Information contained in the supporting documents to the application concerning the proposed alteration, the reason for the proposal and the effect of the proposal is as follows:

1. The particulars of the proposed alteration is to delete clauses C and D from Rule 3 and to insert in lieu thereof:
 - 3C. *such other persons, whether or not employees in the industries of the Union as have been elected or appointed full time National Officers or Branch Officers or organisers of the Union or any Branch thereof and admitted as members of the Union. For the purposes of this Clause C of this Rule, the full-time Officers of the Union and of any Branch thereof shall be the holders of any of the offices of National Officers or Branch Officers where the duties of such office are of a full-time nature.*
 - 3D. *such persons, whether or not employees in the industries of the Union, who -*

- (i) *are full time organisers or industrial officers of the Union or a Branch of the Union; and,*
- (ii) *were, on the day immediately preceding the date fixed by the Industrial Registrar and notified by him in the Gazette pursuant to the Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904 as amended from time to time as the day upon which the amalgamation of The Hospital Employees' Union of Australia and the Health and Research Employees' Association of Australia is to take effect full time organisers or industrial officers of the Health and Research Employees' Association of Australia or a Branch thereof and members of The Health and Research Employees' Association of Australia.*

2. The reasons for the proposed alteration are as follows:

- (a) To remove all references to specific national and branch offices from the Eligibility Rule.
- (b) To remove references to abolished or redundant offices within the HSUA.
- (c) It will simplify the task of creating (and abolishing) national and branch offices, as in future new offices will be able to be made (and redundant offices will be able to be abolished) under the more straightforward process of s159 of the RAO Schedule rather than under the more time consuming process set out in s158.

And thereby,

- (d) To encourage the efficient management and democratic functioning and control of the union in accordance with the objects of the RAO Schedule.

3. The effect of the proposed alteration is as follows:

The alteration will have no effect on the current scope of the eligibility rule of the HSUA.

The proposed alteration will not encroach on the eligibility of other organisations.

- (a) The alteration will remove references to specific national and branch offices from the eligibility rule of the HSUA.

This Notice is the *Social Security (Class of Debts — Youth Allowance) Notice 2004*.

2 Commencement

This Notice commences on 2 April 2004.

3 Definitions

In this Notice:

Act means the *Social Security Act 1991*.

parental income test means the parental income test under Module F of Part 3.5 of the Act.

specified Commonwealth benefit means a Commonwealth benefit mentioned in point 1067G-F3 of Submodule 2, Module F of Part 3.5 of the Act.

Section 4

4 Class of debts

- (1) The class of debts specified is the class of debts that includes a debt incurred by a person in the following circumstances:
 - (a) the person received youth allowance at any time between 1 July 1998 and 26 April 2003 (inclusive);
 - (b) the parental income test applied to the person because the person was not independent;
 - (c) between 1 July 2002 and 26 April 2003 (inclusive), Centrelink identified the person as exempt from the parental income test in respect of a particular youth allowance payment period occurring between 1 July 1998 and 26 April 2003 (inclusive) because a parent of the person was receiving a specified Commonwealth benefit during that period;
 - (d) the person should not have been treated as exempt from the parental income test in respect of that payment period because neither of the person's parents was receiving a specified Commonwealth benefit during that payment period;
 - (e) because of the exemption, the person received a higher amount of youth allowance than the person was entitled to receive and therefore incurred a debt;
 - (f) the Secretary is satisfied that, when the exemption applied to the person, the parent whose income circumstances had changed had actively notified Centrelink of the change in accordance with the parent's notification obligations.
- (2) For paragraph (1) (f), a person's parent is taken to have actively notified Centrelink of a change in circumstances in relation to his or her income if the parent told Centrelink about his or her change of circumstances in relation to his or her income by writing to, telephoning or attending a Centrelink office.

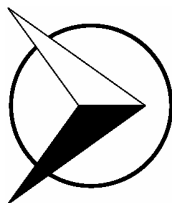
