

An Ordinance to amend the *National Land Ordinance 1989*

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *National Land (Amendment) Ordinance 1998*¹.

2 *National Land (Amendment) No. , 1998*

Commencement

2. (1) Subject to subsection (2), this Ordinance commences on the day on which it is notified in the *Gazette*.

(2) Section 4 shall be taken to have commenced on the repeal of the *City Area Leases Act 1936* of the Territory.

Principal Ordinance

3. In this Ordinance, "Principal Ordinance" means the *National Land Ordinance 1989*².

Interpretation

4. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting in subsection (1) the following definition:

" 'City Area' means the City Area within the meaning of the *City Area Leases Act 1936* of the Territory as in force immediately before its repeal;".

Management of National Land

5. Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is amended—

- (a) by omitting from subsection (1) "Planning"; and
- (b) by omitting from subsection (2) "Administrative Services" and substituting "Finance and Administration".

Insertion

6. After section 5 of the Principal Ordinance the following section is inserted:

Occupancy of buildings

"5A. (1) Where, under an applied provision, the Commonwealth grants a lease of land with improvements, a person may occupy or use, or permit another person to occupy or use, the improvements whether or not a certificate or other instrument permitting occupancy or use of the improvements has been issued under the Building Act or any of the laws repealed by that Act.

“(2) Nothing in subsection (1) prevents the application of the Building Act to—

- (a) the alteration, after the grant of the lease, of the improvements which were on the land at the time of the grant of the lease; or
- (b) the construction, after the grant of the lease, of other improvements on the land.

‘Building Act’ means the *Building Act 1972* of the Territory.”.

1. This Declaration may be cited as the Carrier Licence Conditions (28 GHz and 31 GHz Bands) Declaration 1998.

Note: This Declaration commences on gazettal: see *Acts Interpretation Act 1901*, ss 46A and 48.

Interpretation

2. In this Declaration:

relevant agreement means an agreement, arrangement or understanding:

- (a) whether formal or informal or partly formal and partly informal; and
- (b) whether written or oral or partly written and partly oral; and
- (c) whether or not having legal or equitable force and whether or not based on legal or equitable rights;

subsidiary has the meaning given by section 46 of the Corporations Law.



Carrier Licence Conditions (28 GHz and 31 GHz Bands)
Declaration 1998

Application

3. This Declaration applies to the carrier licences granted to Telstra Corporation Limited, Telstra Multimedia Pty Limited, Optus Networks Pty Ltd, Optus Mobile Pty Ltd and Optus Vision Pty Limited.

Limits on spectrum use

4. (1) The licensee must not, before or during any process administered by the ACA for issuing spectrum licences under Subdivision B of Division 1 of Part 3.2 of the *Radiocommunications Act 1992* for a part of the spectrum referred to in the Radiocommunications (Spectrum Designation) Notice No. 1 of 1998 (dealing with spectrum in the frequency band between 27.5 GHz and 28.35 GHz) and the Spectrum Re-allocation Declaration No. 1 of 1998 (dealing with spectrum in the frequency band between 31 GHz and 31.3 GHz):

- (a) seek to obtain a spectrum licence authorising the use of spectrum in the frequency bands between 27.5 GHz and 28.35 GHz and between 31 GHz and 31.3 GHz; or
- (b) enter into a relevant agreement with another person under which the other person or a third party seeks, on behalf of the licensee, to obtain a spectrum licence authorising the use of the parts of the spectrum mentioned in paragraph (a); or
- (c) allow a subsidiary of the licensee to:
 - (i) seek to obtain a spectrum licence authorising the use of the parts of the spectrum mentioned in paragraph (a); or
 - (ii) enter into a relevant agreement with another person under which the other person or a third party seeks, on behalf of the licensee or the subsidiary, to obtain a spectrum licence authorising the use of the parts of the spectrum mentioned in paragraph (a).

(2) In subsection (1), each frequency band includes all frequencies that are greater than the lower frequency, up to and including the higher frequency.

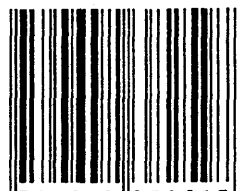
