FISHERIES MANAGEMENT REGULATIONS LOGBOOK NOTICE NO. CSL 02 LOGBOOKS FOR THE CORAL SEA FISHERY

I, Frank McFarlane Meere, delegate of the Australian Fisheries Management Authority, make the following determination under subregulations 32 (1) and (3) of the Fisheries Management Regulations.

Citation

This determination may be cited as Logbook Notice No. CSL 02.

Commencement

2. This determination commences 14 days after the day on which, or the later of the days on which, this determination is published in the Gazette and each fishing concession holder in the Coral Sea Fishery is notified by post of the making of the determination in accordance with subregulations 32(5) and 32(6) of the Fisheries Management Regulations.

Interpretation

3. In this determination:

"Commonwealth boat" means an Australian boat nominated on a fishing permit which is granted under section 32 of the *Fisheries Management Act 1991* and which allows fishing in the Coral Sea Fishery;

"distinguishing mark" in relation to a form of logbook, means the marking by which the logbook can be distinguished from AFMA's other forms of logbook;

"CS01 Log" means the form of logbook published by AFMA in December 1999, for which:

- (i) the title is "Coral Sea Line, Trawl & Collector Daily Confidential Fishing Log"; and
- (ii) the distinguishing mark is "CS01";

Logbook Notice No. CSL 02

"CS2A Catch Disposal Record" means the form of logbook published by AFMA in December 1999, for which:

- (i) the title is "Coral Sea Catch Disposal Record"; and
- (ii) the distinguishing mark is "CS2A"; and
- (iii) written instructions for completion dated 29 September 2000 were provided by AFMA to holders of Coral Sea Fishery permits that allow the take of bech-de-mer.

[Note: Terms defined in the Fisheries Management Act 1991 and the Fisheries Management Regulations have the same meanings in this determination.]

Which logbooks must be used?

- 4.1 When any kind of fish, excluding fish taken for the aquarium fish trade, is taken by trawling, line fishing or collecting using a Commonwealth boat in the Coral Sea Fishery, the CS01 must be used to record information about the taking of the fish.
- 4.2 When beche-de-mer are taken by any method in the Coral Sea Fishery, the CS2A Catch Disposal Record must be used to record information about the sale or disposal of the fish in accordance with the written instructions for completion provided by AFMA.

When must the logbooks be used?

5. Subregulations 33(1), 33(2) and 33(3) of the Fisheries Management Regulations apply in respect of the CS01 Log and the CS2A Catch Disposal Record from the commencement of this determination until 31 January 2004.

Where can copies of the logbooks be obtained?

6. Copies of the CS01 Log and the CS2A Catch Disposal Record can be obtained during ordinary business hours from the Australian Fisheries Management Authority, John Curtin House, 22 Brisbane Avenue BARTON ACT, 2600.

I, GREGORY ROBERT READ, an officer of the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry ('the Department') authorised in writing by the Minister for Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry for the purposes of Part 3 of Schedule 5 of the Australian Meat and Livestock Industry (Repeals and Consequential Provisions) Act 1997 ('the Act'), hereby direct, pursuant to item 12(1) of Schedule 5 of the Act, that the conditions attaching to the amount of \$2,442,903 ('the Original Amount') paid to Meat and Livestock Australia Limited ACN 081 678 364 (MLA') pursuant to the Direction under item 12(1) of Schedule 5 of the Act dated 11 February 1999 (the 'Original Direction') are varied to give effect to the following:

- 1. The amount of \$1,297,000 ('the Amount') being that part of the amount of \$2,442.903 paid to MLA pursuant to the Original Direction not reasonably required by MLA to meet the liabilities referred to in paragraph 2 of the Original Direction, be paid to MLA Donor Company Limited ABN 083 304 867.
- The Amount is to be used and expended for the development by MLA of the National Livestock Identification Scheme ('NLIS') database.
- For the purpose of paragraph 2 above, development of the NLIS database shall include only those activities identified in the NLIS business plan related to database research and development and shall not include the purchase or installation of radio frequency machine readers or the purchase of radio frequency tags.
- 4. Paragraph 4 of the Original Direction is revoked.

OBJECTIVE

The objectives of the National Standard for the Storage and Handling of Workplace Dangerous Goods [NOHSC:1015(2001)] are to protect the safety and health of persons and to prevent damage to property and the environment from the hazards arising from the storage and handling of dangerous goods and combustible liquids in the workplace.

The provisions of this national standard focus on the workplace only. Duties have been placed on relevant persons with responsibilities in relation to dangerous goods used in a workplace. The national standard does not cover the storage and handling of dangerous goods in a non-workplace - which is addressed under the relevant dangerous goods legislation of the Commonwealth, State and Territory governments.

The national standard establishes performance outcomes and allows industry the maximum practicable flexibility in achieving those outcomes.

