### 3 – INDUSTRY

The industries in or in connection with which the Union is registered are the woollen, worsted, wool tops, spinning, weaving, dyeing, finishing, wastebreaking, flock, wadding, felt and feltex, flax, cotton, carpets, silk and artificial silk, rayon and/or any vegetable or synthetic fibre or non-woven substance, hosiery, half-hose, knitting, textile printing, textile furnishings, tapestry, braids and tassels clothing and footwear industries and including but not limited to those parts of the Felt Hatting Industry and the industry of making hats from materials other than felt and the boots, shoes and slippers industry and the clothing and tailoring industries referred to and the makers and/or trimmers an/or blockers and/or repairers of all articles of headwear, and/or millinery (including berets), the makers or repairers of gloves, handkerchiefs, serviettes, tablecloths, sheets, pillow-slips, pillow-shams, quilts, bed valances,

bed curtains, mosquito nets, towels or aprons, embroidering or otherwise ornamenting any of the abovementioned articles, furriers, makers or repairers of all descriptions of umbrellas, the dyeing, cleaning and repairing industries, and all persons engaged in the laundry industry **Rule 4**.

### 4 - CONDITIONS OF ELIGIBILITY FOR MEMBERSHIP

The Union shall consist of:

- (a) Without limiting the generality of any other part of this rule, all an unlimited number of persons wholly or partly engaged or usually engaged in or in connection with the following industries, mills, or factories, places of work, products or processes in Australia:
  - **textile,** woollen, worsted, wool tops, spinning, weaving, dyeing, finishing, waste-breaking, flock, wadding, felt and feltex, flax, cotton, carpets, silk and artificial silk, rayon and/or any other vegetable or synthetic fibre or non woven substance, technical textile, textile backing, textile coating, textile services, hosiery, half-hose, knitting, textile printing, textile furnishings, tapestry, braids and tassels;
- (b) Without limiting the generality of any other part of this rule, all an unlimited number of persons wholly or partly engaged or usually engaged in or in connection with the designing, preparing, patternmaking, manufacturing, making including the treatment or conversion of any vegetable or synthetic fibre or non-woven substance, processing, repairing, altering, trimming, blocking, pressing, finishing or selling from factory outlets in the manufacture of:
  - (i) infants' nappies;
  - (ii) table and sanitary napkins; of
  - (iii) facial and toilet tissue; of
  - (iv) tampons; of
  - (v) mats, towels and absorbent cloths, pads and wipers; of absorbent pads, and of
  - (vi) substitutes for the products of any of the industries, mills, or factories, places of work, products or processes listed in paragraph (a) above;
- (c) Without limiting the generality of any other part of this rule, all persons wholly or partly engaged or usually engaged in or in connection with bona fide male and female artisans, apprentices and employees in the Felt Hatting Industry, and the designing, preparing, patternmaking, manufacturing, making, processing, repairing, altering, trimming, blocking, pressing, finishing and/or selling from factory outlets the whole or any part of all articles of headwear and/ or millinery including but not limited to hats, caps, berets, hoods and helmets. all employees engaged in or in connection with the preparation or manufacture of materials or articles used in or

- in connection with the Felt Hat Industry or Felt Hat Making; and also all males engaged or usually engaged in the process of making Straw Boaters, Buckram Shapes, wet and spartive stiffening by hand or machine, and all types of Panamas, Pan-dans and Helmets and all types of straw and fabric hoods; and the making of such hoods into hats;
- (d) Without limiting the generality of any other part of this rule, all persons an unlimited number of employees, whose usual occupation is wholly or partly **engaged or usually engaged in or in connection** with the designing, preparing, patternmaking, manufacturing, making, processing, or repairing, altering, trimming, blocking, pressing, finishing and/or selling from factory outlets the whole or any part of footwear of every description including but not limited to boots, shoes, slippers and wood lasts of every description; also those engaged in designing, pattern cutting or preparing of patterns for the uppers or other parts of boots, shoes and slippers, mechanics engaged in the maintenance or repair of machinery used in the production of boots, shoes and slippers;
- (e) Without limiting the generality of any other part of this rule, all persons an unlimited number of employees wholly or partly engaged or usually engaged in or in connection with designing, preparing, patternmaking, manufacturing, making, processing, repairing, altering, trimming, blocking, pressing, finishing and/or selling from factory outlets the whole or any part of: employed in any one or more of the following industries:
  - making and/or repairing the whole or any part of any male or (i) female garment; or of
  - any article of wearing apparel whatsoever, made from material of any description; , including all
  - (iii) any articles of neckwear; , making and/or trimming and/or blocking and/or repairing all articles of headwear and/or millinery (including berets) (other than employees in felt hat manufacturing establishments for whom provision is made in paragraph (c) above) and excluding boots, shoes, slippers and gloves only;
  - <u>(iv)</u> handkerchiefs;
  - any fashion accessory whatsoever. <u>(v)</u>
- Without limiting the generality of any other part of this rule, all (f) persons wholly or partly engaged or usually engaged in or in designing, preparing, patternmaking connection with manufacturing, making, processing, repairing, altering, trimming, blocking, pressing, finishing and/or selling from factory outlets of the whole or any part of any description of textile furnishings including but not limited to any description of serviettes,

