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OTHER ISSUES OF THE GAZETTE

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service and the Defence Force appointments etc. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 am on Thursday, and sold at \$9.70 each or on subscription of \$119.00 (14 issues).

Period means the period of time commencing upon the date of this determination and expiring on 30 November 2000.



NOTICE OF APPLICATION RECEIVED UNDER THE HAZARDOUS WASTE (REGULATION OF EXPORTS AND IMPORTS) ACT 1989

Pursuant to Section 33 of the *Hazardous Waste (Regulation of Exports and Imports) Act 1989*, notice is given that an application has been received from Beaufort Shipping Agency Company, Level 7, 1 Franklin Wharf, Hobart, Tasmania 7000, to import up to 150 metric tonnes and 15,000 litres of wastes comprising sump oil, compacted plastic waste, broken glass from bottles, steel from plated steel cans, ashes from the incineration of wood and by-products, empty kerosene 200L drums, waste copper electrical wires, and steel and some insulating plastic from a building removal from Dumont D'Urville Station in the French Antarctic Territory to Collex Waste Management Pty Limited, 75 Mornington Road, Mornington, Tasmania 7018.

The waste would be disposed of by deposit into or onto land and by used oil re-refining or other reuses of previously used oil.

The waste will be packaged in bulk into drums, bags, composite packaging and pressure receptacles and loaded onto ship at Dumont D'Urville Station and off-loaded onto road transport at the Port of Hobart and disposed of in various ways including, under Australian Quarantine Services inspection, deep burial at the Hobart tip at McRobies Gully Landfill South Hobart, recycling of glass, cans and waste oils, and incineration of "high risk items" at the Hobart Marine Board incinerator by Collex Waste Management Pty Ltd.

The import would take place in four (4) shipments over twelve months commencing from the date of the permit, if granted.



 - (ii) in the case of a person to whom deferred benefits are not applicable - the person ceases to be an eligible employee;

on or after that date.

- (2) An expression used in subclause 5(1) that is defined in the Principal Determination has the same meaning for the purposes of that subclause as it has in that determination.

7. A majority of the membership of the Board of Directors of the building society shall comprise persons who are not associates of GIOPISL, where "associates" has the same meaning as in clause 4 of Schedule 1 to the *Financial Sector (Shareholdings) Act 1998*.
8. The building society will provide APRA with full disclosure of all activities of the building society, including loans, deposits, dividends, management fees and investments, in which AMP Limited ACN 079 354 or any of its subsidiaries is a party.
9. The total net exposure of the building society to AMP Limited and all of its subsidiaries (either as a borrower or a lender) is not to exceed five percent, or such other proportion approved by APRA, of the building society's capital base.
10. The building society, GIOPISL and GIO Australia Holdings Limited are to ensure that all Statements of Accounts remain on a common balance date basis.
11. Copies of the Annual Reports of the building society shall be available to members, on request, at all retail outlets of the building society.
12. The building society will comply with any additional reporting/disclosure requirements of APRA as advised from time to time.

13. There shall continue to be an appropriate spread of ownership and control of the ultimate parent company of the building society, being AMP Limited. To this end, GIOPISL shall inform APRA of any material change in the ownership of AMP Limited. A material change in ownership has occurred where:

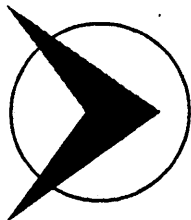

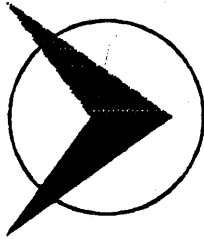

TEMPORARY ORDER

No 3 of 2000

I, FRANK MEERE, Managing Director of the Australian Fisheries Management Authority (AFMA) and a delegate of AFMA under section 43(8) of the *Fisheries Management Act 1991* (the Management Act), being satisfied that-

- (a) it is necessary to take action under section 43 of the Management Act as circumstances exist where urgent action is required for purposes related to the management of the Southern Bluefin Tuna (SBT) Fishery;
- (b) the action contemplated is consistent with AFMA's objectives; and
- (c) no other action is appropriate,

make the following orders under section 43 of the Management Act:

1. This Temporary Order is to take effect on 17 August 2000;
2. Under subsection 43(3) of the Management Act I cancel Temporary order No 1 of 2000 made by me on 31 May 2000;
3. For the purposes of this Order:

"Temporary Order Area" shall mean that part of the SBT Fishery area as defined in the Southern Bluefin Tuna Management Plan 1995 (the Management Plan) south of Latitude 34° South and east of Longitude 141° East and west of Longitude 160° East but excluding that part of the SBT Fishery area which is included in VMS Area A.

"VMS Area A" shall mean the area of waters bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of parallel of latitude 34° South with the meridian of longitude 151°45" East, then due west along the parallel to the point where it intersects the coast of New South Wales, then generally south along the coast to the point where the coast intersects the parallel of latitude 34° 30" South then due east along the parallel to the point where it intersects the meridian of longitude 151° 45" East then north along that meridian to the point of commencement.

