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OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Special issues include notices which require urgent publication. All costs associated with producing Specials will be borne by the responsible department or authority. A limited number of Special Gazettes will be made available for sale from the Commonwealth Government Bookshop, Canberra, on the day of publication. General distribution of these notices will be by their inclusion in the next published issue of the Government Notices *Gazette* or *Business Gazette* as well as in the next published issue of the series of the *Gazette* in which the notice would normally have been published.

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These issues are published each Wednesday and are sold at \$3.15 or on subscription only at \$62.00 for 25 issues including surface postage.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Australian Public Service conditions of entry and advancement; holders of import licences and tariff quotas; notification by Australian Securities Commission of intention to deregister defunct companies. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the Government Notices and Business issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all selected issues.

Index issues contain references to entries in the Government Notices and the related Special and Periodic issues. Index issues are published quarterly, are available over the counter from Commonwealth Government Bookshops and are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the Government Notices issues.

LOGBOOK NOTICE NO. BSSL 03

LOGBOOK FOR DREDGING OR TRAWLING

I, Frank Meere, delegate of the Australian Fisheries Management Authority, make the following determination under subregulations 32(1) and (3) of the Fisheries Management Regulations.

Citation

1. This determination may be cited as Logbook Notice No. BSSL 03.

Commencement

2. This determination commences 14 days after the day on which, or the later of the days on which, this determination is published in the gazette and in *The Australian* newspaper.

Interpretation

3. In this determination:

"SCA01 Scallop Log" means the form of logbook published by AFMA in 1999 for which:

- (a) the title is "Bass Strait, Tasmanian and Victorian Scallop Fishery Confidential Daily Fishing Logbook"; and
- (b) the distinguishing mark is "SCA01".

"SCA02 Catch Disposal Record" means the form of logbook published by AFMA in July 2000 for which:

- (a) the title is "Bass Strait Scallop Catch Disposal Record" and
- (b) the distinguishing mark is "SCA02";

"distinguishing mark" in relation to a form of logbook, means the marking by which the logbook can be distinguished from AFMA's other forms of logbook;

Which logbooks must be used?

4. When bivalve molluscs of the family *Pectinidae* are fished for or taken by the methods of dredging or trawling in the area of the Bass Strait Central Zone Scallop Fishery, the following forms of logbook must be used to record information about the taking of the molluscs:

- (a) the SCA01 Scallop Log; and
- (b) the SCA02 Catch Disposal Record.

When must the logbooks be used?

5. Subregulations 33(1), 33(2) and 33(3) of the Fisheries Management Regulations apply in respect of:

- (a) the SCA01 Scallop Log; and
- (b) the SCA02 Catch Disposal Record;

during the period beginning on the commencement of this determination and ending at the end of 31 July 2003.

Where can copies of the logbook be obtained?

6. Copies of the SCA01 Scallop Log and SCA02 Catch Disposal Record can be obtained during ordinary business hours from the Australian Fisheries Management Authority, 3rd Floor John Curtin House, 22 Brisbane Avenue BARTON ACT 2600.

The ABA is required to renew these licences unless it decides that an applicant is no longer a suitable licensee. A company is a suitable licensee if the ABA does not decide that sub-section 41(2) (for commercial) or 83(2) (for community) of the Act applies to the company.

The ABA may decide that either section 41(2) or 83(2) of the Act applies to a licensee if it is satisfied that allowing the licensee to provide or continue to provide either a commercial or a community broadcasting service under a licence would lead to a significant risk of:

- (a) an offence against the Act or the regulations being committed; or
- (b) a breach of the conditions of the licence occurring.

In deciding whether these sub-sections apply, the ABA is required by sections 41(3) (commercial) and 83(3) (community) of the Act, to take into account:

- (a) the business record of the company; and
- (b) the company's record in situations requiring trust and candour; and
- (c) (commercial) the business record of each person who is, or would be, if a licence were allocated to the applicant, in a position to control the licence; or (community) the business record of the chief executive and each director and secretary of the applicant; and
- (d) the record in situations requiring trust and candour of each such person; and
- (e) whether the company, or a person referred to in paragraph (c) or (d), has been convicted of an offence against this Act or the regulations.

The Act does not require the ABA to hold an investigation or a hearing into whether a licence should be renewed.



Section 196G of the *Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986*

The Repatriation Medical Authority (the Authority) gives notice under section 196G of the *Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986* (the Act) that it intends to carry out an investigation under section 196B(7) of the Act to review the contents of Statements of Principles concerning acute lymphoid leukaemia (Instrument Nos.77 and 78 of 1995).

The Authority invites the following persons and organisations to make written submissions to the Authority in respect of the investigation:


- any person eligible to make a claim for pension under Part II or Part IV of the *Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986*;
- any organisation representing veterans, Australian mariners, members of the Forces, members of the Peacekeeping Forces or their dependants;
- the Repatriation Commission; and
- any person having expertise in a field relevant to the investigation.

The Authority will hold its first meeting for the purposes of this investigation on **7 November 2000**.



CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS. The Authority has prepared the following proposal and will now make a full assessment of it. You are invited to present written submissions to the Authority on this matter, including the potential regulatory impact on consumers, industry and government, by **25 October 2000**:

- **Health and Related Claims (Proposal P153).** A proposal to review the current regulations relating to the prohibition on health claims in Australia and New Zealand. The purpose of this proposal is to clarify the intent of the current regulations and ensure that they are clear and enforceable; and determine whether the current prohibition on health claims in Australia and New Zealand should be lifted. The proposal also considers if health claims are to be permitted, under what policy framework should a health claims system be allowed to proceed.

The supporting document for this matter also seeks comment on the draft Inquiry Report for the **Folate Health Claims Pilot (Proposal P170)**. The pilot was initiated by the direction given in March 1998 by the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Health and Family Services. The Authority is obliged by the *ANZFA Act* to hold an inquiry in relation to the variation to Standard A1 – *Labelling and Advertising*, prepared in relation to the Proposal.

MATTERS BEFORE COUNCIL. The Authority has completed inquiries into the variations to standards prepared at full assessment of the following matters and has made recommendations to the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Council that the variations be adopted into the *Food Standards Code*:

- **Labelling of Foods containing Alcohol (Proposal P219).** A proposal to require that all foods containing a concentration of greater than 1.15% alcohol by volume be labelled with a statement of the alcohol concentration of the product.
- **Folate Health Claims – Extension of Time (Proposal P222).** A proposal to extend the sunset date for the pilot.





NOTICE OF DECISION

It is the decision of the Board that it is satisfied that the Respondent has failed during the course of the various liquidation administrations to carry out or perform adequately and properly:

- (i) the duties of a liquidator; or

- (ii) any duties or functions required by an Australian law to be carried out or performed by a registered liquidator;

as provided in paragraph 1292(2)(d)(i) and (ii) of the Law, in that the working papers of the administrations show either that the Respondent failed to maintain adequate working papers or failed to perform the liquidation administrations adequately.

ACCORDINGLY THE BOARD ORDERS pursuant to section 1292 of the Law, (and the Board notes that the Respondent consents to these orders without any admissions of liability on the part of the Respondent as far as third parties are concerned) that:

1. the registration of Lionel Roy Hendy as a registered liquidator be suspended on and from 4 September 2000 up to and including 4 March 2002; and


