TEXTUAL DESCRIPTION

The Geographical Indication "Peel" is located within the State of Western Australia, Australia.

The beginning point of the boundary is located in the north western corner of the region on Map Pinjarra (Sheet SI 50-2) at grid reference LK785175, being the high water mark on the Indian Ocean at Becher Point near Port Kennedy, then proceeds easterly in a straight line to the point on the Mandurah Road at grid reference LK850175, then proceeds northerly along Mandurah Road to its intersection with an unnamed road at grid reference LK865270, then proceeds north easterly along the unnamed road to its intersection with another unnamed road at grid reference LK895280, then proceeds easterly along this unnamed road to its intersection with Kwinana Freeway at grid reference LK910280, then proceeds generally northerly along Kwinana Freeway to its intersection with an unnamed road at grid reference LK915330, then proceeds north easterly along the unnamed road to its intersection with the South Western Highway just north of the township of Byford at grid reference MK065365, then proceeds easterly in a straight line to the 100 metre contour at grid reference MK075365, this being the commencement of the common boundary with the Perth Hills region, then proceeds generally southerly following the Perth Hills boundary along the 100 metre contour crossing Beenypup Brook at grid reference MK080335, then proceeds generally southerly along the 100 metre contour to grid reference MK052036 (latitude 32° 30' 00"), then proceeds easterly along latitude 32° 30' 00" to grid reference MK303039 where the common boundary with the Perth Hills region ceases, then continues easterly along latitude 32° 30' 00" to a point on an unnamed road at grid reference MK845040, then proceeds south easterly along the unnamed road to its intersection with another unnamed road near Dattening at grid reference MJ880998, then proceeds south easterly along this unnamed road to Dunkernucking at grid reference MJ920950, then proceeds southerly along the unnamed road crossing the Hotham River at Pumphreys Bridge

at grid reference MJ907860, then proceeds southerly along the same unnamed road to its intersection with another unnamed road near Congelin at grid reference MJ885670, then proceeds southerly along the other unnamed road to the edge of the map at grid reference MJ870490 (latitude 33° 00' 00"); On to Map Collie (Sheet SI 50-6) at grid reference MJ870490, then proceeds southerly along the unnamed road to its intersection with Albany Highway at grid reference MJ870480, then proceeds south easterly along Albany Highway to its intersection with the Pinjarra-Williams Road just west of the township of Williams at grid reference MJ885450, then proceeds south westerly and then westerly along Pinjarra-Williams Road to its intersection with the Williams-Collie Road at grid reference MJ730370, then proceeds south westerly along the Williams-Collie Road until its intersection with an unnamed road near Lynford at grid reference MJ640295, then proceeds west north westerly in a straight line to the intersection of two unnamed roads near Tallanalla at grid reference MJ178360, this being the commencement of a common boundary with the Geographe region, then proceeds north north westerly along an unnamed road to the edge of the map near Hoffinans Mill at grid reference MJ144483; On to Map Pinjarra (Sheet SI 50-2) at grid reference MJ144483, then proceeds north westerly along the same unnamed road to its intersection with an unnamed vehicular track at grid reference MJ093528, then proceeds westerly along the unnamed road to its intersection with South Western Highway just north of the township of Yarloop at grid reference LJ978538, then proceeds southerly along South Western Highway to its intersection with an unnamed road at grid reference LJ980532, then proceeds generally westerly and the north westerly and then westerly along the unnamed road to its intersection with Old Coast Road at grid reference LJ800568, then proceeds north westerly and westerly along the unnamed road to the high water mark of the Indian Ocean at Preston Beach near Yalgorup at grid reference LJ735608, where the common boundary with the Geographe region ceases, then proceeds generally northerly along the coastline to grid



NOTICE OF THE PRIMARY UNIVERSAL SERVICE PROVIDER FOR THE EXTENDED ZONES OF AUSTRALIA


On 1 June 2001 the Commonwealth and Telstra Corporation Limited (ABN 33 051 775 556) entered into a written agreement under section 57 of the *Telstra Corporation Act 1991* that is expressed to have effect for the purpose of subsection 12E(1) of the *Telecommunications (Consumer Protection and Service Standards) Act 1999* (the Act). Notice is hereby given pursuant to subsection 12E(6) of the Act that as specified in this written agreement, from 31 July 2001 Telstra Corporation Limited is the primary universal service provider for the universal service area of the Extended Zones, in respect of the following service obligations:

- (a) the obligation referred to in paragraph 9(1)(a) of the Act (dealing with standard telephone services);
- (b) the obligation referred to in paragraph 9(1)(b) of the Act (dealing with payphones); and
- (c) the obligation referred to in paragraph 9(1)(c) of the Act (dealing with prescribed carriage services).

For the purpose of this notice, Extended Zones has the same meaning as given in the written agreement referred to above.

Note On 1 June 2001 the Commonwealth and Telstra entered into a written agreement under section 57 of the *Telstra Corporation Act 1991* that is expressed to have effect for the purpose of subsection 12E(1) of the Act. By virtue of this agreement, paragraph 12E(2)(a) of the Act deems the Minister for Communications, Information Technology and the Arts to have determined under Section 9G of the Act that the Extended Zones are a universal service area for the purposes of the service obligations outlined above. Also by virtue of this agreement, paragraph 12E(2)(b) of the Act deems the Minister to have determined under Section 12A of the Act that Telstra is the primary universal service provider for the universal service area of the Extended Zones in respect of the service obligations outlined above.

By virtue of subsection 12EA(1) of the Act, the Minister must not determine any other person to be the primary universal service provider for the Extended Zones in respect of the service obligations outlined above. Subsection 12EA(1) of the Act also provides that the Australian Communications Authority must not approve any other person as a competing universal service provider for the Extended Zones in respect of the service obligations outlined above. 





Complaints about non-mainstream media advertisements must be directed to the appropriate Industry Association, i.e. CHC for complementary medicines and ASMI for non-complementary OTC medicines.
