# INVITATION TO COMMENT ON A DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT FOR A PROPOSED REPLACEMENT NUCLEAR RESEARCH REACTOR

The Proposal

In September 1997 the Commonwealth Government announced a proposal to construct and operate a replacement research reactor at the Australian Nuclear Science and Technology Organisation (ANSTO) site at Lucas Heights, Sydney. The replacement reactor would be located near the existing High Flux Australian Reactor (HIFAR). Construction and commissioning of the replacement reactor would be completed by 2005. It would have an operational life of at least 40 years. HIFAR and the replacement reactor would need to operate simultaneously for a short period during commissioning of thereplacement reactor. After this, HIFAR would be shut down permanently and be decommissioned.

## REVIEW OF THE AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS SERVICE'S TERMINATION AND NEGATIVE PRELIMINARY FINDING IN RESPECT OF CERTAIN COTTON BLANKETS FROM THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

The Anti-Dumping Authority has completed its review of the Australian Customs Service's termination and negative preliminary finding in respect of the alleged dumping of certain cotton blankets from the People's Republic of China.

The Authority has concluded that cotton blankets have not been exported to Australia from China at dumped prices during the investigation period.

The Authority has therefore confirmed Customs' findings to the effect that there are not sufficient grounds for the publication of a dumping duty notice in respect of cotton blankets exported to Australia from China.

#### DECLARATION OF INTENTION TO GRANT STATUTORY FISHING RIGHTS

I, ALEXANDER RAYMOND FRY, Manager, Licensing of the Australian Fisheries Management Authority, as a delegate of the Authority, make the following declaration under subsection 24(1) of the Fisheries Management Act 1991.

#### A. DECLARATION OF INTENT

AFMA intends to grant the following types of statutory fishing rights (SFRs) in relation to the South East Trawl (SET) Fishery:

- Boat SFRs which are rights to use nominated boats to engage in trawling in the area of the SET fishery, and
- Quota SFRs which are rights to take, in a particular year, particular amounts of quota species, being the quota allocated to those rights.

#### B. INVITATION TO APPLY

Persons wishing to apply to be registered as an eligible person for the grant of SFRs are invited to complete an:

Application to Register as Eligible for the Grant of Statutory Fishing Rights in the South East Trawl Fishery

and return the completed application to the address specified on the application form by 5:00pm on the closing date of 10 September 1998

#### C. INFORMATION

The following information is provided in accordance with section 25 of the Fisheries Management Act 1991.

#### **Definitions**

- 1. In this notice, unless the contrary intention appears:
  - "Act" means the Fisheries Management Act 1991.
  - "area of the fishery" means the area of the South East Trawl Fishery as defined in the Plan.
  - "eligible person" means a person who is registered as an eligible person for the grant of an SFR.
  - "fishery" means commercial activities by the method of trawling within the area of the fishery
  - "non quota species" means non quota species as defined in the Plan.
  - "Plan" means the South East Trawl Management Plan 1998.
  - "quota species" means quota species as defined in the Plan.
  - "SFR" means a statutory fishing right for the fishery.

#### **Fishing Activities**

- 2.1 The fishing activities which will be authorised by the SFRs to be granted under the Plan are fishing by the method known as trawling in the area of the fishery. To fish for non quota species a person must hold a boat statutory fishing right and to fish for quota species must also hold quota statutory fishing rights for quota species to be fished.
- 2.2 Trawling includes mid-water trawling, demersal otter board trawling, Danish seine trawling, beam trawling and pair trawling.
- 2.3 A person is entitled to fish for non quota species in the fishery only if the person is, or is acting for, the holder of a boat statutory fishing right.
- 2.4 A person is entitled to fish for quota species in the fishery only if the person is, or is acting for, the holder of:
  - (a) a boat statutory fishing right; and
  - (b) either:
    - (i) a quota statutory fishing right that permits that species to be taken; or
    - (ii) holds a fishing permit granted under the plan.

#### How SFRs will be granted

- 3. The grant of the SFRs is to be made by making SFRs available to persons who:
  - (a) are registered as eligible for this purpose in accordance with the procedures specified in the Act and the Plan as described below; and
  - (b) who then apply for one or more of the SFRs.

#### Procedures for selecting eligible persons and granting of SFRs

4. The full particulars of the procedures to be followed for selecting the persons to whom the grant of an SFR will be made available under section 29 of the Act are as follows:

#### 4.1 Registration

- (a) AFMA will advertise (by means of this notice) for applications to be made by persons wishing to be registered as eligible under section 26 of the Act for the grant of SFRs. Any person may apply for registration. There is no fee payable in relation to such an application. Applications must be received by 10 September 1998; and
- (b) AFMA will consider the applications it receives against the eligibility criteria set out in clause 12 of the Plan reproduced below:

#### "12 Conditions for registration (Act, s26)

- 12.1 A person satisfies the conditions for registration as an eligible person for the grant of a boat statutory fishing right if the person is the holder of a class A SEF fishing permit at the end of the period specified in the notice published by AFMA declaring that AFMA intends to grant statutory fishing rights in relation to fishing in the SET fishery.
- 12.2 A person satisfies the conditions for registration as an eligible person for the grant of a quota statutory fishing right if the person is the owner (except by way of a lease) of a SEF quota unit at the end of the period specified in the notice published by AFMA declaring that AFMA intends to grant statutory fishing rights in relation to fishing in the SET fishery.
- 12.3 In subclause 12.2 owner means a person who is registered, in the SEF Quota Unit Register maintained by AFMA, as the permanent holder of a SEF quota unit."
- (c) AFMA will register as an eligible person each applicant who satisfies the eligibility criteria as required by subsection 26(2) of the Act. There are no statutory fishing right options in relation to the Plan as referred to in section 31K of the Act.
- (d) AFMA will notify each applicant in writing of its decision to register or not to register that person as an eligible person, as soon as possible after it makes its decision as required under subsection 26(3) of the Act.

