

**EXPLANATORY STATEMENT
DETERMINATION ISSUED UNDER SECTION 11B(1)(d)
OF THE PRIVACY ACT 1988
(CREDIT PROVIDER DETERMINATION 2001 No. 1)**

1. Attached is a determination issued under section 11B(1)(d) with the effect that, for the purposes of the Privacy Act, the Torres Strait Regional Authority (TSRA) is a 'credit provider'.
2. Under section 11B(4) of the Privacy Act, the determination is a disallowable instrument for the purposes of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1901*.

BACKGROUND:

3. Section 11B (1) (d) of the *Privacy Act 1988* provides:

For the purposes of this Act... a person is a credit provider if the person is...

(d) an agency that:

- (i) carries on a business or undertaking that involves the making of loans; and
- (ii) is determined by the Commissioner to be a credit provider for the purposes of this Act.

4. In 2001, TSRA applied for a determination under section 11B(1)(d) of the *Privacy Act 1988*.
5. TSRA advised in its application that it meets the criteria contained in s.11B(1)(d)(i) for the following reasons:
 - it has a statutory function of making loans under the *Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Commission Act 1989* (the "ATSIC Act");
 - making loans is a core part of TSRA's business; and
 - it makes loans on a basis that equates with the 'normal commercial practice' of other credit providers.
6. TSRA considers that being a credit provider would greatly improve the efficiency of its loan assessment procedures as it would be able to obtain credit reports directly from a credit reporting agency. There is currently a delay of up to six weeks in obtaining copies of applicants' credit reports, as clients have to obtain their own reports and then provide them to TSRA. TSRA is also concerned that in some cases, clients may neglect to provide certain identifying information to the credit reporting agency which may result in an inaccurate report.
7. This also means that there is no record of loan applications made to TSRA by individuals recorded on their credit reports. This can mean that other credit providers are disadvantaged, as they have no indication of the financial relationships between TSRA and the individuals. This could also work to the detriment of individuals, as it may allow them to become more burdened by debt, to the point of possibly losing their home or business as a result.


8. With the permission of TSRA, I, as the Federal Privacy Commissioner, consulted with relevant local consumer and industry agencies.

FINDINGS

- 9 Given the responses to the issues raised concerning the Determination, I find that TSRA does satisfy the criteria set out in section 11B(1)(d)(i) of the *Privacy Act 1988*. I also find that it would be substantially in the public interest for the requested Determination to be made.

CONCLUSIONS

I have consequently made the attached Determination.

DECLARATION OF CONTROLLED SPECIMENS

I, Robyn Bromley, Acting Assistant Secretary, Marine Conservation Branch of the Marine and Water Division, as Delegate of the Minister for the Environment and Heritage, having considered comments as required by subsection 9B(3) of the *Wildlife Protection (Regulation of Exports and Imports) Act 1982* (the Act) and having taken into account advice from the Designated Authority on those matters specified in subsection 10A(5) of the Act, hereby declare specimens of the Class *Holothuroidea* (beche-de-mer, trepang, sea cucumber) to be 'controlled specimens' for the purposes of subsection 10A(2) of the Act, subject to the following conditions:

1. Operation of the fishery will be carried out in accordance with the document entitled "Queensland East Coast Beche-de-mer Fishery - Statement of Management Arrangements" dated April 2001;
2. For the East Coast fishery the Total Allowable Catch for the financial year 2001/2002 will be a maximum of 380 tonnes (wet weight) comprising:
 - 0 tonnes black tearfish (*Holothuria nobilis*),
 - a maximum of 127 tonnes white tearfish (*Holothuria fuscogilva*), and
 - a maximum of 253 tonnes for all other sea cucumber species;
3. The Designated Authority is to be advised of any proposals for increase in Total Allowable Catch and the rationale behind the increase;
4. Minimum legal size of 15cm will apply for all holothurians in the fishery;
5. The Queensland Fisheries Service to review information on the distribution and possible stock structure of the harvested holothurian species, known life history characteristics and the patterns of harvesting and operational characteristics of the fishery, and assess the risks of local and regional scale depletion;
6. The Queensland Fisheries Service assess the available options and mechanisms for managing the distribution of catches and effort at scales appropriate to the likely population distribution and identify approaches to provide a low risk of localised or regional depletion;
7. Conditions 5 and 6 to be finalised by 31 December 2003 and final reports to be provided to the Designated Authority;
8. Reports are to be provided annually by the Queensland Fisheries Service to the Designated Authority and to include: a report on total catch (number of specimens and wet weight) and catch per unit effort, by species, area and month, and incorporate an overall assessment of the fishery including, but not limited to, progress on addressing compliance issues, research, review of progress on Conditions 5 and 6 and review of the progress in achieving the objectives of the management arrangements for the twelve months ending June 30 to be submitted by 31 September; and
9. This declaration expires on 30 June 2004.





1. This exemption is granted for a period up to 31 March 2002.
2. This exemption is granted subject to the provision of:
 - Data from a study measuring capillary haemoglobin, venous haemoglobin and serum ferritin of 300 donors by 31 August 2001; and
 - Data from a study on the effect of reduction in donation frequency on the incidence of iron deficiency in pre-menopausal females by 31 December 2001.

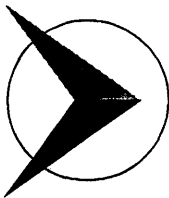
