Part 3.2 of the Act, no person or group of persons may use more than:

- (a) 10 MHz of spectrum anywhere in Australia in the frequency band 825 MHz to 845 MHz; and
- (b) 10 MHz of spectrum anywhere in Australia in the frequency band 870 MHz to 890 MHz.

**800 MHz Band—Telstra**

4. The ACA must determine procedures under subsection 60 (1) of the Act that impose limits that ensure that, as a result of the allocation of spectrum licences under Subdivision B of Division 1 of Part 3.2 of the Act, neither Telstra nor the group of persons consisting of Telstra and all of the associates of Telstra may use more than:

- (a) 5 MHz of spectrum anywhere in Australia (other than a major capital city) in the frequency bands mentioned in paragraphs 3 (1) (a) and (b) of the Spectrum Re-allocation Declaration No. 1 of 1997; and
- (b) 5 MHz of spectrum anywhere in Australia (other than a major capital city) in the frequency bands mentioned in paragraphs 3 (1) (c) and (d) of that re-allocation declaration.

**1.8 GHz Band**

5. The ACA must determine procedures under subsection 60 (1) of the Act that impose limits that ensure that, as a result of the allocation of spectrum licences under Subdivision B of Division 1 of Part 3.2 of the Act, no person or group of persons may use more than:

- (a) 15 MHz of spectrum in any major capital city in the frequency band 1710 MHz to 1755 MHz; and
  - (b) 15 MHz of spectrum in any major capital city in the frequency band 1805 MHz to 1850 MHz.

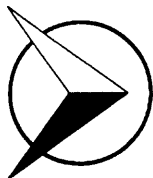




