Notice is given that the Australian Municipal, Administrative, Clerical and Services Union has made application for a declaration that the terms hereinafter mentioned be a common rule in the Northern Territory for the performance of work in social and community services industry and the funded, community based, crisis and supported accommodation services industry.

"This declaration shall not apply to:

- (i) persons employed pursuant to the Public Service Act 1922; or
- (ii) persons employed pursuant to the Northern Territory Public Sector Employment and Management Act 1993; or
- (iii) persons employed pursuant to the Northern Territory Local Government Act 1993; or
- (iv) any employer in respect of employees who are recognised as local governing bodies for the purposes of distribution of financial assistance to local government in the Northern Territory; or
- (v) persons engaged in classes of work who are covered by an award and/or industrial agreement registered in the Australian Industrial Relations Commission; or
- (vi) persons engaged in public sector employment as defined in section 4 of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996*; or
- (vii) persons employed pursuant to any Act of Parliament replacing the above Acts; or
- (viii) persons engaged in leading physical education programmes who may include and not be confined to the following: aerobic instructors, gymnastic instructors, sporting coaches and swimming instructors; or
- (ix) persons employed in a service; the predominant function of which is the provision of employment services; or
- (x) persons employed in a service, the predominant function of which is the provision of family day care and child care services; or

- (xi) persons employed in a service, the predominant function of which is the provision of care or counselling in drug or alcohol rehabilitation; or
- (xii) persons employed in a service, the predominant function of which is to care for or train people with disabilities; or
- (xiii) persons the predominant function of which is the direct involvement in delivery of respite or home based care and persons receiving payments to family sponsorship activities; or
- (xiv) persons employed in Aboriginal organisations, the predominant function of which is the provision in training or education, health or legal aid advice and assistance to Aboriginal people and persons employed in Aboriginal organisations, the predominant function of which is the provisions of crisis and supported accommodation and or related support services; or
- (xv) persons employed in organisations governed by Aboriginal traditional owners for Aboriginal cultural purposes."

"persons involved in delivery of respite or home based care and persons receiving payments to family sponsorship activities."



The Australian Customs Service has completed its inquiry into whether anti-dumping measures currently applying to exports of polyvinyl chloride (PVC) homopolymer resin from the United States of America should be continued for a further five years. Customs' findings are detailed in Trade Measures Report No. 46.

Customs is satisfied that the expiration of the measures would be likely to lead to a recurrence of the dumping and the material injury that the anti-dumping measures were intended to prevent.

Customs has therefore recommended that the Minister continue the dumping duty notice applying to PVC from the USA, which are due to expire on 21 January 2002.

The Minister has accepted this recommendation and, by this notice, declares that he has decided to take steps to secure the continuation of the dumping duty notice.

I, Conall O'Connell, First Assistant Secretary, Marine and Water Division, as Delegate of the Minister for the Environment and Heritage, having considered comments as required by subsection 9B(3) of the *Wildlife Protection (Regulation of Exports and Imports) Act 1982* (the Act) and having taken into account advice from the Designated Authority on those matters specified in Regulation 5A(1) for the purposes of subsection 10A(5) of the Act, hereby declare specimens of *Hippocampus procerus* harvested from Moreton Bay Marine Park by Ocean Oddities Pty Ltd (hereinafter referred to as the Company), to be "controlled specimens" for the purposes of subsection 10A(2) of the Act, subject to the following conditions:

1. The Company will obtain and comply with any conditions stipulated in the necessary permits for harvest and fish farming in any jurisdiction in which syngnathids are collected.
2. The Company will make all reasonable efforts when harvesting to ensure that no more than 60% of the males in the harvest site are taken.
3. Returning cultured or broodstock seahorses to the wild is not permitted.
4. The Company will make all reasonable efforts when harvesting to ensure that egg-bearing males are not taken.
5. No more than one quarter of the total number of individuals taken annually shall be collected within five kilometres of any one collection site.
6. The Company will have any deceased wild caught broodstock, examined by a relevant animal health laboratory, and reports are to be provided to the Designated Authority.
7. Seahorses caught from the wild may not be sold, traded or otherwise exchanged. The sale of seahorses is restricted to specimens which are captive-bred.
8. The animals will be prepared and shipped in accordance with Guideline 51 of the International Air Transport Association Live Animal Regulations.
9. Seahorses will be exported using the appropriate Australian Harmonised Export Commodity Code (AHECC).

