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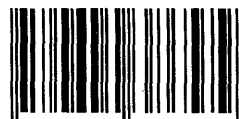

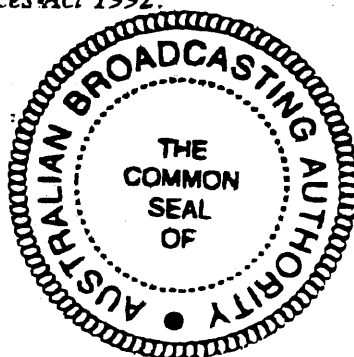

DEFENCE (AREAS CONTROL) REGULATIONS - RAAF BASE DARWIN COMPENSATION CLAIMS

Amendments to the Defence (Areas Control) Regulations, made under the Defence Act, to enable the continued safety of aircraft operations at RAAF Base Darwin in the Northern Territory, were gazetted on 9 April 1998. The Regulations, Statutory Rules 1998 No. 60, provide a clear legal framework for the exercise of necessary safety-related controls. The Regulations limit the height of buildings and other objects in the vicinity of Defence airfields.

The plans set out in this notice identify land affected by height restrictions imposed by regulations 5, 6 and 7 of the Regulations. Regulation 5 prevents the construction of buildings higher than 15 metres without approval. Regulation 6 prevents the construction of buildings higher than 45 metres without approval. Regulation 7 prevents the construction of buildings higher than 90 metres without approval.

Any landholder affected by regulations 3 or 4 of the Regulations, which prevent construction either absolutely or above 7.5m without approval, will be given specific notice in writing.

Where the value of the land has been diminished by the effect of the Regulations compensation will be paid. Should you have had an interest in land at the time the land became affected by the Regulations and consider that you are entitled to compensation, an application for compensation must be lodged within six (6) months of this notification. 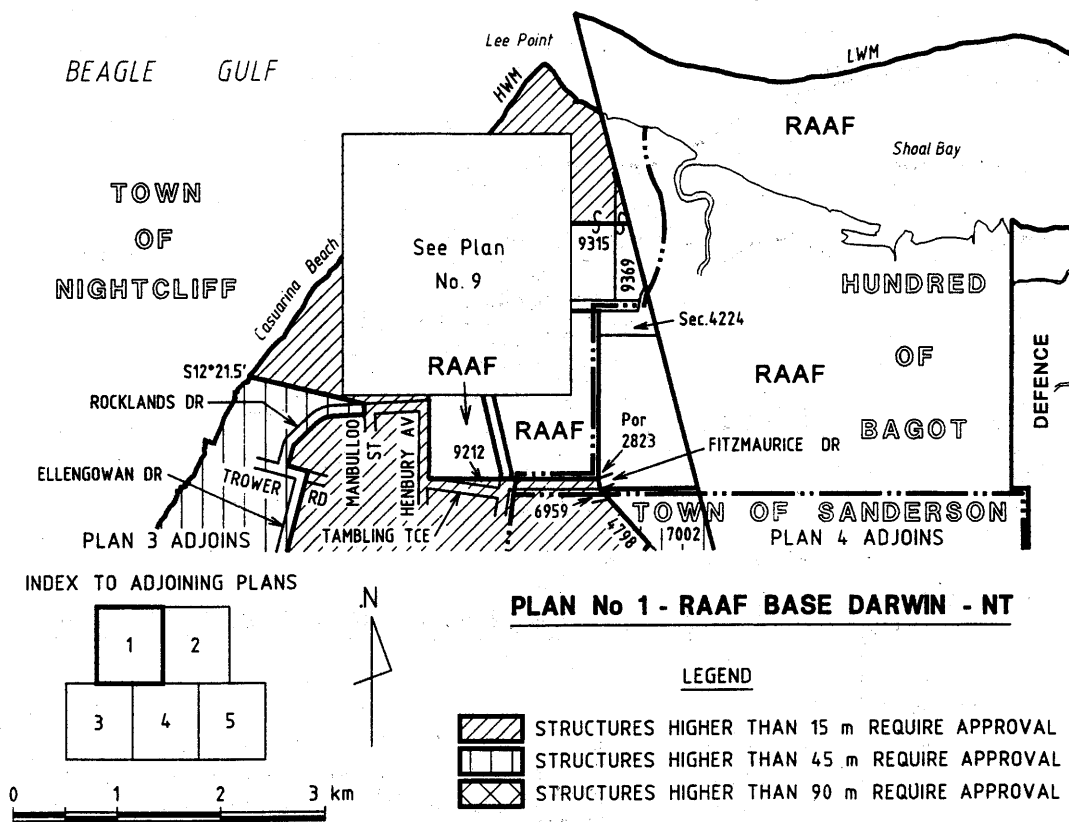

Applications must be in accordance with subregulation 17(5) of the Regulations.