"VMS Area B" shall mean the area of waters bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of parallel of latitude 33° South and the meridian of longitude 160° East then due

west along the parallel to the point where it intersects the meridian of longitude 152° 30" East then generally south westerly along the geodesic to the point of intersection of parallel of latitude 34° South and longitude 151°45" East then due east along the parallel to the point where it intersects the meridian of longitude 160° East then north along the meridian to the point of commencement.

4. During the period 17 August 2000 – 31 August 2000 a person who intends to fish by the method of pelagic longlining in the Temporary Order Area may not do so unless prior to leaving port for the trip the person is the holder, either as owner or lessee, or is acting on behalf of such a person, of statutory fishing rights (SFRs) granted under the Management Plan which have an aggregate live weight untaken value of not less than 500 kg and which have, in accordance with section 9 of the Management Plan, been assigned to a nominated boat.
5. During the period 1 September 2000 – 10 November 2000 a person who intends to fish by the method of pelagic longlining in the Temporary Order Area may not do so unless prior to leaving port for the trip the person is the holder, either as owner or lessee, or is acting on behalf of such a person, of statutory fishing rights (SFRs) granted under the Management Plan which have an aggregate live weight untaken value of not less than 250 kg and which have, in accordance with section 9 of the Management Plan, been assigned to a nominated boat.
6. A person who fishes in the SBT Fishery area by the method of pelagic longlining in the area of waters within the Temporary Order Area, VMS Area A or VMS Area B must during the entire period of this order, whether fishing or not, have on board the boat an operating Vessel Monitoring System (VMS) of either of the following types:
 - Trimble Navigation TNL7001 and TNL7005; or
 - Thrane and Thrane TT-3022D.
7. A person who intends to fish by the method of pelagic longlining in the SBT Fishery area and who wishes to transit the area of the SBT Fishery within the Temporary Order Area, VMS Area A, or VMS Area B during the period of this order and is not the holder either as owner or lessee, or is not acting on behalf of such a person, of statutory fishing rights (SFRs) granted under the Management Plan which have an aggregate live weight untaken value of:
 - during the period 17 August 2000 – 31 August 2000, not less than 500 kg; or
 - during the period 1 September 2000 – 10 November 2000, not less than 250 kg;

which have been assigned to a nominated boat in accordance with section 9 of the Management Plan, may do so only if:

- (i) if the person intends to transit any part of the area within the Temporary Order Area, VMS Area A and VMS Area B more than once during the period of this order, the boat has an operating VMS of a type referred to in paragraph 6 of this order; and

- (ii) the transit of the area described in this paragraph is by the most direct route; and
 - (iii) at least six hours notice is given to AFMA before leaving port for the purpose of transiting the area described in this paragraph by contacting AFMA on (02) 6272 5520 to advise transit details.
8. A person who intends to fish in the Temporary Order Area by methods other than pelagic longlining may do so only if any longline drum and longline beacons, with which the boat from which he intends to fish is equipped, are removed from the boat before leaving port. A person who can demonstrate a need to retain the longline drum as part of other activities or is unable to remove the drum may apply to AFMA in writing for an exemption from this requirement but may not fish until an exemption is granted.



SPECIFICATION UNDER SUBSECTION 18(2) AND CONDITIONS UNDER
SUBSECTION 18(3)

I, Michael Wooldridge, Minister for Health and Aged Care, under subsection 18(2) of the *Tobacco Advertising Prohibition Act 1992* (the Act), having regard to the guidelines in force under subsection 18(5) of the Act and being satisfied that the event mentioned below is of international significance and that failure to specify the event would be likely to result in the event not being held in Australia;

HEREBY:


- (a) specify the 2000 Qantas Australian Motorcycle Grand Prix to be held at Phillip Island from 27-29 October 2000 as a sporting event to be held in Australia;
- (b) specify, under subsection 18(3), the following as conditions to be complied with in relation to the publication of tobacco advertisements in connection with the event;
 - (i) the number of advertisements that may be published is limited to:
 - A. the advertisements required by, or otherwise pursuant to, international contracts or arrangements for the sponsorship of individual teams or riders being contracts or arrangements in force at the date of this instrument, but excluding advertisements displayed on the uniforms of promotional personnel, giveaways, simulators, simulator outlets, merchandise outlets and merchandise;
 - B. tobacco advertising worn by team personnel provided that the display of these advertisements is limited to those personnel with access to the area known as the GP paddock;
 - C. tobacco advertising on team equipment and banners provided that tobacco advertising is limited to the areas known as the GP paddock or pit lane; and
 - tobacco advertising is limited to the name of the team; and
 - any word on the team banners that is reasonably capable of being construed as a tobacco advertisement shall be in type no larger than the name of the team and not occupy a greater area than the name of the team;
 - D. ten Marlboro signs (8m x 1.2m)
one double sided Marlboro track bridge sign (24m x 2m each side)