The National Code of Practice for the Storage and Handling of Workplace Dangerous Goods [NOHSC:2017(2001)] provides guidance on how to comply with the provisions set out in the national standard. The national code of practice is intended to assist industry understand their responsibilities, and allows for alternative approaches to achieving compliance.

In accordance with the requirements of section 38(4), NOHSC is inviting public comment on the proposed inclusion of Chrysotile on Schedule 2, "Substances Prohibited for Specified Uses", of the *National Model Regulations for the Control of Workplace Hazardous Substances* in order to canvass the widest possible range of views in the community. When NOHSC has considered public comment, it will prepare a final recommendation on the inclusion of Chrysotile asbestos on Schedule 2.

- 1) Export is limited to dead specimens obtained by J & S Hasenpusch (trading as Australian Insect Farm) from their private property in the Parish of Glady, north Queensland, and is restricted to specimens from the following families: Buprestidae, Scarabaeidae Rutelinae, Scarabaeidae Cetoniinae, Scarabaeidae Melolonthinae, Dytiscidae, Cerambycidae, Curculonidae, Brentidae, Callirhipidae, Rhipiphoridae, Carabidae, Tenebrionidae, Elateridae, Staphylinidae, Silphidae, Dynastinae, Lucanidae, Cicindelidae, Passalidae, Pyrgomorphidae, Tettigoniidae, Anthelidae, Saturniidae, Noctuidae, Uraniidae, Geometridae, Sphingidae, Hepialidae, Cossidae, Arctiidae, Aganaidae, Notodontidae, Petaluridae, Libellulidae, Gomphidae, Amphipterygidae, Mantidae, Anthophoridae, Chrysididae, Pormicidae, Platystomatidae, Tessaratomidae, Belostomatidae, Scorpionidae, Camaenidae. Species and quantities in accordance with the application as approved by Environment Australia.
- 2. For every specimen of *Petalura ingentissima* exported, one specimen of the species is to be deposited with the Australian National Insect Collection or the Queensland Museum, up to a maximum of three specimens per institution.
- Reports are to be provided annually to Environment Australia on the numbers of specimens of Petalura
 ingentissima collected, and all sight records of the species on the property.
- 4. 10% of specimens (up to a maximum of 5 per species), collected for export, of Gigadema longipenne, Cryptodus obscurus, Eophileurus dentatus, Aegus jansoni, , Ischiopsopha yorkiana, Dilocrosis balteata, Stenopisthes frenchi, Poecilopharis emilla, Schizorhina atropunctata, Cyphogastra venerea, Iridiotaenia bellicosa, Cyriodes sexspilota, Castiarina venusta, Castiarina fusca, Castiarina octosignata, Polystigma octopunctatum, Hydaticus parellus, Aesa media, Demonassa capitalis, Platyomopsis nigrovirens, Cyocyphax praonethoides, Olenecamptus bilobus, Disterna mastersi, Acalolepta acanthias, Platycranium pustulosum, Leptopius maleficus, Leptopius brachystylus, Aporhina australis, Ectocnemus decemmaculatus, Hormocerus reticulatus, Ithystenus hollandiae, Steganomma porcatum, Loxogenius opacipennis, Anthela spp., Phyllodes imperialis, Lyssa macleayi, Macroglossum insipida, Macroglossum tenebrosa, Daphnis protrudens, Aenetus mirabilis, Endoxyla mackeri and Anthophiloptera dryas are to be deposited with the Australian National Insect Collection.

PR-147: Control small scale limited field trial of transposon marked derivatives of Pseudomonas (bacteria) on wheat roots in soil

Organisation proposing release: **Australian National University**

Canberra ACT 0200

Organism to be released: Pseudomonas fluorescens sp., strain AN5

Purpose of the release: Take-all disease affects the roots of plants such as wheat. Currently there are no control methods for this disease and biological control methods using bacteria such as Pseudomanas are the subject of intensive research worldwide.

In this field trial genetically modifed strains of Pseudomonas bacteria will be evaluated for their ability to protect wheat plants against the fungal disease takeall. A total of 13 different Pseudomonas strains will be evaluated in this trial.

Brief description of the nature and effect of the genetic modification: Bacteria of Pseudomanas fluorescens sp., strain AN5 have been modified by the insertion of Tn5-derived transposons. The transposons contain marker genes which confer resistance to the antibiotics kanamycin and neomycin; and to tetracycline, respectively. An additional marker gene coding for the enzyme β-glucuronidase (GUS) has also been introduced to some of the strains.

Location and size of trial: The bacteria will be applied to a maximum of 3 million of wheat seeds which will be planted in an area approximately 0.75 hectare within a 2.46 hectare compound, at a site near Galong, NSW. A maximum of 10²⁰ genetically modified bacteria will be released in this trial.