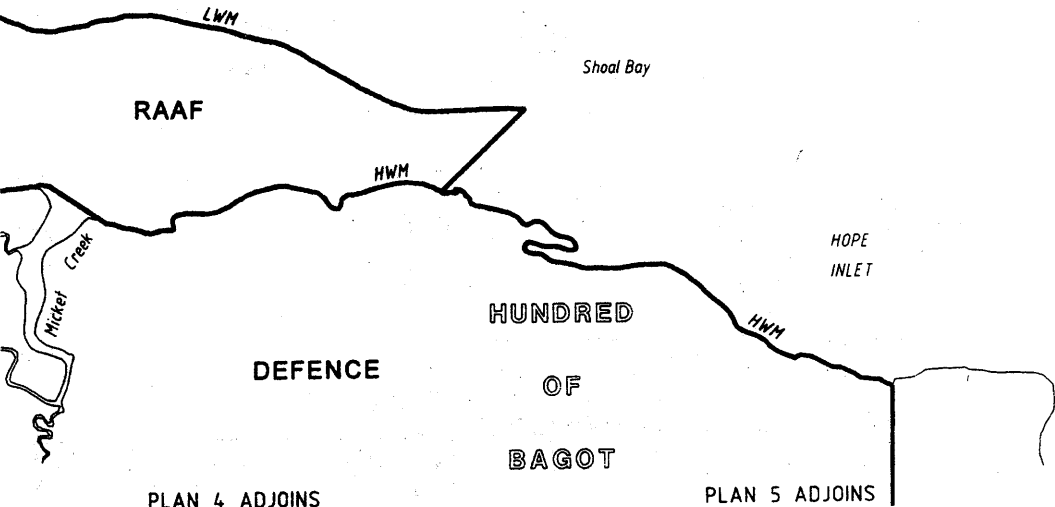
Subregulation 17(5) provides that an application for compensation for the diminution in the value of the land must set out:

- (a) the name and address of the applicant; and**
- (b) the interest that the applicant claims to have had in that land on the relevant day (ie. 9 April 1998, the day on which the land became affected by the Regulations); and**
- (c) the facts on which the applicant relies to establish that the applicant had that interest on the relevant day; and**
- (d) the amount claimed by the applicant to be the total amount of compensation payable by the Commonwealth for the diminution in the value of the land; and**
- (e) the names and addresses of any other persons known to the applicant who had, on that day, an interest in that land and, if known to the applicant, the nature of each of those interests; and**
- (f) if the applicant does not claim the amount referred to in paragraph (d)-the amount of compensation claimed in respect of the applicant's interest in the land.**

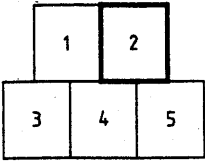

PLAN 1 ADJOINS






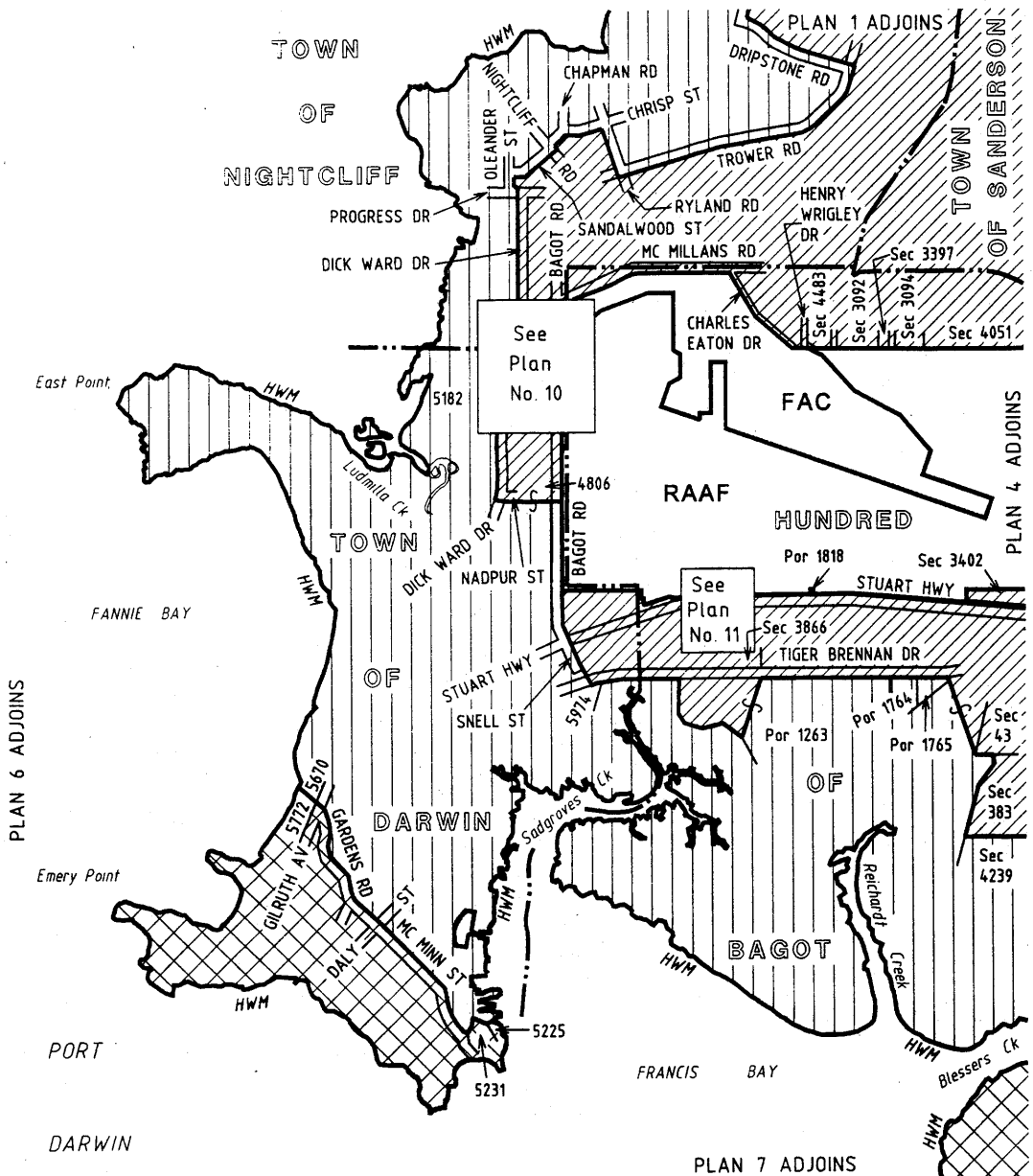
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PLAN No 2 - RAAF BASE DARWIN - NT