- pillowslips, pillowshams, sheets, blankets, bedspreads, tablecloths, towels, quilts, aprons, mosquito nets, bed valances, cot covers, blinds, carpets, cushions, curtains or bed curtains and automotive textile furnishings including but not limited to motor vehicle and other seat covers, mats and dash covers.
- (g) Without limiting the generality of any other part of this rule, all persons wholly or partly engaged or usually engaged in or in connection with the laundry industry, or the (ii) dyeing and/or cleaning and/or repairing and/or pressing and/or ironing any garment or any article of any description whatsoever. which is, in the way of business, usually dyed and/or cleaned and/or repaired and/or pressed and/or ironed in the establishment of dyer and cleaner or laundry;
- (h) Without limiting the generality of any other part of this rule, all persons wholly or partly engaged or usually engaged in or in connection with designing, preparing, patternmaking for, manufacturing, (iii) making, and/or processing, repairing, altering, trimming, blocking, pressing, finishing and/or selling from factory outlets of the whole or any part of any description of umbrella;
  - (iv) making and/or repairing any description of handkerchiefs, serviettes, pillowslips, pillowshams, sheets, tablecloths, towels, quilts, aprons, mosquito nets, bed valances, or bed curtains;
- (i) (v) Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, any other part of this rule, all persons wholly or partly engaged or usually engaged in or in connection with the embroidering and/or otherwise ornamenting of:
  - (i) any of the abovementioned articles referred to in any other part of this rule; , including the making and/or manufacturing of such ornamentations as are made of textiles, felts or similar fabrics, and of (ii) artificial flowers.;
- (i) (vi)wWithout limiting the generality of the foregoing, any other part of this rule, all persons wholly or partly engaged or usually engaged in or in connection with the industry of a furrier:; and,
- (k) (vii) wWithout limiting the generality of the foregoing, any other part of this rule, all persons wholly or partly engaged or usually engaged in or in connection with the making of chenille (except as to spinning and winding) and the designing, preparing, patternmaking, manufacturing, making, and/or processing, repairing, altering, trimming, blocking, pressing, finishing and/or selling from factory outlets of articles of all descriptions as are made of chenille;

- <u>Without limiting the generality of any other part of this rule, all persons wholly or partly engaged or usually engaged in or in connection with:</u>

- 1. Harvesting is restricted to dead plants removed from existing pasture land, and from areas which are being cleared in compliance with the South Australian *Native Vegetation Act 1991*.
- 2. The operation will be undertaken in accordance with the proposal submitted on 10<sup>th</sup> October 2006.
- 3. Total harvest will not exceed 150 tonnes of yacca gum per annum.
- 4. All activities covered by this approval must be carried out in accordance with the necessary permits and approvals as required under State and Commonwealth law.
- 5. YIMA must submit a report for each three month period to the Department of the Environment and Water Resources within 28 days of the end of each calendar quarter.
- 6. This declaration is valid until 18<sup>th</sup> April 2010.



# INVITATION TO COMMENT ON A RISK ASSESSMENT AND RISK MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR GENETICALLY MODIFIED WHEAT

Australia's gene technology regulatory system is designed to protect the health and safety of people and the environment by identifying risks posed by, or as a result of, gene technology and managing those risks.

The Gene Technology Regulator is currently assessing licence application DIR 071/2006 from the Victorian Department of Primary Industries (DPI Victoria) to release genetically modified (GM) wheat into the environment under limited and controlled conditions.

DPI Victoria has applied for a licence to release up to 30 lines of wheat that have been genetically modified to enhance drought tolerance. The trial is proposed to take place at two sites in the local government areas of Horsham and Mildura, Victoria, on a maximum total area of 0.315 hectares over one growing season (May 2007 – March 2008).

The purpose of the proposed trial is to conduct 'proof of concept' research to evaluate the agronomic performance of the GM wheat lines under rain-fed, drought prone conditions. Seed will also be collected and retained for seed increase for further trials (subject to additional approvals). No products from the release would be used for human food or animal feed.

The Regulator has prepared a risk assessment and risk management plan (RARMP) for the proposed release and suggests a range of conditions (including containment measures) that would be imposed if a licence was issued.

The Regulator welcomes written submissions in order to finalise the RARMP, which will then form the basis of her decision on whether to issue the licence. 

The request for reconsideration must be made in writing, must set out the reasons for making the request, and must be given to APRA within 21 days after the day on which you first received notice of this decision, or within such further period as APRA allows. If you are dissatisfied with the outcome of APRA's reconsideration of the decision, you may, subject to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal Act 1975, apply to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal for review of the reconsidered decision.

**Telemarketing Industry Standard** means the *Telecommunications (Do Not Call Register) (Telemarketing and Research Calls) Industry Standard 2007* made by the ACMA on 22 March 2007.

- 4 Direction –ACMA to consider whether to exercise its power to vary the Telemarketing Industry Standard
- (1) I direct the ACMA under section 14 of the ACMA Act to consider whether to exercise its power in section 130 of the Telecommunications Act to vary the Telemarketing Industry Standard so as to:
  - (a) remove the prohibition on making, or attempting to make, a research call at any time on a Sunday; and
  - (b) include a prohibition on making, or attempting to make, a research call on a Sunday at the same times as a research call is prohibited on a Saturday.
  - (2) In considering whether to exercise its power in section 130 I direct the ACMA to have regard to the following matters:
    - (a) the important public benefit derived from accurate and high-quality research; and
    - (b) the likely impact that prohibiting research calls on Sundays would have on the collection of accurate and high-quality research.




