The Presiding Member of the Geographical Indications Committee of the Australian Wine and Brandy Corporation wishes to advise that the following FINAL DETERMINATIONS of Australian Geographical Indications have been made as set out in this notice.

This notice is issued in conformity with Section 40X of the Australian Wine and Brandy Corporation Act 1980, the Geographical Indications Committee having determined that Currency Creek may reasonably be regarded as a region and Nagambie Lakes may reasonably be regarded as a subregion.

Subject to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal Act 1975, application may be made, by or on behalf of any person whose interests are affected by any of these determination, to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal for the review of the determination. Unless subsection 28(4) of that Act applies, applications may be made in accordance with section 28 of that Act by or on behalf of that person for a statement in writing setting out the findings on material questions of fact, referring to the evidence or any other material on which these findings are based and reasons for the determination. Applications to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal (AAT) for review of a Final Determination of the Geographical Indications Committee must be made within 28 days after the date of publication of this notice.

The import will take place in eighteen (18) shipments between 29 January 2001 and 31 December 2001.



Section 1

1 Name of Order

This Order is the *Australian Meat and Live-stock Industry (Live Sheep Exports to Saudi Arabia) Order 2001*.

2 Commencement

This Order commences on gazettal.

3 Revocation of Australian Meat and Live-stock Industry (Live Sheep Exports to Saudi Arabia) Order 1999

The *Australian Meat and Live-stock Industry (Live Sheep Exports to Saudi Arabia) Order 1999* is revoked.

4 Object

The object of this Order is to enable a commercial live sheep export trade with Saudi Arabia on a regulated basis.

5 Interpretation

In this Order:

AQIS means the Australian Quarantine and Inspection Service.

exporter means a person who exports live Australian sheep to Saudi Arabia.

LiveCorp means the Australian Livestock Export Corporation Ltd.

Saudi Arabia means the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

SLEPP means the Saudi Live Export Preparation Program Industry Standards published by AUS-MEAT Limited on 29 January 2001.

6 Control of export of live sheep to Saudi Arabia

- (1) An exporter may export live Australian sheep to Saudi Arabia only if the exporter:
 - (a) holds a live-stock export licence under section 10 of the *Australian Meat and Live-stock Industry Act 1997*; and
 - (b) either:
 - (i) is accredited by LiveCorp to export live Australian sheep to Saudi Arabia; or

Section 8

- (ii) has written approval from LiveCorp to export the sheep to Saudi Arabia.
- (2) For subclause (1), **export** includes:
 - (a) exporting or causing to be exported (whether directly or indirectly); and
 - (b) assisting in, or in any way knowingly being a party to or being concerned with, the importation of live Australian sheep into Saudi Arabia.

7 Export requirements for live sheep to Saudi Arabia

- (1) If an exporter intends to export live Australian sheep to Saudi Arabia, the exporter must lodge with AQIS and LiveCorp a notice of intention to export, under section 6 of the Export Control (Animals) Orders:
 - (a) if the exporter is accredited by LiveCorp to export live Australian sheep to Saudi Arabia — at least 14 days before the anticipated date of export; or
 - (b) otherwise — at least 28 days before the anticipated date of export.
- (2) The exporter must comply with:
 - (a) SLEPP; and
 - (b) the mandatory animal welfare standards set out in the Australian Livestock Export Standards, published by LiveCorp in December 1999.
- (3) The exporter must ensure that, before the ship carrying the sheep arrives in Saudi Arabia:
 - (a) a certificate of origin for all of the sheep has been issued by the Australian Chamber of Commerce and Industry; and
 - (b) a health certificate for all of the sheep has been issued by AQIS; and
 - (c) the Saudi Arabian embassy in Australia has endorsed the certificates mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b).
- (4) LiveCorp must tell AQIS if LiveCorp becomes aware:
 - (a) that the exporter has not complied with SLEPP; or
 - (b) of any other matter that might result in non-compliance with SLEPP.

8 Alternative management of scabby mouth

- (1) The Secretary of the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry may give LiveCorp written approval for an exporter to undertake research trials for the management of scabby mouth (contagious pustular dermatitis) for up to 2% of the sheep in a consignment.
- (2) The exporter is taken to comply with SLEPP to the extent that it deals with the management of scabby mouth if the exporter complies with any conditions of the approval.