PLAN 3 ADJOINS



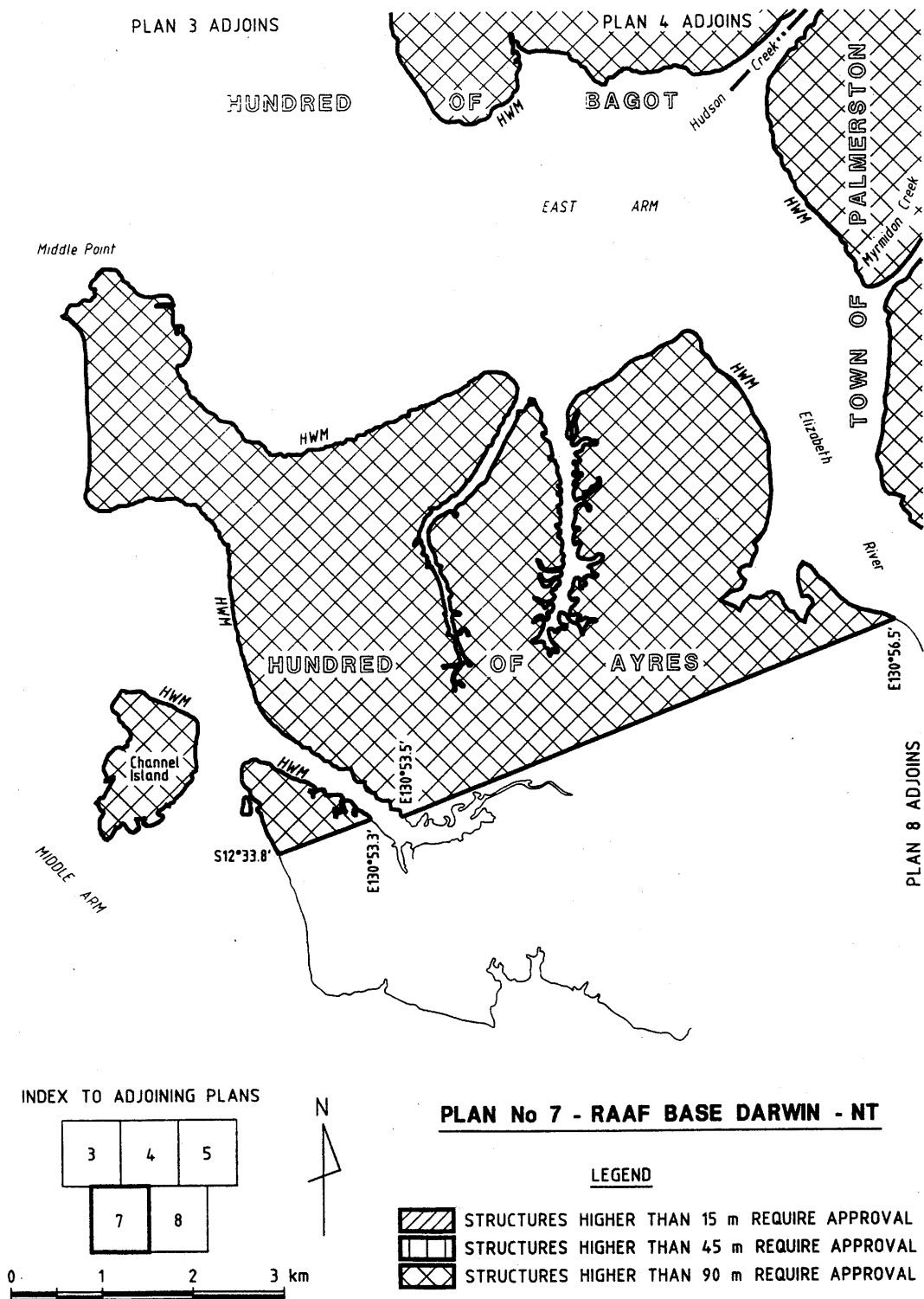
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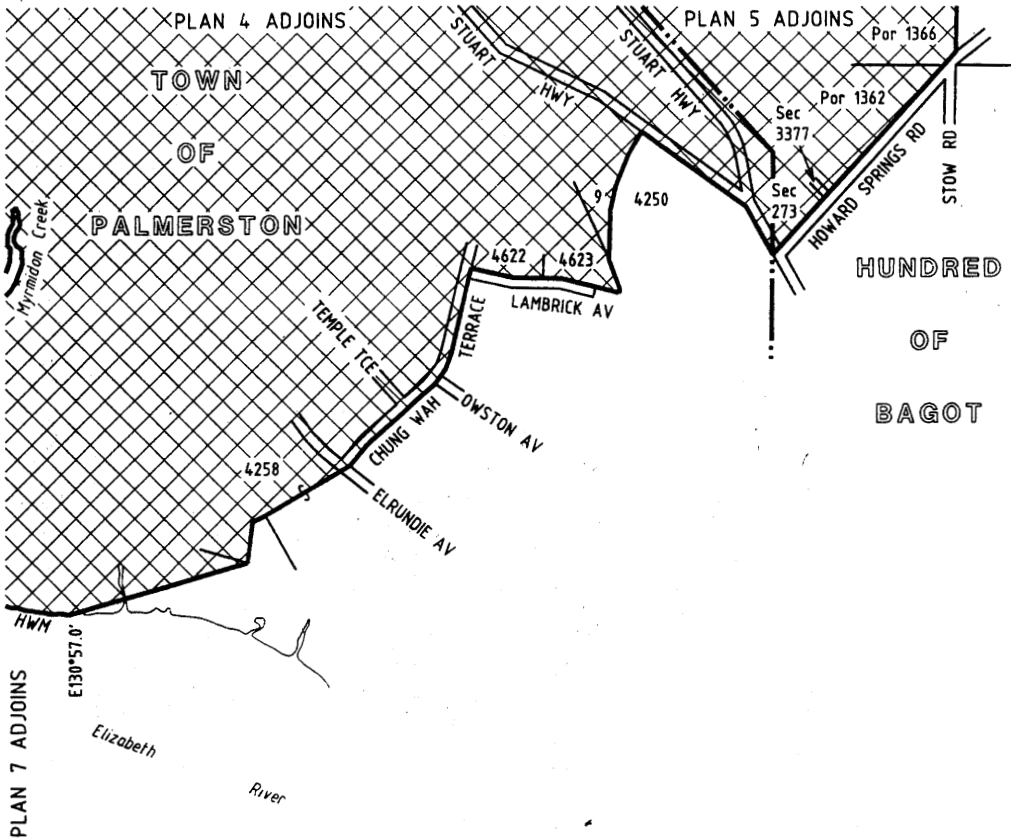


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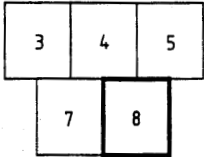
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



