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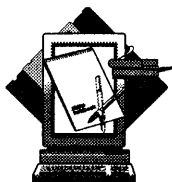

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OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

DECLARATION OF DEFENCE PRACTICE AREA

Purpose

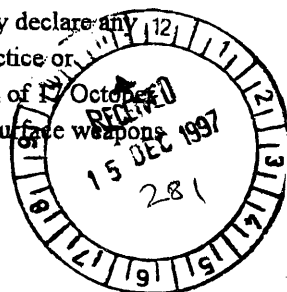
1. To declare a new Defence Practice Area (DPA) in Halifax Bay Air Weapons range in Queensland so that the type of defence practice permitted at the range can be amended.

Background

2. The DPA at Halifax Bay previously declared on 17 October 1994 authorises air to surface firing. The Maritime Wing of the Army Logistic Training Centre is moving to Townsville in early 1998 and wishes to use the DPA to train personnel in the terminal and seamanship trades. Part of this training involves surface to surface firing, an activity not authorised under the DPA. The range is suitable for both the needs of the RAAF and the Army. In order for the Army to carry out surface to surface firing in the DPA, however, the Declaration needs to be amended.


Cancellation and Redeclaration of DPA

3. Under section 49(1) of the Defence Force Regulations you may declare any area of land, sea or air as a DPA for the carrying out of a defence practice or operation. The attached Declaration cancels the previous Declaration of 17 October 1994 and redeclares it to allow for both air to surface and surface to surface weapons firing.



Recommendation

4. The recommendation is that you sign the attached Declaration.



Wildlife Protection (Regulation of Exports and Imports) Act 1982

DECLARATION OF CONTROLLED SPECIMENS

I, ROBERT MURRAY HILL, Minister for the Environment, having considered comments as required by subsection 9B(3) of the *Wildlife Protection (Regulation of Exports and Imports) Act 1982* (the Act) and having taken into account advice from the Designated Authority on those matters specified in Regulation 5A(1) for the purposes of subsection 10A(5) of the Act, hereby declare *Dicksonia antarctica* (soft tree fern), *Polystichum proliferum* (motherhood fern) and *Blechnum nudum* (fishbone fern) harvested from Crown land in the Erica District of Victoria for export, by Fernworld of Springvale South, Victoria, to be 'controlled specimens' for the purposes of subsection 10A(2) of the Act, subject to the following conditions:

1. Harvesting is limited to road alignment areas on the South Face Road and minor roads within the Erica District, Central Gippsland.
2. Harvesting is to be conducted in accordance with harvest proposals submitted by Fernworld in December 1997 and as set out in permits issued by the Victorian Department of Natural Resources and Environment.
3. All *Dicksonia antarctica* trunks/plants over 15 cm in height are to be tagged and the tag numbers of those proposed for export are to be specified in the applications for permits to export.
4. For *Dicksonia antarctica*, the Victorian Department of Natural Resources and Environment is to provide the Designated Authority with tag numbers issued, the number of trunks/plants under 15cm high harvested and the quantity of 'dead' stems harvested for use as manufactured by-products such as pots and slabs.
5. A report on the total numbers harvested under this permit, by species and for *Dicksonia antarctica* by category (over 15cm, under 15cm and 'dead' stems) detailing both domestic and export quantities, is to be provided to the Designated Authority.
6. This declaration is valid from until 31 December 1998, or until approval of a Statewide management plan for the relevant species.

DECLARATION OF CONTROLLED SPECIMENS

I, ROBERT MURRAY HILL, Minister for the Environment, having considered comments as required by subsection 9B(3) of the *Wildlife Protection (Regulation of Exports and Imports) Act 1982* (the Act) and having taken into account advice from the Designated Authority on those matters specified in Regulation 5A(1) for the purposes of subsection 10A(5) of the Act, hereby declare beach washed specimens of seagrass, *Posidonia australis*, to be 'controlled specimens' for the purposes of subsection 10A(2) of the Act, subject to the following conditions:

