- b) pre-selection in accordance with any instrument made by the Australian Communications Authority from time to time under Part 17 of the *Telecommunications Act 1997*;
- c) over-ride dial codes in accordance with any instrument made by the Australian Communications Authority from time to time under Part 17 of the *Telecommunications Act 1997*; and

a ***point of interconnection*** is a physical point of connection between an integrated services digital network operated by a carrier or a carriage service provider and another network operated by a service provider.



Annexure 1

The **Digital Data Service** is a service for the carriage of certain communications, being data in digital form, between customer equipment at an end-user's premises in Australia and a point of interconnection, where:

- a) the customer equipment is directly connected to a carrier's or carriage service provider's network; and
- b) the carriage is capable of occurring at:
 - i) an X.50 rate using X.50 interfaces; or
 - ii) an nx64 rate using nx64 interfaces; and
- c) the carriage interworks with higher management facilities and network controls.

Definitions

Where words or phrases used in this Annexure are defined in the *Trade Practices Act 1974* or the *Telecommunications Act 1997*, they have the meaning as given in the relevant Act.

In this appendix:

nx64 interfaces are X.21, V.35 and G.703/G.704 interfaces, with up to 8 service interfaces per customer access; and

an **nx64 rate** is a rate of transmission equal to (n times 64 kilobits per second), where 'n' is a whole number between 1 and 31 (both inclusive); and

a **point of interconnection** is a physical point of connection in Australia between the network to which the relevant customer equipment is directly connected and a network operated by another service provider; and

X.50 interfaces are X.21, X.21bis and V.35(48 kilobits per second) interfaces, with one service interface per customer access; and

an **X.50 rate** is a rate of transmission equal to 1200 bits per second, 2400 bits per second, 4800 bits per second, 9600 bits per second, 19.2 kilobits per second or 48 kilobits per second.

Annexure 2

The **Domestic Transmission Capacity Service** is a service for the carriage of certain communications from one transmission point to another transmission point via network interfaces at a designated rate on a permanent basis by means of guided and/or unguided electromagnetic energy, except communications between:

- a) one customer transmission point and another customer transmission point; and
- b) a transmission point in Sydney and a transmission point in Melbourne; and
- c) a transmission point in Melbourne to a transmission point in Canberra; and
- d) a transmission point in Sydney and a transmission point in Canberra; and
- e) a transmission point in a State or Territory capital city and a transmission point in another State or Territory capital city, where the communications would entail communications of the type described in one or more of paragraphs (b), (c) and (d) if the capacity was routed via a continuous cable running from Brisbane to Perth through each of the capital cities; and
- f) one access seeker network location and another access seeker network location.

For the purposes of e), a State or Territory capital city will be taken to include any associated secondary centre.

Definitions

Where words or phrases used in this Annexure are defined in the *Trade Practices Act 1974* or the *Telecommunications Act 1997*, they have the meaning as given in the relevant Act.

In this appendix:

an **access seeker network location** is a point in a network operated by a service provider that is not a point of interconnection or a customer transmission point; and

an **associated secondary centre** means, in the case of Brisbane, the Gold Coast, in the case of Sydney, Newcastle and Wollongong, and in the case of Melbourne, Geelong; and

a **customer transmission point** is a point located at customer equipment at a service provider's customer's premises in Australia (for the avoidance of doubt, a customer in this context may be another service provider); and

a **designated rate** is a transmission rate of 2.048 megabits per second, 4.096 megabits per second, 6.144 megabits per second, 8.192 megabits per second, 34/45 megabits per second, 140/155 megabits per second (or higher orders agreed between a carrier or carriage service provider and another service provider); and

a **point of interconnection** is a physical point of connection in Australia agreed between a network operated by a carrier or a carriage service provider and another network operated by a service provider; and

a *transmission point* is any of the following agreed between a carrier or carriage service provider and another service provider:

- a) a point of interconnection;
- b) a customer transmission point;
- c) an access seeker network location.

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

BAN ON FISHING FOR PILCHARDS

I, Frank Meere, delegate of the Australian Fisheries Management Authority, make the following Temporary Order under subsection 43(2) and subsection 43(6) of the *Fisheries Management Act 1991*.