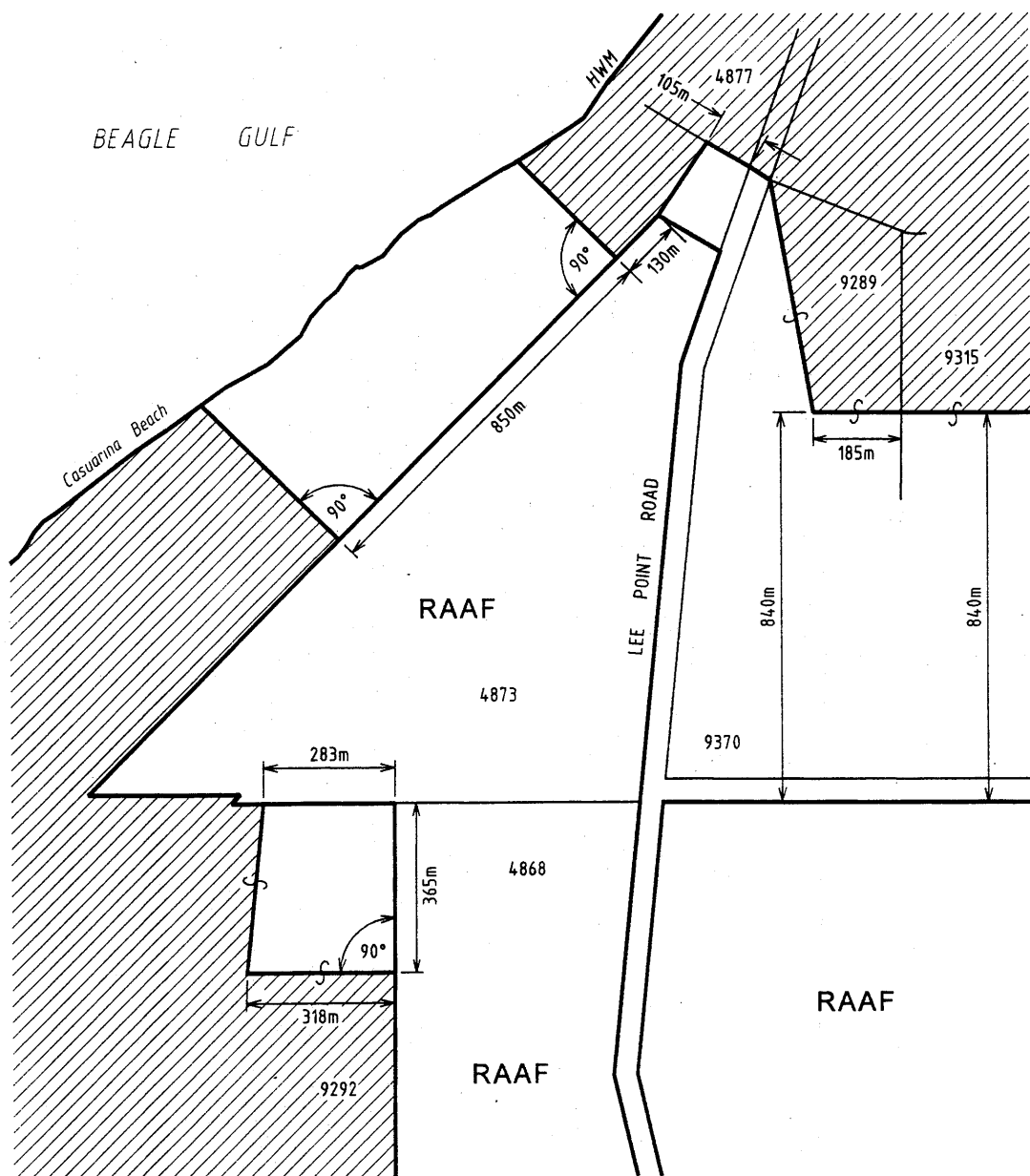
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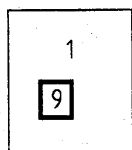

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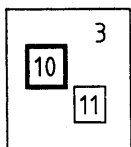


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PLAN