The Geographical Indication "Frankland River" is located within the region Great Southern, within the zone South West Australia, within the State of Western Australia, Australia.

The beginning point of the boundary is situated on Map Tonebridge (Sheet 2229) at grid reference MH810190, being the intersection of longitudinal grid line 810 and Terrace Road, then proceeds easterly along grid line 190 to the edge of map at grid reference NH000190; On to Map Frankland (Sheet 2329) at grid reference 000190, then proceeds easterly along grid line 190 to grid reference 150190, then proceeds southerly along grid line 150 to the edge of map at grid reference 150824; On to Map Denmark (Sheet 2328) at grid reference 150824, then proceeds southerly along grid line 150 to grid reference 150820, then proceeds easterly along grid line 820 to grid reference 200820, then proceeds southerly along grid line 200 to grid reference 200740, then proceeds westerly along grid line 740 to the edge


**Commonwealth Places (Mirror Taxes)
(Modification of Applied Laws — South Australia)
Notice 1999**

I, Robert Ivan Lucas, Treasurer of South Australia, acting under subsection 8(2) of the *Commonwealth Places (Mirror Taxes) Act 1998*, prescribe the modification of the applied laws in relation to Commonwealth places in South Australia set out in Schedule 1.

This notice is taken to have commenced on 6 October 1997.

Schedule 1 Modification of applied laws

- 1 Each applied law is modified by the addition of a provision to the following effect:
- (1) "This applied law is to be read together with its corresponding State taxing law as a single body of law."
 - (2) The principle in subclause (1) is subject to any express exceptions and qualifications prescribed under the *Commonwealth Places (Mirror Taxes Administration) Act 1999* of South Australia or the *Commonwealth Places (Mirror Taxes) Act 1998* of the Commonwealth.

Notes

1. Subsection 8(2) of the *Commonwealth Places (Mirror Taxes) Act 1998* of the Commonwealth authorises the Treasurer of a State to prescribe, by notice in writing, modifications of the applied laws of the State, other than modifications for the purpose of overcoming a difficulty that arises from the requirements of the Constitution. Paragraph 8(5)(a) of that Act provides that modifications made under section 8 may be expressed to take effect from a date that is earlier than the date on which the modifications are notified in the *Gazette*.

Applied law is defined in section 3 of the *Commonwealth Places (Mirror Taxes) Act 1998* of the Commonwealth to mean the provisions of a State taxing law that apply in relation to a Commonwealth place in accordance with the Act. *State taxing law* and *Commonwealth place* are also defined in section 3 of the Act.

2. The notice is a disallowable instrument for the purposes of section 46A of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1901* of the Commonwealth.
3. Section 7 of the *Commonwealth Places (Mirror Taxes Administration) Act 1999* of South Australia authorises the modification of State taxing laws by regulation.

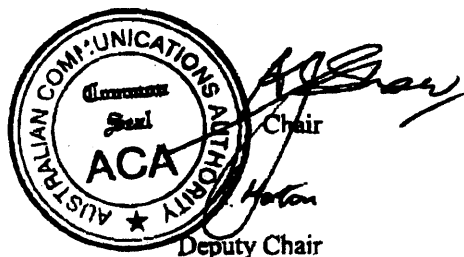

1. Collection of marine specimen shells is to be carried out in accordance with the document entitled "A management strategy for the taking of specimen shells in Victoria" submitted by the Fisheries Victoria, Department of Natural Resources and Environment;
2. Reports are to be provided by Fisheries Victoria to the Designated Authority as follows:
 - an annual report will be submitted by 31 December each year incorporating collection data, by species, numbers, method and location, for the year. The report will review progress in achieving the aims and objectives of the strategy;
 - a report will be submitted by 31 December 2002 on the review of data to determine whether a trip limit for commercial harvesting is warranted and an analysis of alternative management arrangements to trip limits;
3. This declaration is valid until 31 January 2003.

REDISTRIBUTION OF FEDERAL ELECTORAL BOUNDARIES IN WESTERN AUSTRALIA

PUBLIC CONSULTATION

On 23 December 1999, the Australian Electoral Commission directed a redistribution of the electoral boundaries for the House of Representatives' Electoral Divisions in Western Australia. Interested persons and organisations are invited to lodge written suggestions and comments about the boundaries and names of the 15 Federal Electoral Divisions in Western Australia to the Redistribution Committee.

WHY A REDISTRIBUTION?

On 9 December 1999, in accordance with section 48 of the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918*, the Electoral Commissioner determined that, as a result of population changes between the States and Territories, Western Australia will be entitled to 15 members in the House of Representatives at the next general election. Western Australia currently has 14 members.

LEGAL REQUIREMENTS FOR A REDISTRIBUTION

A redistribution is carried out in accordance with the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918*. A Redistribution Committee is appointed to produce a proposed set of boundaries and names of Electoral Divisions. The Redistribution Committee for Western Australia consists of the Electoral Commissioner (Mr Andy Becker A/g), the Australian Electoral Officer for Western Australia (Mr Andrew Moyes), the Surveyor-General for Western Australia (Mr Henry Houghton) and the Auditor-General of Western Australia (Mr Des Pearson).

