

#### OPINION ON CATEGORY OF BROADCASTING SERVICE

On 27 November 1997 the Australian Broadcasting Authority (ABA) considered an application by Mr Myles Anderson under section 21 of the *Broadcasting Services Act 1992* (the Act) for an opinion to be formed by the ABA in relation to the category of the proposed *Red Dust Radio* service.

The proposed service is to be provided only to remote mines in Western Australia where employees are flown in and out of the work site. It will operate continuously and permanently and consist of a music driven format broken into day shift and night shift programming blocks.

The applicant contended that the proposed service would fall within the open narrowcasting category of broadcasting service.

It is the Authority's opinion that the service falls within the **open narrowcasting** category. This opinion is given having regard to the criteria set down in sections 18, and 22 of the Act. Matters considered by the ABA in reaching this opinion include:

that reception of the service will not be limited in any of the following ways:

- by being targeted to special interest groups [subpara. 18(a)(i)]; or
- by being provided during limited period or to cover a special event [subpara. 18(a)(iii)]; or
- because it provides programs of limited appeal [subpara. 18(a)(iv)]; or
- for some other reason [subpara 18(a)(v)];

#### but will be limited:

 by being intended only for limited locations, for example, arenas or business premises [subpara. 18(a)(ii)]; Under subsection 21(5)(a) of the Act, this opinion is binding for five years while the circumstances relating to the broadcasting service remain substantially the same as those advised to the ABA in relation to the application for the opinion.

The price-based allocation system is governed by the *Radiocommunications (Issue of Broadcasting (Narrowcasting) Transmitter Licences) Determination No. 1 of 1996*, (which was first determined by the SMA on 30 October 1996 and amended on 21 March 1997, 24 September 1997 and 13 March 1998).

## NOTICE OF APPLICATION RECEIVED UNDER THE HAZARDOUS WASTE (REGULATION OF EXPORTS AND IMPORTS) ACT 1989

Pursuant to Section 33 of the *Hazardous Waste* (*Regulation of Exports and Imports*) Act 1989, notice is given that an application was received from Copper Refineries Pty Ltd, Hunter Street, Stuart, Townsville, Queensland, 4811, to export up to 600 tonnes of waste comprising anode slimes containing oxygen, sulphur, barium, silver, gold, arsenic and silicon (AA040), from Townsville, to Norddeutsche Affinerie, Hovertrasse 50, D20539, Hamburg, Germany. The waste would transit through Belgium.

The waste would be disposed of by recycling/reclamation of metals and metal compounds.

The material would be packaged in lined Bulka bags and loaded into sea containers and transported by road to be loaded onto a ship at Townsville, to be offloaded at Antwerp, Belgium. At Antwerp, the containers would be offloaded and transported by road to the disposal facility at Hamburg, Germany.

The waste would transit Belgium.

The export would take place in eighteen shipments over twelve months from the date the permit is granted.

#### PORTABLE FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

- I, WARREN ERROL TRUSS, Minister for Customs and Consumer Affairs, pursuant to section 65E (1) of the *Trade Practices Act 1974*, hereby:
- a) REVOKE the consumer product safety standards in respect of portable fire extinguishers published in Gazette No GN 5, of 9 February 1994; and
- b) DECLARE that:
  - I.   - II. This standard will expire on 31 December 2002.

These will be deleted from this product safety standard effective 31 December 1999. Manufacturers and importers are therefore strongly advised to ensure that their product range complies with the most recent version of Standards Australia standards listed in this product safety standard.

#### ANTI-DUMPING AUTHORITY

Notice of inquiry into certain wound/skin closure strips from France, the Federal Republic of Germany and the United States of America

The Australian Customs Service (Customs) has made a preliminary finding that there are sufficient grounds for the publication of a dumping duty notice in respect of certain wound/skin closure strips exported to Australia from France, the Federal Republic of Germany and the United States of America.

In its preliminary finding report, Customs identified the following companies as the exporters of the dumped wound/skin closure strips that had caused injury to the Australian industry:

- Smith & Nephew SA in France;
- BDF Beiersdorf AG in the Federal Republic of Germany, and
- 3M Health Care in the United States of America.

Customs, acting under paragraph 269TD(2)(b) of the Customs Act 1901, has now referred the matter to the Anti-Dumping Authority for final inquiry. The subject of the Authority's inquiry is the question of whether the publication of a dumping duty notice in relation to certain wound/skin closures strips exported from the companies listed above is justified. At the conclusion of its inquiry, the Authority will recommend to the Minister what (if any) action he should take.

During its inquiry, the Authority will address the allegations made by Surgi Supplies International, the only Australian manufacturer of wound/skin closure strips, that wound/skin closure strips have been exported to Australia from the above companies at dumped prices and that this dumping has caused, and is threatening to cause, material injury to the Australian industry through price undercutting, price depression, price suppression, lost sales and market share, loss of profits and reduced capacity utilisation.

The Authority will examine importations into Australia of wound/skin closure strips entered for home consumption after 1 May 1996. The Authority will endeavour to report to the Minister by 9 November 1998.

You are invited to make a submission to the Authority as soon as possible, but not later than 2 September 1998. Submissions should, preferably, address specific matters raised in Customs' preliminary finding report. Copies of that report can be obtained from the Office Manager, Office Management Group, Australian Customs Service, Canberra by telephoning (02) 6275 6057.

Any person proposing to lodge a submission with the Authority should first obtain a copy of the information sheet prepared for this inquiry.