No 9 - RAAF BASE DARWIN - NT

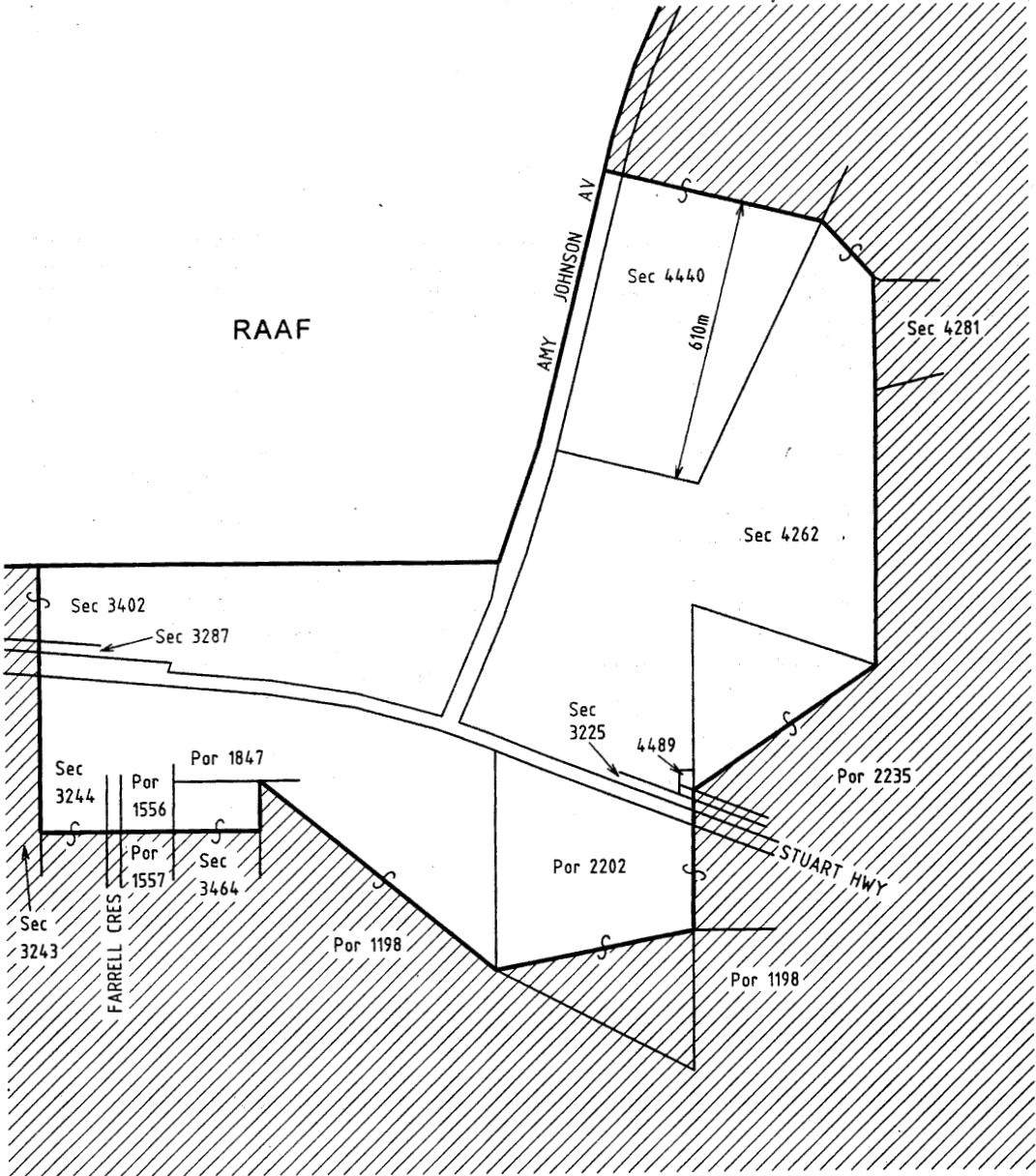
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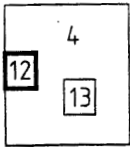
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PLAN No 11 - RAAF BASE DARWIN - NTLEGEND