- ii) in addition to the above mentioned clauses, the content of the advertisements that may be published is limited to:
- A. advertisements required by, or otherwise pursuant to, international contracts or arrangements for the sponsorship of individual teams/riders, being contracts or arrangements in force at the date of this instrument; and
 - B. all signs containing tobacco advertisements referred to in paragraph (b)(i) D above must include one of the health warnings set out in Column 2 of Schedule 1 of the Trade Practices (Consumer Product Information Standards) (Tobacco) Regulations. Each of the health warnings set out in Column 2 of Schedule 1 shall appear as nearly as possible on an equal number of signs. Each health warning must comply with the format set out in regulation 9 of the Regulations, and must occupy at least 25% of the total area of each sign.
- iii) the way in which the advertisements may be published, including promotional activities, is limited to the advertisements being confined to the venue of the event, namely Phillip Island, Victoria.

This specification comes into force on 20 October 2000 and remains in force until 1 November 2000 inclusive.

SPECIFICATION UNDER SUBSECTION 18(2)

I, Michael Wooldridge, Minister for Health and Aged Care, under subsection 18(2) of the *Tobacco Advertising Prohibition Act 1992* (the Act), having regard to the guidelines in force under subsection 18(5) of the Act and being satisfied that the event mentioned below is of international significance and that failure to specify the event would be likely to result in the event not being held in Australia, HEREBY:

(aa) REVOKE the previous notice made under this subsection in relation to the 2001 Qantas Australian Grand Prix and published in Commonwealth of Australia Special Gazette No. S 390, Wednesday, 12 July 2000;

(a) specify the 2001 Qantas Australian Grand Prix to be held at Albert Park in Melbourne on or about 1 - 4 March 2001, or such other dates as are specified in the Federation Internationale de l'Automobile (FIA) 2001 Formula One Calendar, as a sporting event to be held in Australia; and

(b) specify, under subsection 18(3), the following as conditions to be complied with in relation to the publication of tobacco advertisements in connection with the event:


- i. the number of tobacco advertisements that may be published is limited to:
 - A. the advertisements required by, or otherwise pursuant to, international contracts or arrangements for the sponsorship of individual teams and drivers, being contracts or arrangements in place at the commencement of the 2001 Formula One season but excluding advertisements displayed in the official program and on uniforms of promotional personnel, simulators, displays and giveaways; and
 - with respect to team personnel, the ability to display tobacco advertisements shall be limited to those personnel with access to the area known as the Formula One paddock.
 - B. 20 Marlboro signs (2m x 10m), one double sided Marlboro bridge sign (2m x 20m), and 5 Marlboro hangover signs (1m x 5m);
 - C. advertisements contained on merchandise produced in accordance with the requirements of or pursuant to international contracts or arrangements for the sponsorship of teams and drivers provided that all such merchandise includes the name of the Formula One Constructor; and
 - any wording on merchandise that can be construed as a tobacco advertisement shall occupy the same space and be in type no larger than the name of the constructor; and
 - there will be no tobacco advertising (other than that contained on the merchandising items) permitted at the retail outlets selling team/driver merchandise.

- D. tobacco advertisements displayed on exhibits (including no more than 8 tobacco sponsored cars) at the proposed Formula One Exhibition and on merchandise at retail outlets provided that health warnings as set out in Column 2 of Schedule 1 of the Trade Practices (Consumer Product Information Standards) (Tobacco) Regulations are prominently displayed:
- at the entry and exit to the proposed Formula One Exhibition and within each of the tobacco-sponsored team-based exhibits; and
 - at each of the retail outlets selling merchandise carrying tobacco advertisements.

Each health warning must comply with the format set out in regulation 9 of the Regulations.

- ii. in addition to the above mentioned clauses, the content of the advertisements that may be published is limited to:
- A. the content of the advertisements required by, or otherwise pursuant to, international contracts or arrangements for the sponsorship of individual teams and drivers, being contracts and arrangements in force at the commencement of the 2001 Formula One season; and
 - B. all signs referred to in paragraphs (b) (i) (B) above must include one of the health warnings set out in Column 2 of Schedule 1 of the Trade Practices (Consumer Product Information Standards) (Tobacco) Regulations. Each of the health warnings set out in Column 2 of Schedule 1 shall appear as nearly as possible on an equal number of signs. Each health warning must comply with the format set out in regulation 9 of the Regulations, must occupy at least 25% of the total area of each sign and must be located so there is no impairment of their visibility. This may require placement of the health warning at the top of the sign.
- iii. the way in which the advertisements may be published is limited to the advertisements, including promotional activities, being confined to the venue of the Event, namely Albert Park, Victoria.

This specification comes into force on the date being six calendar days before the first day of the event as specified in the FIA calendar and ends on the date being three days after the last day of the event as specified in the FIA calendar.