10. Progress reports to be submitted by 30 June 2002, 31 December 2002 and 31 December 2003. A final report is due by 31 August 2004. Reports submitted to the Designated Authority should include the following:
- An assessment of the culturing operations from the initial broodstock collection
 - Total harvest: location, quantities, size and sex of individuals collected and accuracy of field identification of captured individuals
 - Results of spawning, mating and rearing activities and the number of broodstock mortalities that have occurred, and the results of any autopsies
 - Quantities and numbers of specimens sold and held as stock
 - Progress reports from the baseline research program
11. This declaration is valid until 1 December 2004



**MINISTER FOR THE ENVIRONMENT AND HERITAGE****NOTICE UNDER SECTION 17A OF THE FUEL QUALITY STANDARDS ACT 2000 CONCERNING A DECISION UNDER SECTION 13 OF THAT ACT TO GRANT AN APPROVAL FOR A VARIATION OF THE FUEL QUALITY STANDARD (DIESEL) DETERMINATION 2001**

I, Robert Murray Hill, Minister for the Environment and Heritage, provide the following information concerning my grant of an approval varying the *Fuel Quality Standard (Diesel) Determination 2001* to IOR Energy Pty Ltd, to permit the supply of diesel with a minimum density level of 790 kg/m³.

Name of approval holder

The approval has been granted to IOR Energy Pty Ltd.

Period of operation

The period of operation of the approval is the period of 12 months commencing 1 January 2002.

Details of the approved variation of the fuel standard

The grant of approval is attached to this notice. An instrument making minor amendments to the grant dated 8 November 2001 is also attached.

Background

IOR operates a 1200 barrel per day mini oil refinery at Eromanga in remote south west Queensland that has been producing local fuels since 1986. Its diesel fuel is distributed to regional consumers throughout western Queensland and north western NSW. At present, all the diesel fuel from the Eromanga plant is distributed through the BP distribution network and to other suppliers through the refinery exchange system.

IOR Exploration Pty Ltd is presently commissioning a 500 barrel per day mini oil refinery at Cuddapan, also in south west Queensland. This refinery is expected to commence production in November 2001.

IOR states that it is dependent on a single oilfield to supply both of its refineries. This oilfield produces crude with high cetane, low sulfur and low aromatics, however, the density is well below the minimum standard for diesel being introduced from 1 January 2002.

Section 15 of the Act provides that I must have regard to the following when deciding whether or not to grant an approval:

- (a) the protection of the environment;
- (b) the protection of occupational and public health and safety;
- (c) the interests of consumers; and
- (d) the impact on economic and regional development.

I may also have regard to any other matters I consider relevant.

Section 24A of the Act provides that I must consult the Fuel Standards Consultative Committee (FSCC) before granting an approval under section 13. The application was received on 3 October 2001 and was forwarded to members of the FSCC shortly thereafter. A report containing advice from the FSCC was referred to me on 6 November 2001. I had regard to the recommendations made by the FSCC before signing the instrument granting the approval on 8 November 2001. The FSCC considered minor technical amendments recommended by the FSCC Secretariat on 15 November 2001 and I considered the FSCC's recommendations in relation to these before signing the amending instrument and this amended notice.

Findings on material questions of fact

(a) Protection of the environment

The diesel supplied by IOR appears to be of a high environmental quality with low sulfur and aromatics and high cetane. It seems to be a relatively clean fuel that would contribute to reducing toxic emissions and the protection of the environment, albeit in remote rural areas.

(b) Protection of occupational and public health and safety

The reduction in emissions as a result of the lower density diesel, and the relatively high environmental quality of the diesel may contribute to the protection of occupational and public health and safety.

(c) Interest of consumers

Technical studies on the effects of density levels on emissions and engine performance have indicated that there are advantages for efficient engine performance in specifying a narrow range (or upper and lower limit) for density values. This is because the volumetric injection of fuel in diesel engines is affected by variations in density, with large variations affecting efficient combustion – which in turn influences engine performance.

As the IOR diesel has been in use since 1986, any operability issues from a lower density fuel for the current vehicle fleet should have already been apparent. It is not clear, however, what impact a lower density diesel would have on newer diesel vehicle technology.