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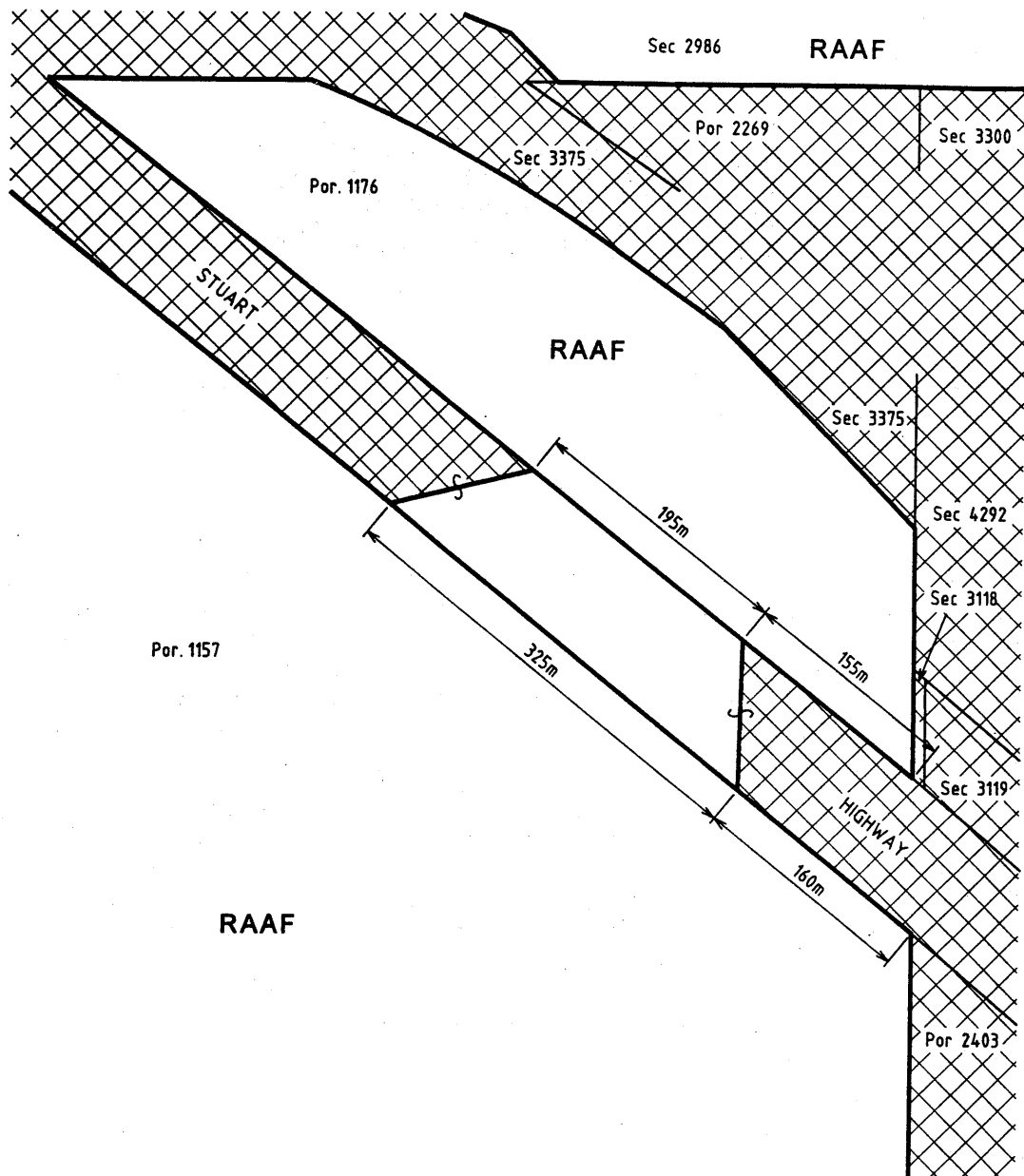