The reason for making the Temporary Order is the continuing unexplained death of Pilchards in waters off the South Australian Coast which may pose a threat to the marine environment, other fish and public health.

To minimise such risks, I am satisfied it is necessary to continue action to prohibit fishing for Pilchards in waters of the AFZ relevant to South Australia and that such action is consistent with the *Fisheries Management Act 1991*, Regulations made under that Act and AFMA's objectives.

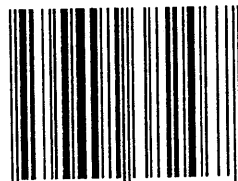
I am also satisfied that no other action is appropriate and that such action will complement action taken by South Australia.

The variations set forth in the Schedule below are variations to the *Food Standards Code* (hereinafter called 'the Code') which was published by the National Health and Medical Research Council in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette*, No. P 27, on 27 August 1987, and which has been varied from time to time.

The Schedule contains variations adopted by the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Council in October and November 1998.

These variations are published pursuant to section 32 of the *Australia New Zealand Food Authority Act 1991*.

2. Citation

These variations may be collectively known as Amendment No. 41 to the Code.

3. Commencement

These variations commence on 18 November 1998 and cease to have effect on 13 February 2000.

Editorial Notes:

- (1) Subclauses (e), (f), (g), (h) and (i) implement a pilot trial of a management system for health claims. The outcomes of the pilot will be used to assist in the evaluation of a proposal to allow wider use of health claims in food labels and advertisements. The subclauses cease to have effect on 13 February 2000.
- (2) Due to anticipated delays in the publication of amendments into the Food Standards Code, the approved foods/products listed in Column 1 to subclause (e) are also listed in a Register which is held at and by the Australia New Zealand Food Authority. The Register contains the most up to date list of approved foods/products.
- (3) Clause (13) of Standard A1 should be read in conjunction with Standard A9 - Vitamins and Minerals.

(f) A health claim must not be made in respect of the following foods -

- (i) food standardised in Part P of this Code;
- (ii) food standardised in Standards R4, R5, R6, R7 and R10 of this Code; and
- (iii) soft cheeses and pâté.

(g) The label on or attached to a package of food, in respect of which a health claim set out in the Table has been made, must include -

- (i) a nutrition information panel in accordance with clause (13) of this Standard, which additionally includes the average quantity of folate in one serving of the food, beside the proportion of the RDI of folate contributed by one serving of the food;
- (ii) an asterisk accompanying the word "folate" in the nutrition information panel which refers to a footnote advising that the RDI of 200 micrograms referred to is for adults, whereas for women, at least one month before and during pregnancy, the recommended folate intake is 400 micrograms per day;
- (iii) an accompanying statement that it is important to maintain a varied diet; and

- (iv) a statement of particular storage, handling or cooking requirements, where the ability of a food to contain at least 40 micrograms folate per each serving depends on those requirements.

(h) Where a label, in respect of which a health claim set out in the Table has been made, is displayed on or in connection with a food which is displayed for retail sale other than in a package, the label must include -

- (i) a nutrition information panel in accordance with clause (13) of this Standard, which additionally includes the average quantity of folate in one serving of the food, beside the proportion of the RDI of folate contributed by one serving of the food; and
- (ii) an asterisk accompanying the word 'folate' in the nutrition information panel which refers to a footnote advising that the RDI of 200 micrograms referred to is for adults, whereas for women, at least one month before and during pregnancy, the recommended folate intake is 400 micrograms per day.
- (iii) an accompanying statement that it is important to maintain a varied diet; and
- (iv) a statement of particular storage, handling or cooking requirements, where the ability of a food to contain at least 40 micrograms folate per each serving depends on those requirements.

(i) Where a health claim may be made in relation to a food in accordance with this Standard the same claim in relation to that food may be made in an advertisement, provided the advertisement includes a statement that it is important to maintain a varied diet."

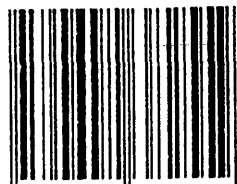