In relation to the interests of consumers it is necessary to ensure that lower density levels do not impact adversely on efficient vehicle operation.

(d) Impact on economic and regional development

IOR states that it is dependent on a single oilfield to supply both of its refineries. This oilfield produces crude with high cetane, low sulfur and low

aromatics, however, the density is well below the minimum standard for diesel being introduced from 1 January 2002.

If the approval to vary the minimum density standard was denied, there would be an adverse impact on economic and regional development. IOR provides significant economic benefits to the remote and regional areas in which it operates by providing a competitive and independent local fuel supply. IOR refineries and plants also provide employment for the local community.


Evidence or other material on which the findings were based

The evidence and other material on which my findings were based were:

- The application dated 3 October 2001 from Ross Mackenzie, General Manager of IOR Energy Pty Ltd; and
- The report of the Fuel Standards Consultative Committee dated 6 November 2001, and further recommendations made on 15 November 2001.

Reasons for decision

1. The diesel produced by the IOR refineries appears to be of a relatively high environmental standard and is only supplied to a small share of the total Australian market.
2. A variation to the minimum diesel density standard will allow IOR to continue operating and will avoid the adverse economic impact on the region that would result if both the Eromanga and Cuddapan refineries were to close.
3. IOR would still be required to meet a minimum density standard (although lower than that to be regulated from 1 January 2002).
4. The interests of consumers will be protected with the independent technical study to ensure that the lower density level of the IOR diesel does not adversely impact on efficient engine operation.

- (b) can be mixed with higher density diesel or other products to take it up to the required density, and whether this is desirable.

Depending on the outcome of those investigations, consideration may be given to revoking the approval.

I, Robert Murray Hill, Minister for the Environment and Heritage, provide the following information concerning my decision under section 13 of the *Fuel Quality Standards Act 2000* ("the Act") to grant an approval to vary the *Fuel Standard (Petrol) Determination 2001* to the Commonwealth Department of Health and Aged Care to facilitate the supply of avgas under the Comgas Scheme.

Name of approval holder

The approval has been granted to the Assistant Secretary, Health and Community Strategies Branch, Office of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health, Department of Health and Aged Care on behalf of the Commonwealth.

Period of operation

The period of operation of the approval is the period of 12 months commencing 1 January 2002.

Details of the approved variation of the fuel standard

The approval is attached to this notice.

Background

Avgas is supplied to about 33 Aboriginal communities under the Comgas Scheme (the Scheme) administered under the Commonwealth's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Substance Use Program in the Commonwealth Department of Health and Aged Care. The Scheme is a long-term approach to petrol sniffing, and addresses education, prevention, rehabilitation and treatment. The Scheme ensures that communities using aviation fuel as part of an abatement strategy can continue to do so at no additional cost. The supply of avgas for use in motor vehicles is not permitted under the *Fuel Standard (Petrol) Determination 2001* because avgas does not meet several of the fuel specifications in that standard.

Section 15 of the Act provides that I must have regard to the following when deciding whether or not to grant an approval:

- (a) the protection of the environment;
- (b) the protection of occupational and public health and safety;
- (c) the interests of consumers; and
- (d) the impact on economic and regional development.

I may also have regard to any other matters I consider relevant.

Section 24A of the Act provides that I must consult the Fuel Standards Consultative Committee (FSCC) before granting an approval under section 13. The application was received on 5 October 2001 and was forwarded to members of the FSCC shortly thereafter. The FSCC Secretariat sought comment on the application from Dr Maggie Brady, a Research Fellow at the Centre for Aboriginal Economic Policy Research, and from Dr Bart Currie of the Menzies School of Health Research. A report containing advice from the FSCC was referred to me on 6 November 2001. I have had regard to the recommendations made by the FSCC in deciding to grant this approval.

Findings on material questions of fact

(a) Protection of the environment

The high lead content of avgas relative to other fuels may contribute to higher ambient levels of lead in the environment. Lead is emitted from vehicles' exhaust systems, and it may enter the atmosphere as a result of evaporation from fuel tanks, carburettor or spillage during transport and refuelling. However, in the remote coastal and desert communities participating in the Scheme, this is unlikely to create a major environmental problem because of the low population density of those communities.

