PR-134: Field evaluation of a transgenic line of field pea (*Pisum sativum* L.) for resistance to Ascochyta blight

Brief description of the nature and effect of the genetic modification: A gene coding for a sulfur-rich seed protein found in sunflower (*Helianthus annuus*) has been introduced into two commercial pea cultivars to improve nutritional quality. In addition, the peas also express a gene from the bacterium *Streptomyces hygroscopicus* that confers resistance to the herbicide glufosinate ammonium (Basta®) and a gene from the bacterium *Escherichia coli* encoding the screenable marker β -glucuronidase (GUS).

Location and size of trial: Up to 100 transgenic plants are to be grown on the CSIRO Black Mountain campus, Canberra, ACT.

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**PR-136: Field maintenance and propagation of sugarcane
modified for sucrose metabolism and juice colour**

One variety has been modified by the introduction of copies of sections of the sugarcane invertase gene. Invertase is a key enzyme in sugar production. The modification is designed to block the activity of the invertase gene and increase the sugar content of the plants.

In the second line, copies of sections of the sugarcane polyphenol oxidase (PPO) gene have been introduced. PPO is an enzyme responsible for the browning of juice and crystals from sugarcane. The aim of the modification is to block the action of the PPO gene so that the sugar has lower colour and higher quality. These plants also contain a gene for a green fluorescent protein from jellyfish. This acts as a marker to distinguish genetically modified from unmodified plants.

In addition, both lines of sugarcane express the marker gene *aphA*, which confers resistance to the antibiotic geneticin, and is used to select genetically modified plants in the laboratory.

Location and size of trial: Up to 0.1 hectares at a CSIRO site at Townsville, 0.3 hectares at Brisbane, and either 0.26 hectares at Ayr or 0.4 hectares near Halifax, Queensland.

CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS - PROPOSALS The Authority has completed its full assessment of the following proposal, prepared draft variations to the Australian *Food Standards Code* and will now conduct an inquiry to consider the draft variations. You are invited to present written submissions to the Authority, including the potential regulatory impact on consumers, industry and government, by **12 April 2000**:

- **Labelling of Foods Containing Alcohol (P219)** A proposal to require foods containing more than 1.15% alcohol to declare the alcohol concentration and, for foods containing significant amounts of alcohol (other than alcoholic beverages), a statement advising that the food should be kept out of reach of children.

With respect to this proposal the Authority decided to omit to invite public submissions prior to making its full assessment. The Authority considers that the proposal raises issues of public health and safety concern, and that to omit to invite public submissions prior to making a full assessment would not have a significant adverse effect on the interests of any person or body. The Authority therefore did not invite public submissions prior to making its full assessment, but does so now in order to undertake an inquiry.

MATTERS BEFORE COUNCIL The Authority has completed inquiries into the variations to standards prepared at full assessment of the following applications and has made recommendations to the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Council that the variations be adopted into the *Food Standards Code*:

- **Maximum Residue Limits (Applications A369, A370, A374 and A392)** Applications received from the National Registration Authority to amend Australian Maximum Residue Limits (MRLs) for a number of agricultural chemicals as currently prescribed in the *Australian Food Standards Code*.

In accordance with the transitional arrangements for food standards between Australia and New Zealand, individual country MRLs for agricultural and veterinary chemicals continue to apply for these standards and these applications propose changes for MRLs for food sold in Australia, whether imported or domestically produced.

With respect to these applications the Authority is satisfied that they raise issues of minor significance and complexity and that to omit to invite public submissions prior to completing its inquiries would not have a significant adverse effect on the interests of any person or body. The Authority therefore did not invite public submissions prior to completing its inquiries.

RELEASE OF THE PROPOSED DRAFT JOINT AUSTRALIA NEW ZEALAND FOOD STANDARDS CODE ANZFA has substantially completed its review of food standards in Australia and New Zealand and has developed a draft joint Code. The draft Code will be published on the ANZFA website on 15 March 2000 to enable persons and organisations to provide comment on its overall effectiveness. Comments are requested by **17 May 2000**.

DECLARATION UNDER REGULATION 3

DETERMINATION UNDER SUBREGULATION 4(2)

I, WILLIAM PATRICK DEANE, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting under the Australian Active Service Medal ("AASM") Regulations set out in the Schedule to Letters Patent dated 13 September 1988, ("the Regulations"), and on the recommendation of the Minister for Defence, hereby:

- (a) declare, under regulation 3 of the Regulations, the following warlike operations in which members of the Australian Defence Force are engaged in the area comprising East Timor and the sea adjacent to East Timor out to a distance of 12 nautical miles from the low water mark to be a *prescribed operation* for the purposes of the Regulations:
 - (i) Operation 'Faber' that commenced on 16 September 1999;
 - (ii) Operation 'Warden' that commenced on 16 September 1999; and
 - (iii) Operation 'Tanager' that commenced on 20 February 2000;
- (b) determine, under subregulation 4(2) of the Regulations, that the conditions for the award of the AASM with Clasp 'EAST TIMOR' ("the Medal") for that *prescribed operation* are:
 - (i) the Medal may be awarded to a member of the Australian Defence Force who rendered service as such a member while posted as a member of the Australian element of the *prescribed operation* for a *prescribed period*;
 - (ii) the Medal may be awarded to a member of the Australian Defence Force who rendered service as such a member for a *prescribed period* as part of the contribution of a foreign



Defence Force to the *prescribed operation* while on secondment or exchange with that foreign Defence Force;

- (iii) the Medal may be awarded to a member of the Australian Defence Force who rendered service as such a member and who completed a *prescribed number of sorties* within the duration of the *prescribed operation*;
- (iv) the Medal may be awarded to a member of the Australian Defence Force who rendered service as such a member and who for a *prescribed period*, undertook official visits, inspections or other occurrences of a temporary nature in connection with the military contribution in the *prescribed operation*;
- (v) the Medal may be awarded to a person who rendered service as part of the Australian element of the *prescribed operation* for a *prescribed period* and who, in accordance with a determination made by the Minister under paragraph 4(4)(b) of the Regulations, is in a class of persons who may be awarded the Medal;
- (vi) in this paragraph "*prescribed period*" means:
 - (A) in relation to subparagraphs (b)(i), (ii) and (v), a period of not less than one day;
 - (B) in relation to subparagraph (b)(iv), a period of not less than an aggregate of 30 days,


PROVIDED THAT where a member does not complete the *prescribed period* required by subparagraphs (b)(i), (ii), (iv) or (v) owing to his or her death, evacuation due to illness, injury or other disability due to service, the member will be deemed to have completed that *prescribed period*.

- (vii) in this paragraph "*prescribed number of sorties*" means:
 - (A) one operational sortie from a unit assigned to the *prescribed operation*; or
 - (B) 30 non-operational sorties from any unit, not necessarily assigned to the *prescribed operation*, where those sorties were conducted over a period of not less than an aggregate of 30 days at a rate of one sortie per day,

PROVIDED THAT where a member does not complete the required *prescribed number of sorties* owing to his or her death, evacuation due to illness, injury or other disability due to service, the member will be deemed to have completed the *prescribed number of sorties*.





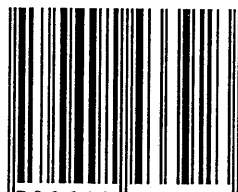
