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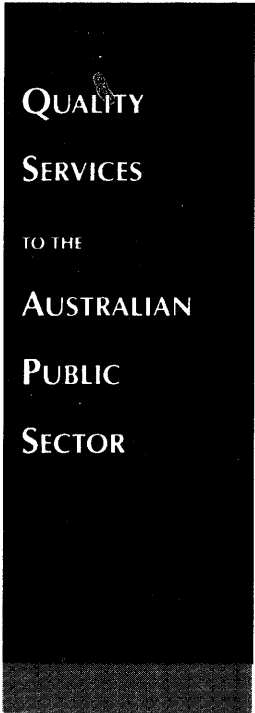

OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

CARGO-IMP Messages

The specific messages used in these specifications by the Cargo Terminal Operator are the "Customs Inventory Report" (CIR), "Customs Supplementary Information" (CSI), "Customs Status Notification" (CSN) and the Cargo-IMP error message, FNA. Details of these messages except for the FNA are contained in this appendix.

Flight information not sent in the CIR, or changes made after transmission of the CIR must be reported by a CSI. Optional fields should be provided when known.

Where the total "number of pieces" for the waybill (CIR 3.5.1) is the number of pieces on the flight, that information need not be repeated in the "number of pieces manifested" (CIR 10.3).

However, the "number of pieces manifested" must be sent to report intentional part-shipments. Unintentional part-shipments will be reported as a short shipment from the first flight, by sending a CSI message which includes the "number of pieces landed" (CSI 11.5). Any subsequent part(s) arriving on different flight(s) must be reported by further CSI messages.

The "nature of goods detail" (CIR 4.5) needs to be clarified. The twenty character text field has one mandatory occurrence, for a goods description. However, there is provision for the 'nature of goods detail' to be repeated an unspecified number of times. The goods description may also include some supplementary information, such as special delivery instructions. In addition, note CIR22 states that the field may optionally be used to contain other information, e.g. harmonised commodity code, country of origin of goods, ULD number and dimensions. Participants in the Cargo Automation system should indicate to the ACS which of these optional items they can provide.

Another item which is of interest to the ACS, but which is not specifically included in the CIR message, is the expected routing of the goods. The ACS would like this information provided in the "nature of goods detail" (CIR 4.5). This will require an agreed value, "R", in the "goods data identifier" (CIR 4.5.1). CIR item 4.5.3 would then contain a three character port code and two character carrier

code, repeated for each leg of the expected routing e.g. "LHRAF SINBA SYDQF". This will serve as a temporary arrangement until the CIR message can be changed and formally approved by IATA.

All fields designated as mandatory in the messages must be transmitted to the ACS. This is so the message is intelligible to the recipient. Conditional fields may be omitted without affecting the sense of the message. In most cases mandatory fields are also designed to coincide with normal Customs requirements. Thus the content of the message enables the ACS to make an assessment on the consignment information provided.

Where information is not known for a:

- . conditional segment, omit the segment;
- . mandatory segment, provide the minimum number of characters required for the segment;
- . mandatory data item, specify the item as "blank" and provide the data separator to indicate the end of the item;
- . conditional data item, if there are no further items in the segment do not put any data, otherwise provide only the separator to indicate the end of the element.

Therefore, by specifying the mandatory field as "blank" the syntax requirements will be met but the ACS assessment will have to determine whether the Customs requirements have been met.

Notification of Preliminary Finding

CUSTOMS ACT 1901 - PART XV B

**PRELIMINARY FINDING INTO THE ALLEGED DUMPING OF
POLYVINYL CHLORIDE HOMOPOLYMER RESIN FROM GERMANY,
HUNGARY, INDIA, ISRAEL AND THE NETHERLANDS**

The Australian Customs Service has completed its investigation into the alleged dumping of polyvinyl chloride homopolymer resin (PVC) exported from Germany, Hungary, India, Israel and the Netherlands. The investigation commenced on 10 July 1997, following an application by ICI Australia Operations Pty Ltd (ICI) and Auseon Limited (Auseon), the Australian industry producing like goods.

Based on the information before it, Customs concluded that the Australian industry consists of ICI and Auseon, now known as Australian Vinyls Corporation.

Customs found that:

- PVC has been exported to Australia from Germany, Hungary, India, Israel and the Netherlands at dumped prices;
- the Australian industry has suffered material injury as a result of exports of PVC from Germany, Hungary, India, Israel and the Netherlands at dumped prices; and
- there is a likely threat of material injury to the Australian industry from exports of the goods at dumped prices from Germany, Hungary, India, Israel and the Netherlands.

Customs has therefore found that there are sufficient grounds for the publication of a dumping duty notice in respect of PVC exported from Germany, Hungary, India, Israel and the Netherlands.

Preliminary Finding Report No 97/004 sets out the reasons for the finding including all material findings of fact or law on which the finding is based.

Securities under section 42 of the *Customs Act 1901* will be required and taken in respect of any interim dumping duty that may become payable on the goods from Germany, Hungary, Israel and the Netherlands that are imported on or after 17 October 1997.

Customs will now refer the matter to the Anti-Dumping Authority which must hold an inquiry and report to the Minister as to whether a dumping duty notice should be published.