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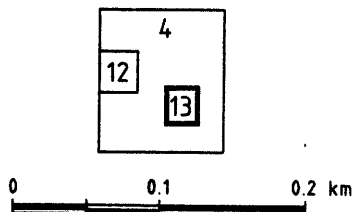
PLAN No 12 - RAAF BASE DARWIN - NT

NOTICE OF APPLICATION RECEIVED UNDER THE HAZARDOUS WASTE (REGULATION OF EXPORTS AND IMPORTS) ACT 1989

Pursuant to Section 33 of the *Hazardous Waste (Regulation of Exports and Imports) Act 1989*, notice is given that an application was received from Lewer Corporation Pty Limited, 64 Manour Street, Woollahra NSW to export up to 150 tonnes of waste containing tin ashes and residues for recycling/reclamation of metals and metal compounds. The material would be transported from Australian Glass Manufacturers Company plants in Melbourne, Sydney, Brisbane, Adelaide and Perth to Hydrometal SA, Zoning Industriel D'Ehein, 4480-Engis, Belgium.

The material would be packaged in one tonne capacity lined, polypropylene bulk bags and loaded into containers, then transported by road to be loaded onto a ship at the Port of Melbourne and the Port of Sydney, to be offloaded at Antwerp, Belgium. The waste would transit through Durban, South Africa. At Antwerp, the containers would be offloaded onto road transport. From there, it would be transported by road to the disposal facility.

The export would take place in fifteen shipments over twelve months from the date the permit is granted.

The Register of the National Estate is an inventory of places 'that have aesthetic, historic, scientific or social significance or other special value for future generations as well as for the present community'. It is a list of the nation's heritage resources available to all decision makers to assist them to make better-informed decisions. There are no direct legal constraints placed on owners of private property, or on State or local government property by the entry of that property in the Register. Entry in the Register does not grant public access to private property.

In essence the Register is an alerting and educational inventory compiled on the single criterion of national estate significance, which is being developed to be as comprehensive as practicable, and which has implications for protection where actions by the Commonwealth are concerned.

The Commission will give due consideration to all objections made concerning its intention to enter places in the Register and would be assisted by being informed of the specific grounds on which an objection is based. It wishes to point out, however, that the final decision must be made in accordance with the requirements of the Act under which it is operating and therefore the prime consideration in the assessment of an objection must be whether the place in question does or does not have national estate significance.







Swiss Hard & Semi-Hard Cheeses made from Unpasteurised Milk (A357) An application from the Swiss Federal Veterinary Office received on 24 March 1998 to permit the use of milk which has not been pasteurised or thermised but subjected to other measures which in combination with the storage of the cheese provide an equivalent level of public safety protection for Swiss hard and semi-hard cheeses.

You are invited to present written submissions to the Authority on matters relevant to this application, including the potential regulatory impact on consumers, industry and government, by **24 June 1998**. The information paper on this matter provides further information, including advice on the Authority's policy regarding submissions.

MATTERS BEFORE COUNCIL The Authority has completed an inquiry into the variations to standards prepared at full assessment of the following proposal and has made a recommendation to the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Council that the variations be adopted into the *Food Standards Code*:

Pilot of a Health Claims Management Framework (P170) A proposal to amend the Standard A1(19) of the Australian *Food Standards Code* to conduct a pilot of a health claims management system, focussing on the link between increased maternal intakes of the B-group vitamin folate in the month prior to and three months following conception, and a reduction in the incidence of neural tube defects in babies.

ANTI-DUMPING AUTHORITY

FINAL FINDING ON POLYVINYL CHLORIDE HOMOPOLYMER (PVC) RESIN FROM GERMANY, HUNGARY, INDIA, ISRAEL AND THE NETHERLANDS

The Anti-Dumping Authority has completed its inquiry into the alleged dumping of PVC resin from Germany, Hungary, India, Israel and the Netherlands.

The Authority concluded that:

- exports of PVC resin to Australia from Germany, Hungary, India, Israel and the Netherlands have been dumped; and
- the Australian industry has suffered material injury from some cause or causes.

However, the Authority was not satisfied that dumped imports have either caused or threaten to cause material injury to the Australian industry.

In light of the above, the Authority has recommended that the Minister for Customs and Consumer Affairs not take anti-dumping action against imports of PVC resin from Germany, Hungary, India, Israel and the Netherlands.

