OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service and the Services of the Australian Postal Corporation and Defence Force appointments etc. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 am on Thursday, and sold at \$8.95 each or on subscription of \$395.00 (50 issues), \$206.00 (25 issues) or \$103.00 (12 issues).

Business issues, published each Tuesday, containing Notices under the Corporations Law, Bankruptcy Act and Private Notices and sold at \$4.95 each or on subscription of \$220.00 (50 issues), \$116.00 (25 issues).

Australian Securities Commission issues contain Notices under the Corporations Law and are published on the first Tuesday of each month and are sold at \$14.95 each or on subscription of \$132.00 (12 issues).

Special issues include notices which require urgent publication. All costs associated with producing Specials will be borne by the responsible department or authority. A limited number of Special Gazettes will be made available for sale from the Commonwealth Government Bookshop, Canberra, on the day of publication. General distribution of these notices will be by their inclusion in the next published issue of the Government Notices *Gazette* or *Business Gazette* as well as in the next published issue of the series of the *Gazette* in which the notice would normally have been published.

Tariff concessions issues contain notices of tariff concessions proposed, granted or revoked in accordance with the provisions of Part XVA of the *Customs Act 1901*. These issues are published each Wednesday and are sold at \$2.95 or on subscription only at \$115.00 for 50 issues including surface postage.

I will take these goods with me when I depart from Australia on a journey to a foreign country.

If I do not take the goods out of Australia on the flight/voyage, specified on the invoice, I will notify the proprietor of the store where the goods were purchased by noon the next working day that the goods were not exported; and

Where the sealed package is to be stored in the hold of an aircraft or cruise vessel, I will surrender the sealed package to the authorised collection officer at the baggage check-in counter, to allow for invoice detachment;

I will not interfere with or break the seals of the bag or other package until the invoices attached to the outside have been detached by authorised collection officers (or airline or shipping personnel); and

I will not give a sealed bag or other sealed package to any other person to carry onto the aircraft or cruise vessel for me.

If the goods are packed in a sealed bag and are delivered by the Duty Free Shop to a non-cruise vessel (including cargo ship), yacht and itinerant craft:

I will not remove or alter any invoice attached to the outside of the sealed bag or other sealed package or break the seals of the bag or other package until departure from Australia.

I am aware that the *Taxation Administration Act 1953* may provide for penalties of up to \$5,000.00 and/or imprisonment for up to 12 months where a person makes a false or misleading statement in this declaration, and the *Customs Act 1901* and the *Excise Act 1901* provides for severe penalties if sealed bags are interfered with or not exported.

- (vi) persons engaged in public sector employment as defined in section 4 of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996*; or
 - (vii) persons employed pursuant to any Act of Parliament replacing the above Acts; or
 - (viii) persons engaged in leading physical education programmes who may include and not be confined to the following: aerobic instructors, gymnastic instructors, sporting coaches and swimming instructors; or
 - (ix) persons employed in a service; the predominant function of which is the provision of employment services; or
 - (x) persons employed in a service, the predominant function of which is the provision of family day care and child care services; or
 - (xi) persons employed in a service, the predominant function of which is the provision of care or counselling in drug or alcohol rehabilitation; or
 - (xii) persons employed in a service, the predominant function of which is to care for or train people with disabilities; or
 - (xiii) persons involved in delivery of respite or home based care and persons receiving payments to family sponsorship activities; or
 - (xiv) persons employed in Aboriginal organisations, the predominant function of which is the provision in training or education, health or legal aid advice and assistance to Aboriginal people and persons employed in Aboriginal organisations, the predominant function of which is the provisions of crisis and supported accommodation and or related support services; or
 - (xv) persons employed in organisations governed by Aboriginal traditional owners for Aboriginal cultural purposes.
3. Nothing in this declaration will reduce the contingent rights to any forms of leave including sick leave, annual leave, long service leave or parenting leave which any employee has accrued, prior to the application of this declaration.

Nothing in this declaration will disadvantage employees in relation to their terms and conditions of employment in line with the No Disadvantage test in Part VIE in the *Workplace Relations Act* that employees have under any other award, agreement, industrial arrangement or contract of employment, prior to the application of this declaration.

4. This declaration shall operate from midnight on 31st August 1998.





I, JOCELYN MARGARET NEWMAN, Minister for Social Security, make this determination under paragraph 1315(1)(a) of the *Social Security Act 1991*.

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Part 1 Preliminary

Clause 1.1 Name of determination

This determination is the *Social Security (Public Interest Certificate) Guidelines Determination No. 1 of 1998*.

Clause 1.2 Commencement

This determination commences on *Gazetta*.

Clause 1.3 Definitions

In this determination:

Act means the *Social Security Act 1991*.

Centrelink means the agency established under section 6 of the *Commonwealth Services Delivery Agency Act 1997*.

Chief Executive Officer means the Chief Executive Officer of Centrelink.

criminal law means the criminal law of any place in Australia, and includes the criminal law of a place outside Australia if, and only if, it is appropriate to recognise that criminal law under any extradition arrangements to which Australia is a party.