**NOTICE OF PROPOSED DECLARATION OF HEARD ISLAND AND
MCDONALD ISLANDS MARINE RESERVE**

1. A report is to be submitted under subsection 351(1) of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (the Act) in relation to the making of a Proclamation by the Governor-General under subsection 344(1) of the Act to declare a Commonwealth reserve.
2. The proposed Proclamation will:
 - a) declare the areas of land and sea in the south Indian Ocean as described in the Schedule to this notice (which will be taken to include the waters and seabed under the sea) to be a Commonwealth reserve for the purposes of protecting the conservation values of Heard Island and McDonald Islands and the adjacent unique and vulnerable marine ecosystems;
 - b) state the seabed and subsoil of the land and seabed, to a depth of 1,000 metres, is included in the reserve;
 - c) give the reserve the name "Heard Island and McDonald Islands Marine Reserve"; and
 - d) assign the reserve to the IUCN category of strict nature reserve.
3. The reserve is intended to be managed and used primarily for scientific research and environmental monitoring, and other purposes that are consistent with the Australian IUCN reserve management principles prescribed by the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Regulations 2000* for the IUCN category of strict nature reserve.

Proposed Heard Island and McDonald Islands Marine Reserve

All of those areas of land and sea in the south Indian Ocean contained within and bounded as follows:

(a) the area bounded by the line:

- (i) commencing at the point of intersection of the meridian of 70 degrees 40 minutes of east longitude and the treaty line defined by Article 2 of the Maritime Delimitation Treaty agreed between the Government of Australia and the Government of the French Republic in January 1982 (the Treaty boundary);
- (ii) then along the geodesic in generally a south easterly direction to the point 72 degrees 14 minutes 30 seconds east longitude 53 degrees 03 minutes south latitude;
- (iii) then south along the meridian of 72 degrees 14 minutes 30 seconds east longitude to its intersection with parallel 53 degrees 30 minutes south latitude;
- (iv) then east along the parallel 53 degrees 30 minutes south latitude to its intersection with the meridian of 74 degrees 12 minutes east longitude;
- (v) then north along the meridian to the point 74 degrees 12 minutes east longitude 52 degrees 04 minutes south latitude;
- (vi) then along the geodesic in a generally north westerly direction to the point of intersection between the meridian of 73 degrees 17 minutes east longitude with the Treaty boundary;
- (vii) then in a general south westerly direction along the Treaty boundary to its intersection with the meridian of 72 degrees 17 minutes east longitude;
- (viii) then along the geodesic in a general south easterly direction to the point 73 degrees 20 minutes east longitude 52 degrees 08 minutes south latitude;
- (ix) then south along the meridian of 73 degrees 20 minutes east longitude to its intersection with the northern limit of Heard Island Territorial Sea;
- (x) then in a generally westerly direction along the northern limits of Heard Island and McDonald Island Territorial Sea to its intersection with the meridian of 72 degrees 48 minutes east longitude;
- (xi) then along the geodesic in a generally north westerly direction to the point of intersection of the meridian of 71 degrees 10 minutes east longitude with the Treaty boundary; and
- (xii) then in a generally south westerly direction along the Treaty boundary to the point of commencement.

(b) the area bounded by the line

- (i) commencing at the point 75 degrees 35 minutes east longitude, 51 degrees 55 minutes south latitude;
- (ii) then proceeding east along the 51 degree 55 minute south parallel of latitude to its intersection with the outer limit of the Heard Island Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ**) boundary;
- (iii) then proceeding in a generally north westerly direction along the EEZ boundary to its intersection with the Treaty boundary;
- (iv) then in a generally south westerly direction along the Treaty boundary to its intersection with the meridian of 74 degrees 25 minutes longitude; and
- (v) then along the geodesic in a generally south easterly direction to the point of commencement.

* All geographic coordinates are expressed in terms of the World Geodetic System 1984 ("WGS84").

** The "EEZ" is the Exclusive Economic Zone declared in relation to Australia and its external territories under the *Seas and Submerged Lands Act 1973* (proclamation dated 26 July 1994 published in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* No. S290 on 29 July 1994). It commences at the outer limit of the territorial sea (12 nautical miles from the territorial sea baselines established under the *Seas and Submerged Lands Act 1973*) and extends generally to 200 nautical miles from the baselines. In relation to Heard Island and McDonald Islands it is in part less than 200 nautical miles to take account of the treaty line defined by Article 2 of the Maritime Delimitation Treaty agreed between the Government of Australia and the Government of the French Republic in January 1982 (entry into force 10 January 1983).