The Authority also found that dumping margins relating to exports by Vinnolit Kunststoff GmbH of Germany were negligible. Therefore, the Authority has recommended to the Minister that he terminate the inquiry against this company.

The Minister has accepted the Authority's recommendations.

**NOTIFICATION OF A REVIEW OF THE RATE OF INTERIM DUTIES
APPLICABLE TO EDIBLE VEGETABLE OILS FROM MALAYSIA AND
SINGAPORE**

The Australian Customs Service has commenced a review of the rate of interim dumping duties applying to edible vegetable oils, in retail packs up to and including 6 litres, exported to Australia from Malaysia and Singapore.

The edible vegetable oils the subject of the review are soya bean, sunflower and rapeseed (canola) oil, and blended oil exported to Australia in retail packs up to and including 6 litres, for use as cooking oils. Edible vegetable oils in retail packs are classified in Schedule 3 to the Customs Tariff as follows:

<i>Commodity</i>	<i>Tariff Classification / Statistical key</i>
Soya Bean Oil	1507.90.00/13
Sunflower Oil	1512.19.00/23
Canola Oil	1514.90.00/02
Blended Vegetable Oil	1517.90.00/19

The review follows a request made by the Australian Oilseeds Federation under s. 269Z(1) of the *Customs Act*. The subsection provides for an affected party to apply for a review by Customs when it considers any factor relevant to the determination of the rate of interim duty has changed.

The submission by the Australian Oilseeds Federation claims that the non-injurious price (NIP), a factor relevant to the determination of the interim rate of dumping duty, has changed as a result of changes in crude oil prices. Crude oil is the major input to edible vegetable oils and the NIP was based on Australian industry's cost to make and sell the goods.



Normal values and ascertained export prices will be included in the review because they are likely also to have been affected by the price changes.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions no later than 10 June 1998. Submissions received after that date may be disregarded, pursuant to s. 269ZB(3) of the Customs Act.





**FINAL FINDING INTO COATED PAPER FROM AUSTRIA, BELGIUM,
FINLAND, FRANCE, GERMANY, ITALY, JAPAN, THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA,
THE NETHERLANDS, SWITZERLAND AND TAIWAN**

The Anti-Dumping Authority has completed its inquiry into exports of certain woodfree papers weighing between 90-150 grams per square metre (gsm), coated both sides and sold in sheets (coated paper) exported to Australia from Austria, Belgium, Finland, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, the Republic of Korea (Korea), the Netherlands, Switzerland and Taiwan.

The Authority found that:

- exports from Austria, Belgium, Finland, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Korea, the Netherlands, Switzerland and Taiwan have been dumped;
- there were negligible volumes of dumped imports from Belgium, France, the Netherlands, Switzerland and Taiwan;
- the Australian industry producing coated paper has suffered material injury caused by dumping;
- it is unlikely that future exports of coated paper from Italy and Korea will be dumped;
- future exports of coated paper from Austria, Finland, Germany and Japan may be dumped; and
- there is a threat of material injury to the Australian industry producing coated paper from future exports of coated paper from Austria, Finland, Germany and Japan.

The Authority recommended that:

- the Minister impose dumping duties on coated paper that has already been exported to Australia from KNP Leykam Overseas GmbH and SCA Fine Paper GmbH of Austria, Enso Fine Papers Oy and Metsa-Serla Oy of Finland, Hannover Papier AG, Nordland Papier GmbH and Stora Fine Paper AG of Germany and DaiEi Paper Ltd, Japan Pulp and Paper Co Ltd and The Okamoto Co Ltd of Japan;



- the Minister impose dumping duties on future imports of coated paper from KNP Leykam Overseas GmbH and SCA Fine Paper GmbH of Austria, Nordland Papier GmbH and Stora Fine Paper AG of Germany and DaiEi Paper Ltd and exporters in Japan (other than Japan Pulp and Paper Co Ltd and The Okamoto Co Ltd);
- the Minister accept price undertakings from Enso Fine Papers Oy and Metsa-Serla Oy of Finland, Hannover Papier AG of Germany, Japan Pulp and Paper Co Ltd and The Okamoto Co Ltd of Japan and defer his decision to publish or not to publish dumping duty notices in respect of these exporters; and
- the Minister take no action against imports of coated paper from Italy and Korea.

Stora Fine Paper AG of Germany subsequently offered a price undertaking to the Minister.

The Minister has accepted the Authority's recommendations with the exception of those relating to future exports from Stora Fine Paper AG of Germany. The Minister decided to accept the price undertaking offered by Stora Fine Paper AG in respect of future exports.

- (ii) if the export price of those particular goods is lower than the export price of the goods of that kind as ascertained, the amount by which the latter export price exceeds the former, and
- (b) the element of the interim dumping duty referred to in (a)(i) above in respect of those particular goods be ascertained by reference to tonnes being a measure of the quantity of those particular goods.