In making its proposed redistribution, the Redistribution Committee is required to "give due consideration, in relation to each proposed Electoral Division, to :

- (i) *community of interests within the proposed Electoral Division, including economic, social and regional interests;*
- (ii) *means of communication and travel within the proposed Electoral Division;*
- (iv) *the physical features and area of the proposed Electoral Division; and*
- (v) *the boundaries of existing Divisions in the State or Territory...*" (CEA Section 66(3)(b)).

Consideration of existing boundaries is subordinate to the other considerations.

The number of electors in each proposed Division must not deviate by more than 10% above or below the enrolment quota for a Division. The quota of electors for each Division in Western Australia was determined by the Electoral Commissioner on 24 December 1999 to be 78,937. At 31 March 2004, the number of electors enrolled in each Electoral Division is not to be less than 96.5% or more than 103.5% of the average divisional enrolment for the State at that time.

THE REDISTRIBUTION PROCESS

Step 1 - Public suggestions

Before the Redistribution Committee makes its proposal, interested persons or organisations are invited to make a written suggestion about possible boundaries or names of Divisions. Suggestions must be lodged by 6.00 pm on Friday 24 March 2000.

Step 2 - Comments on the public suggestions

All the suggestions received will be available for public inspection from 9.00am on 27 March 2000 at the office of the Australian Electoral Officer for Western Australia. Any comments must be lodged in writing by 6.00 pm on Friday 7 April 2000.

Step 3 - Proposed redistribution

After considering all written suggestions and comments, the Redistribution Committee will make a proposed redistribution. Maps showing the proposed boundaries and names of Divisions will be published and exhibited at the Divisional Offices of the Australian Electoral Commission in Western Australia, at its Head Offices in all States and the Northern Territory, and Central Office in Canberra.

Step 4 - Objections to the proposed redistribution

Objections to the proposed redistribution can be lodged within 28 days. There is then a further 14 day period for lodgement of written comments on any objections.

Step 5 - Objections considered by the augmented Electoral Commission

The augmented Electoral Commission for Western Australia comprises the members of the Redistribution Committee plus the Chairman of the Australian Electoral Commission (the Hon. Trevor Morling QC) and the non-judicial Commissioner (Mr Bill McLennan, Australian Statistician). All objections are considered by the augmented Electoral Commission, which may hold a public inquiry into an objection.

Step 6 - The second redistribution proposal

After considering all objections and comments, the augmented Electoral Commission makes its own proposed redistribution.

Step 7 - Further objections

If the augmented Electoral Commission's proposed redistribution is significantly different from the Redistribution Committee's proposal, the augmented Electoral Commission will invite further objections.

Step 8 - Final determination

After considering all submissions, the augmented Electoral Commission will make a final determination of boundaries and names of the Electoral Divisions for Western Australia.

GUIDELINES FOR PUBLIC SUGGESTIONS

Persons or organisations making suggestions to the Redistribution Committee are urged to take account of the requirements of the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918*. Copies can be obtained from Commonwealth Government Bookshops. It can also be accessed through the AEC's Internet website www.aec.gov.au.

Electoral enrolments at 23 December 1999 and projected enrolments at 31 March 2004 at the Census Collection District (CCD), Statistical Local Area (SLA) and Electoral Division levels are available from the Australian Electoral Commission, 28 Thorogood Street Burswood WA (Tel: 08 9470 7299), and at the AEC's Internet website. Maps of current Divisional boundaries and information about the conventions used for naming Federal Divisions are also available.

FINDING ON CERTAIN GALVANISED STEEL PIPE EXPORTED
FROM THAILAND

The Australian Customs Service (Customs) commenced an investigation on 27 April 1999 after an application lodged by Tubemakers of Australia Limited. The investigation concerned the alleged dumping of hot dip galvanised, welded, circular hollow section, steel pipe in nominal sizes DN 15-100 (HDG CHS steel pipe) exported from Thailand. HDG CHS steel pipe is classified in terms of the *Customs Tariff Act 1995* under subheading 7306.30.00, statistical codes 30 to 37.

Customs has completed its investigation and found that:

- there have been dumped exports of HDG CHS steel pipe from Thailand;
- the Australian industry producing HDG CHS steel pipe has suffered material injury in the form of price undercutting, price depression, price suppression, loss of sales, loss of market share and reduced profits and profitability;
- the dumped exports from Thailand have caused material injury to the Australian industry; and
- future exports of HDG CHS steel pipe from Thailand may be dumped.

Customs therefore recommended to me that I impose anti-dumping measures, in the form of interim dumping duty, on exports of HDG CHS steel pipe from Thailand.

I have accepted those recommendations and declare that section 8 of the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* applies to exports of HDG CHS steel pipe from Thailand entered for home consumption in Australia on or after 14 September 1999, being the date from which Customs imposed securities.

Trade Measures Report No. 11 of 29 October 1999 (the report) sets out reasons for this decision, including material findings of fact or law on which the decision is based. The report includes particulars of:

- export prices and normal values ascertained for the purposes of anti-dumping measures;
- dumping margins, including an explanation of the methods used to compare export prices and normal values to establish those dumping margins; and



- considerations relevant to the determination of material injury to the Australian industry.




