NOTIFICATION UNDER 92J(6) OF THE *BROADCASTING SERVICES ACT 1992*

On 30 March 2001 the Australian Broadcasting Authority (ABA) varied under section 92J(1)(c) the licence period of temporary community broadcasting licence, SL1170284, to be 1 March 2001 to 31 May 2001. The ABA also varied the timing conditions of temporary community broadcasting licence, SL1170284, to authorise the licensee to broadcast 9.00am to 9.00 pm each day and any additional 2 hour period per day on exchange from Fresh Broadcasters Inc. for the period of the licence. “The licensee must ensure the service remains a local coverage radio broadcasting service by:

- 1) marketing and promoting the service as a Campbelltown area radio service;
- 2) using the term ‘Campbelltown area’ in all on-air promotions for the service and in all publicity and sales material for the service;
- 3) not marketing or promoting the service, either on-air or in publicity or sales material, as a service targeting an area outside its designated licence area; and
- 4) broadcasting programming intended for and targeted at the audience of the Campbelltown area.

Pursuant to section 43(2)(b), the licensee is given until 20 July 2001 to make representations to the ABA regarding the new licence conditions. (File 2000/0426)

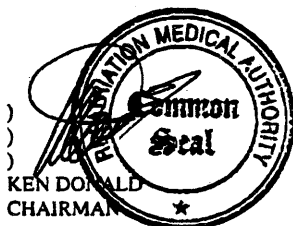

Pursuant to Section 33 of the *Hazardous Waste (Regulation of Exports and Imports) Act 1989*, notice is given that an application has been received from Tredi Australia Pty Ltd, 221 Darlinghurst Road, Darlinghurst, Sydney, New South Wales 2010, to export up to 150,000 kgs of nickel-cadmium batteries to SNAM Viviez, BP4 Avenue Jean Jaures, 12110 Viviez, France.

The waste would be disposed of by recycling/reclamation of metals and metal compounds.

The waste would be packed in plastic lined wood crates in separate layers, wrapped in plastic and loaded into containers to be transported by road and loaded onto ships at the Ports of Sydney and Melbourne, Australia to be offloaded at the Port of Roubaix, France. From there, it would be transported by train to the disposal facility.

The waste would transit South Africa and Belgium.

The export would take place in six (6) shipments commencing from the date of the permit, if granted.

AMENDMENT OF THE NATIONAL CAPITAL PLAN

Draft Amendment 41 (Gungahlin Drive Extension)

The National Capital Authority has prepared Draft Amendment 41 of the National Capital Plan. In accordance with sections 15(1) and 24 of the *Australian Capital Territory (Planning and Land Management) Act 1988*, Draft Amendment 41 is now available for public inspection and comment.

The National Capital Plan currently shows a "proposed" arterial road to be constructed between Barton Highway and Belconnen Way along the eastern edge of Belconnen District. This route included a proposed connection across O'Connor Ridge to Barry Drive. The "proposed" arterial road was previously known as John Dedman Parkway but it is now known as the Gungahlin Drive Extension.

Following an investigation by the Territory Government of route options for this road, the option to the east of the Australian Institute of Sport has been confirmed as the preferred route. The preferred route is not inconsistent with the indicative route of the "proposed" arterial road shown in the National Capital Plan. The Authority has prepared Draft Amendment 41 to the National Capital Plan to remove the "proposed" status of Gungahlin Drive Extension and to confirm its alignment. The Draft Amendment also proposes to delete the connection across O'Connor Ridge to Barry Drive.



Payers are therefore not required to provide passbook savings account holders with a payment summary where they have withheld amounts from payments in accordance with Division 12-E and 12-F, unless specifically requested to do so.

Effective for payment summaries required to be issued for the years ending 30 June 2001 and 30 June 2002

This exemption applies to payment summaries required to be issued for the 2000/01 and 2001/02 financial years.




DECLARATION AND DETERMINATION UNDER THE AUSTRALIAN ACTIVE SERVICE MEDAL REGULATIONS

I, **PETER JOHN HOLLINGWORTH**, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, pursuant to the Australian Active Service Medal Regulations contained in the Schedule to the Letters Patent dated 13 September 1988 ("the Regulations") on the recommendation of the Minister for Defence, hereby:

- (a) **revoke**, the Declaration and Determination made on 3 July 1989 under regulation 3 and subregulation 4(2) respectively of the Australian Service Medal Regulations contained in the Schedule to the Letters Patent dated 13 September 1988 for the Clasp 'NAMIBIA';
- (b) **declare**, under regulation 3 of the Regulations, warlike operations in which members of the Australian Defence Force were engaged, with the United Nations Transition Assistance Group activities in Namibia during the period that commenced on 18 February 1989 and ended on 10 April 1990 to be a *prescribed operation* for the purposes of the Regulations; and
- (c) **determine**, under subregulation 4(2) of the Regulations, that the conditions for award of the Australian Active Service Medal with Clasp 'NAMIBIA' ("the Medal") for the *prescribed operation* are:
 - (i) the Medal may be awarded to a member of the Australian Defence Force who rendered service as such a member while allotted and posted as a member of the Australian element for duty to the *prescribed operation*;
 - (ii) the Medal may be awarded to a member of the Australian Defence Force who rendered service as such a member as part of the contribution of a foreign Defence Force to the *prescribed operation* while on secondment or exchange with the foreign Defence Force;

- (iii) the Medal may be awarded to a member of the Australian Defence Force who rendered service as such a member for a period of 30 days, or for periods amounting in the aggregate to 30 days, for official visits, inspections or other occurrences of a temporary nature in connection with the military contribution in the *prescribed operation*;
- (iv) the Medal may be awarded to a person who rendered service as part of the Australian element of the *prescribed operation* for a *prescribed period* and who, in accordance with a determination made by the Minister under paragraph 4(4)(b) of the Regulations, is in a class of persons who may be awarded the Medal.