#### 4.2 Rights of Review

- (a) An applicant who is dissatisfied with AFMA's decision (the relevant decision) in relation to registration may, within 21 days after being notified of the relevant decision, or within such further period (if any) as AFMA, upon application within the 21 day period, may allow, request AFMA in writing to reconsider the relevant decision. The applicant must set out reasons for making the request.
- (b) AFMA must, within 45 days after receiving the request, reconsider the relevant decision and a may make a decision (the reviewable decision):
  - (i) in substitution for the relevant decision whether in the same terms or not; or
  - (ii) revoking the relevant decision.

> (c )An application may be made to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal for a review of a reviewable decision within 14 days of the applicant being notified of the reviewable decision.

#### 4.3 Provisional Grant of SFRs

- (a) Upon completion of all reviews in relation to relevant decisions as regards eligible persons, AFMA will, as required under section 23 of the Act, publish a notice in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette, setting out the name of the person or persons to whom fishing rights are to be granted and a summary of the fishing rights to be granted to each such person (provisional grants). AFMA will also notify in writing each person to whom it intends to grant SFRs.
- (b) The basis on which AFMA must make a provisional grant of a statutory fishing right to a person who is registered as an eligible person for the grant of the right is stated in subclauses 14.2 and 14.3 of the Plan and reproduced below:
- "14.2 If the person is registered as an eligible person for the grant of a boat statutory fishing right, AFMA must make a provisional grant to the person of 1 boat statutory fishing right for each class A SEF fishing permit held by the person at the end of the period specified in the notice published by AFMA declaring that AFMA intends to grant statutory fishing rights in relation to fishing in the SET fishery.
- 14.3 If the person is registered as an eligible person for the grant of a quota statutory fishing right, AFMA must make a provisional grant to the person of 1 quota statutory fishing right for a quota species for each SEF quota unit for that species held by the person at the end of the period specified in the notice published by AFMA declaring that AFMA intends to grant statutory fishing rights in relation fishing in the SET fishery."

#### 4.4 Provisional Grants - Rights of Review

- (a) A person who is an eligible person and who has been registered as such, and who is dissatisfied with AFMA's decision in relation to the provisional grant may request the Statutory Fishing Rights Allocation Review Panel (SFRARP) to review the decision in relation to the grant under section 143 of the Act. The applicant has 14 days after being notified of the decision to make the request.
- (b) Upon an application being made to SFRARP, SFRARP will notify AFMA and each person registered as eligible for a grant of an SFR of the application and AFMA and such persons notified become parties to the proceeding before the SFRARP.
- (c) An appeal lies to the Federal Court of Australia, on questions of law, from decisions of SFRARP.

#### 4.5 Request for Grant of SFRs

- (a) Under section 23 of the Act a grant of an SFR must not be made before the end of the appeal period to SFRARP or, in the event of such an appeal, before the appeal is dealt with by SFRARP, or otherwise disposed of.
- (b) Thereafter, in accordance with clause 15 of the Plan:
  - (i) AFMA will notify persons registered as eligible that the grant is available;
  - (ii) the persons so notified must request that AFMA make the grant;
  - (iii) if the person dose not so request, within 30 days, AFMA will send a notice to the last known address of the person notifying the person that he or she must make a request within a specified period;
  - (iv) if a request is still not received, a second notice will be sent informing the person that if a request is not received within 14 days that the person's registration as an eligible person will be cancelled.

#### **Duration of SFRs.**

5 An SFR will be in force for the duration of the Plan, unless that SFR is sooner surrendered under subsection 22(6) of the Act or cancelled by AFMA under section 39 of the Act.

#### **Amount of Charge**

6 There is no charge on the grant of SFRs for the purposes of the Statutory Fishing Rights Charge Act 1991.

Excise Act 1901

BY-LAW NO. 136

### WHOLESALE LIST PRICES OF TOBACCO

Pursuant to section 165 of the Excise Act 1901 and for the purposes of sub-item 6(A) of the Schedule to the Excise Tariff Act 1921. I, RICHARD JOHN HUNT, delegate of the Chief Executive Officer of Customs, prescribe that, with effect from 1 August 1998, the wholesale list price, per kilogram of tobacco of a kind that has the brand name set out in column 1 of the table in this by-law, is of a type set out in column 2 of that table (where applicable) and has packaging particulars set out in column 3 of that table, is the price set out in column 4 of that table opposite to those particulars.

The following Excise By-law is repealed with effect from 1 August 1998:-

**BY-LAW NO. 137**