Department means the Department of Social Security.

homeless young person means a person who is:

- (a) under the age of 18 years; and
- (b) who has claimed a payment from Centrelink where the amount payable depends upon the person being a homeless person.


Secretary means the Secretary to the Department of Social Security.

Clause 1.4 Revocation

This determination revokes the guidelines made by **Determination under section 1315 Disallowable Instrument No 3 of 29 June 1994**.

Part 2 General guidelines on the release of a Certificate in the Public Interest

Clause 2.1 General

Where relevant information about a person has been sought, the Secretary may either give a certificate under paragraph 1314(1)(a) of the Act for the disclosure of information about a person, or authorise the Chief Executive Officer to give such a certificate if, and only if:

- (a) the information cannot reasonably be obtained from a source other than the Department; and
- (b) the person or organisation seeking the information has an interest in obtaining it and, in the case of an organisation, the request is made by a senior officer of that organisation.

Clause 2.2 Disclosure cannot otherwise be made

The relevant information cannot be disclosed otherwise under subsection 1314(1) of the Act.

Clause 2.3 Satisfaction of conditions

A condition mentioned in Part 3 or Part 4, as subject to Part 5, is satisfied.

**Part 3 Conditions on the release of a Certificate in the
Public Interest—Missing persons, Crime,
Protection of Revenue and Correction of
Misinformation**

Clause 3.1 Serious and imminent threat to life or health

There are reasonable grounds for believing that the disclosure is necessary to prevent or lessen a serious and imminent threat to the life or health of a person.

Clause 3.2 Enforcement of the criminal law etc.

Subject to clause 3.3, the disclosure is reasonably necessary for the enforcement of the criminal law or of a law imposing a pecuniary penalty, or for the protection of the public revenue.

Clause 3.3 Additional conditions to enforcement of the criminal law etc.

Information must not be disclosed under clause 3.2, unless it relates to a matter of importance, such as a serious offence (including escaping legal custody, where the legal custody stems from the person having been convicted or charged with a serious offence), a substantial pecuniary penalty or a significant effect on the public revenue, or involves an offence or threatened offence against a Commonwealth employee or property, or where the offence or threatened offence occurs in or on Centrelink property and cannot otherwise be disclosed.

Clause 3.4 Deceased, missing or abducted person

The disclosure concerns a deceased person, a missing person or an abducted person and is necessary:

- (a) to assist a court, coronial enquiry, Royal Commission, department, or any other authority of a State or a Territory in relation to the death or whereabouts of the person; or
- (b) to assist in locating a relative, beneficiary or next-of-kin of the person; or
- (c) to assist a relative, beneficiary or next-of-kin of the person;

unless there are reasonable grounds for believing that the person does not or would not want the information disclosed.

Clause 3.5 Misinformation

The disclosure is reasonably necessary to correct a mistake of fact in relation to the administration of a program by the Department, where the integrity of the program is at risk if a correction is not made, or where the mistake of fact was published by or with the consent of the person to whom the disclosure relates.

Part 4 Conditions on the release of a Certificate in the Public Interest—Homeless Young Persons

Clause 4.1 Disclosure of information under this Part to Welfare Authority

The disclosure of information under this Part must concern a homeless young person who is either:

- (a) under the age of 18 years and in the care of a welfare authority of a State or Territory by reason of the operation of the law of a State or Territory or an order of a court, or
- (b) under the age of 15 years;

where the disclosure is to a welfare authority of a State or Territory.

Clause 4.2 Violence or abuse

The disclosure concerns a person who is a member of the family of a homeless young person where there are reasonable grounds for believing that violence or abuse has occurred and/or the disclosure is necessary to prevent or lessen a serious and imminent threat to the life or health of the person.

Clause 4.3 Qualification for payment—Verification

The disclosure is appropriate to verify the circumstances by which a homeless young person may be qualified for payment by the Department, where the verification involves contacting a parent or the parents of the person for the purpose of ascertaining whether the person is able to live at home.

Note: Social security payments, appropriated for that purpose, are made by Centrelink on behalf of the Department under administrative arrangements entered into under section 7 of the *Commonwealth Services Delivery Agency Act 1997*.


Clause 4.4 Reconciliation

The disclosure is for the purpose of facilitating a reconciliation or possible reconciliation between a homeless young person and a parent or the parents of the person.

Clause 4.5 Contact with the Department or Centrelink

The disclosure is for the purpose of assuring a parent or the parents of a homeless young person that the person has been or is in contact with the Department or Centrelink.





- (B) Dang Uyen Ly Tran proposes to acquire an interest in the Australian urban land as specified in the notice furnished on 15 September 1998 under section 26A of the Act;

NOW THEREFORE I, Rod Kemp, Assistant Treasurer, for and on behalf of the Treasurer, being satisfied that:

- (i) Dang Uyen Ly Tran proposes to acquire an interest in Australian urban land; and
- (ii) the proposed acquisition would be contrary to the national interest;

PROHIBIT the proposed acquisition pursuant to subsection 21A(2) of the Act.