PR-148: Biological control small scale limited field trial of partial diploid constructions of Pseudomonas bacteria on wheat roots in soil

Organisation proposing release: **Australian National University** Canberra ACT 0200

Organism to be released: Pseudomonas fluorescens sp., strain AN5

Purpose of the release: Take-all disease affects the roots of plants such as wheat. Currently there are no control methods for this disease and biological control methods using bacteria such as *Pseudomanas* are the subject of intensive research worldwide.

In this field trial genetically modifed strains of *Pseudomonas* bacteria will be evaluated for their ability to protect wheat plants against the fungal disease takeall by measuring wheat yield. The colonisation ability and stability on wheat roots in soil will also be tested. A total of 18 different *Pseudomonas* strains will be evaluated in this trial.

Brief description of the nature and effect of the genetic modification:
Bacteria of *Pseudomonas flourescens* sp., strain AN5 have been modified to produce partial diploid strains that contain extra copies of genes already present in this organism. The extra gene copies have been introduced on extrachromosomal plasmid constructs. These constructs confer altered characteristics of protection against the take-all fungus of wheat.

Selectable marker genes have also also introduced to these strains, conferring resistance to the antibiotics kanamycin and neomycin; and to tetracycline, respectively.

Location and size of trial: The bacteria will be applied to a maximum of 3 million of wheat seeds which will be planted in an area approximately 0.75 hectare within a 2.46 hectare compound, at a site near Galong, NSW. A maximum of 10²⁰ genetically modified bacteria will be released in this trial.

PR-149: Biological control of partial diploid constructions of *Pseudomonas* bacteria on wheat roots in soil

Organisation proposing release: Australian National University

Organism to be released: Pseudomonas fluorescens

Purpose of the release: Take-all disease affects the roots of plants such as wheat. Currently there are no control methods for this disease and biological control methods using bacteria such as *Pseudomanas* are the subject of intensive research worldwide.

In this field trial genetically modifed strains of *Pseudomonas* bacteria will be evaluated for their ability to protect wheat plants against the fungal disease takeall. A total of 18 different *Pseudomonas* strains will be evaluated in this trial.

Brief description of the nature and effect of the genetic modification:
Bacteria of *Pseudomonas flourescens* sp., strain AN5 have been modified to produce partial diploid strains that contain extra copies of genes already present in this organism. The extra gene copies have been introduced on extrachromosomal plasmid constructs. These constructs confer altered characteristics of protection against the take-all fungus of wheat.

Selectable marker genes have also also introduced to these strains, conferring resistance to the antibiotics kanamycin and neomycin; and to tetracycline, respectively.

Location and size of trial: The bacteria will be applied to a maximum of 3000 of wheat seeds which will be planted in an area approximately 3 m² at Acton, ACT. A maximum of 10¹² genetically modified bacteria will be released in this trial.

PR-150: Competitive ability and growth characteristics of transgenic Trifolium subterraneum subsp. subterraneum cv. Leura expressing sunflower seed albumin

This trial will address whether the transgenic clover has any increased competitive ability that would allow it to invade or persist in natural grassland ecosystems.

Brief description of the nature and effect of the genetic modification:

Three genes have been inserted into a commercial cultivar of subterranean clover. Two of the genes encode a protein, sunflower seed albumin, which is rich in sulfur-containing amino acids, and is resistant to breakdown in the rumen of

sheep. It is expected that this protein will improve the nutritional quality of subterranean clover, and increase wool growth in sheep and ruminant live weight gains.

The third gene is a selectable marker gene conferring resistance to the antibiotics kanamycin and neomycin.

Location and size of trial: A total of 20,000 plants in 25m X 25m plot located within a 1 hectare containment area at the Ginninderra Experiment Station, ACT.

PR-131X(3): Seed increase of transgenic cotton expressing Cry1A(c) and Cry2A(b)

Organism to be released: Cotton (Gossypium hirsutum)

Purpose of extension to the release: The aim of this extension is to evaluate insect-resistant transgenic cotton and to produce commercial quantities of seed for further evaluation prior to general release. The use of insect-resistant cotton has the potential to reduce the use of chemical pesticides on cotton crops and to extend the useful life of the previously released INGARD® cotton that contains only a single insecticidal gene, Cry1A(c).

Brief description of the nature and effect of the genetic modification: The transgenic cotton plant express two delta endotoxin genes Cry1A(c) and Cry2A(b) derived from the bacterium *Bacillus thuringiensis*. The insecticidal proteins produced by these genes protect the plant from major caterpillar pests such as the cotton bollworm. The presence of more than one insecticidal gene in a single plant may give better insect control and reduce the potential for the insect pests to become resistant to the toxins.

The plants also contain a marker gene coding for the enzyme β -glucuronidase (GUS) which enables visual identification of plant tissues in which the gene is being expressed and a selectable marker gene conferring resistance to the antibiotics kanamycin and neomycin.