1. This declaration is limited to specimens harvested by Innovation Engineering Pty Ltd from the area designated by the Lacedupe Council between the high and low water tide marks in the Lacedupe Bay area of Kingston, South Australia (from the caravan park to the Kingston Jetty).
2. Harvesting operations are to be carried out as detailed in the document entitled 'Proposal for Harvest and Export of Native Wildlife under the Wildlife Protection (Regulation of Exports and Imports) Act 1982 - beach washed seagrass at Lacedupe Bay by Innovation Engineering Pty Ltd.'
3. The operation is to be carried out in accordance with appropriate permits or licences required under the South Australian *Fisheries Act 1982* and any other relevant legislation;
4. Innovation Engineering Pty Ltd submits annual reports to the Designated Authority by 31 December 1998 and 30 September 1999. These reports are to incorporate harvest data by month (including export and domestic market sales) and the outcomes of any research and monitoring undertaken; and
5. This declaration is valid until approval of a State-wide marine plant management regime, or 30 September 1999, whichever is the earlier.

DETERMINATION

The CSS Board, pursuant to section 154A of the Superannuation Act 1976, and for the purposes of Division 2A of Part V, Part VIAA and section 156A of that Act, DETERMINES as follows:

Citation

1. This determination may be cited as the "Superannuation Act 1976 (Interest) Determination No. 32".

Commencement

1. This determination shall take effect from and including 9 February 1998.

Principal Determination

2. In this determination "the Principal Determination" means the determination, as amended, in force by virtue of paragraph 154A(4)(b) of the Superannuation Act 1976.

Amendments to the Principal Determination

3. Clause 6 of the Principal Determination is amended by deleting from subclauses (1) and (2) "5.1%" (wherever occurring) and inserting in its stead "5.7%".

Application

4. (1) The provisions of the Principal Determination, as amended by this determination, apply in relation to interest payable or notional interest calculable (as the case may be) in respect of an amount that is a prescribed amount in relation to a person:
 - (a) if deferred benefits become payable in respect of the person - after the date of the commencement of this determination; or
 - (b) if:
 - (i) deferred benefits cease to be applicable in respect of the person; or
 - (ii) in the case of a person to whom deferred benefits are not applicable - the person ceases to be an eligible employee;

on or after that date.

- (2) An expression used in subclause 5(1) that is defined in the Principal Determination has the same meaning for the purposes of that subclause as it has in that determination.

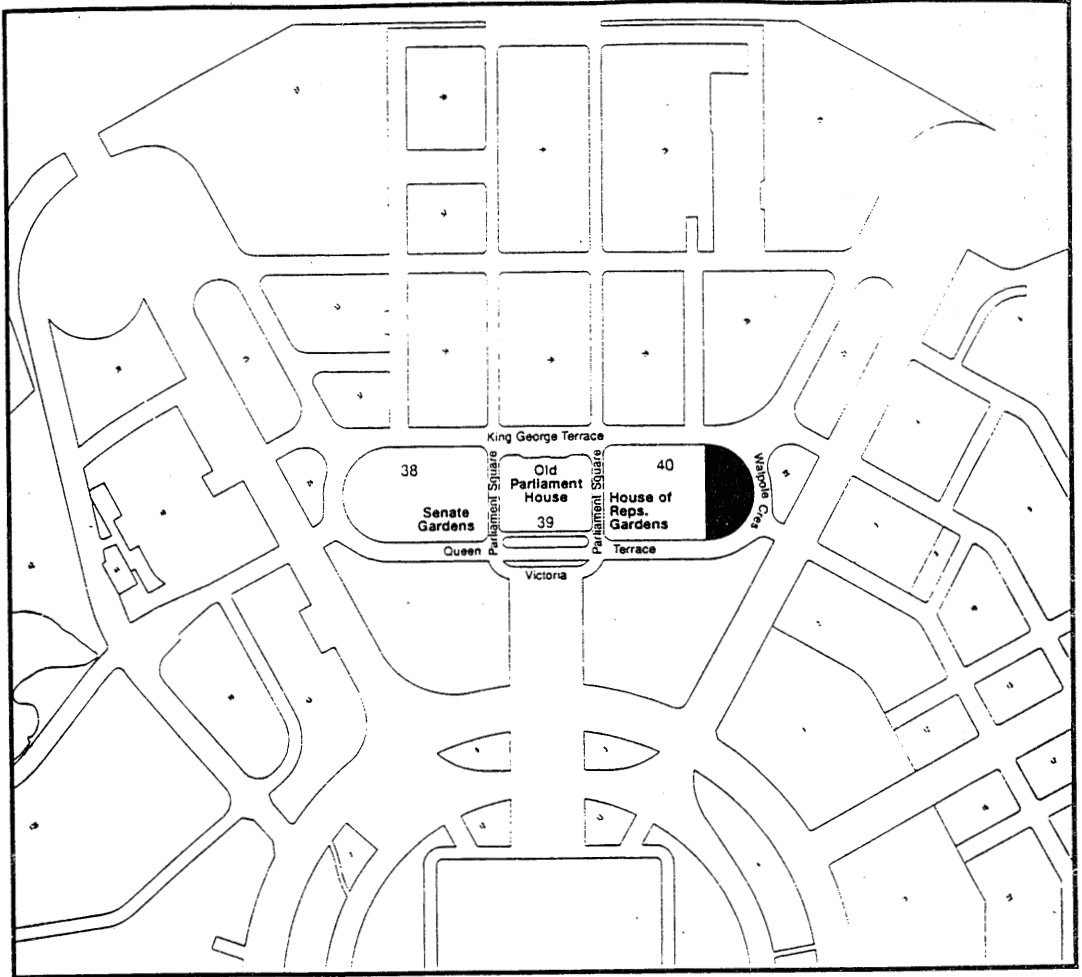
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CONSTITUTION PLACE