(b) Protection of occupational and public health and safety

Avgas is supplied to indigenous communities participating in the Scheme as a strategy intended to reduce the incidence of petrol sniffing in those communities. Petrol sniffing is a public health and safety issue because of the adverse effects of inhaling hydrocarbons in petrol, such as benzene and toluene. The effects vary according to the amounts inhaled, but can include cardiac arrest and respiratory paralysis leading to death, eye irritation, burns to skin, eyes and throat, convulsions, loss of consciousness, nausea, vomiting, hallucinations, delusions, leukaemia, cataracts, and dermatitis.

Avgas tends to reduce the incidence of petrol sniffing, and thus exposure to lead in petrol, because it has less toluene and other aromatic hydrocarbons than commonly used petrols, and therefore does not produce the physiological effects sought by petrol sniffers. If sniffed, it causes headaches and muscle cramps. The use of avgas has been found to dramatically reduce the incidence of petrol sniffing in some communities, particularly when restrictions on sniffable petrol supplies have been combined with other intervention strategies.

Substituting petrol with avgas has been less successful for communities that have access to petrol, such as larger communities that may have significant numbers of visitors with petrol vehicles, and communities within only hundreds of kilometres of urban centres. Comgas is supplied specifically for the residents of remote communities.

There is a concern that sniffing of avgas creates a high risk of lead inhalation which can also impact adversely on human health. As several authorities in this area have recommended that the safety and effectiveness of using avgas in indigenous communities be scientifically assessed, a further study on this issue will be undertaken to assess whether there are any more suitable fuels that could be used to address the problem.

(c) Interest of consumers

There are reports that avgas has adverse effects on some cars and equipment (such as generators and other small petrol driven machines). Car engines built since 1986 are designed to run on unleaded fuel and their catalytic converters are designed to reduce the toxicity of exhaust emissions. The lead content in avgas can damage catalytic converters, leading to increased emissions. The lead in avgas can also damage oxygen sensors, causing an increase in fuel consumption and "rough running". Conversely, there are anecdotal reports that indigenous bush mechanics are satisfied with the performance of vehicles running on avgas (Currie, oral communication 8/10/01).

(d) Impact on economic and regional development

In communities where petrol sniffing is being contained, there are likely to be higher levels of employment, reduced health costs, less social dysfunction and a lower incidence of criminal activity.

Evidence or other material on which the findings were based

The evidence and other material on which my findings were based were:

- The application dated 5 October 2001 from Vicki Murphy, A/g Assistant Secretary, Health and Community Strategies Branch, Department of Health and Aged Care; and
- The report of the Fuel Standards Consultative Committee dated 6 November 2001.

Reasons for decision

1. In the remote coastal and desert communities participating in the Comgas Scheme, the relatively high lead content of avgas is unlikely to create a major environmental problem, because of the low population density of those communities
2. During the period of the approval, the safety and effectiveness of using avgas in indigenous communities will be further assessed. On the basis of existing results in participating communities, it appears that the relative benefits of reducing the incidence of petrol sniffing in those communities outweighs the health and safety risks arising from the supply of avgas.
3. The possible adverse effects of avgas on cars and other machinery have not been fully investigated. This approval is limited to twelve months in the expectation that the potential supply of alternative fuels under the Scheme will be assessed within that time. At least in the meantime, the potential beneficial effects of the Scheme for communities participating in the Scheme clearly outweigh any possible adverse effects on cars and machinery.

REVOCATION OF AUTHORITY TO CARRY ON A BANKING BUSINESS IN AUSTRALIA

- B. Northern Territory Credit Union Limited, ACN 087 650 913 (the "ADI") is an ADI by virtue of the FSR Act provision mentioned in recital A; and
- C. On 7 November 2001, the ADI, by notice in writing to the Australian Prudential Regulation Authority ("APRA"), requested a revocation of its section 9 authority; and
- D. I am satisfied that the revocation of the authority:
 - (i) would not be contrary to the national interest; and
 - (ii) would not be contrary to the interests of depositors of the ADI.

I, Graeme Thompson, a delegate of APRA, under paragraph 9A(1)(a) of the Banking Act **REVOKE** the section 9 authority of the ADI.



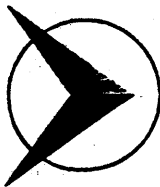

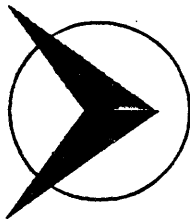