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TOBACCO ADVERTISING PROHIBITION ACT 1992

SPECIFICATION UNDER SUBSECTION 18(2) AND (3)

I, Michael Wooldridge, Minister for Health and Family Services, under subsection 18(2) of the *Tobacco Advertising Prohibition Act 1992* (the Act), having regard to the guidelines in force under subsection 18(5) of the Act and being satisfied that the event mentioned below is of international significance and that failure to specify the event would be likely to result in the event not being held in Australia:

- (a) specify the Australian Ladies Masters 1998 to be held at the Gold Coast, Queensland from 26 February 1998 to 1 March 1998; and
- (b) specify the following conditions as conditions to be complied with in relation to the publication of tobacco advertisement in connection with the event;

- (i) the advertisements that may be published is limited to:

- A. Tee signage X 54. Nine holes to be dressed with Alpine signs each being 2.4m X 1.2m;

One main leader board - three Alpine panels each 2.7m X 1.2 metres

One main results board - two Alpine panels each 2.4m X 600mm

Four course leader boards - 2.4m X 1.2m Alpine Panel on each board;

Three grandstand signs - each 7.2m X 1.2m

Twelve carry board headers each 50mm X 10 mm

Thirty six tee markers each 40mm X 20mm

Three merchandising outlets each with Alpine banners 4.8m X 1.2m

One media centre - one Alpine panel 1.22m X 0.61m on media backdrop, with LPGA, Royal Pines Resort and ALPG

Three Alpine Fairway/Green signs each 4.8m X 2.4m

Eighteen green exit and entrance Alpine panel motives 30cm X 12cm



- B. Twenty Alpine beach umbrellas in public catering areas

Fifty Alpine hand held umbrellas

Forty Alpine golf flags

Eighteen Alpine pin flags

(ii) the content of the advertisements that may be published is limited to;


- A. all signs referred to in paragraph (b)(i) A. and (b)(i)B above must be accompanied by one of the two health warnings "SMOKING KILLS" or "SMOKING IS ADDICTIVE". Each health warning must comply with the format set out in regulation 9 of the Trade Practices (Consumer Product Information Standards)(Tobacco) Regulations, and must occupy at least 25% of the total area of each sign; and

(iii) the way the advertisements may be published is limited to the way described in paragraph (b)(i), provided that;

- A. the advertisements are confined to the venue of the event, namely the Royal Pines Resort, Queensland; and
- B. the advertisements are not conspicuous from any places beyond the boundaries of the Royal Pines Resort, Queensland.

The specification comes into force on 17 February 1998 and stops being in force on 3 March 1998.
