

#### **NOTICE OF DECISION TO GRANT A PERMIT UNDER THE HAZARDOUS WASTE (REGULATION OF EXPORTS AND IMPORTS) ACT 1989**

Pursuant to Section 33 of the *Hazardous Waste (Regulation of Exports and Imports) Act 1989*, notice is given that on 8 February 2010 a permit was granted to Umicore Australia Limited (Umicore), 414 Somerville Road, Tottenham, Victoria 3012, Australia (telephone 03 9362 6500, facsimile 03 9362 6555). The permit is to export up to 500 tonnes of Zinc Ash from Barry Stevens, 36 Paremata Crescent, Porirua, Wellington 5024, New Zealand (telephone +64 4233 0400, facsimile +64 4233 0417).

The zinc ash will be stored in 200 litre drums. The drums will then be placed in appropriate shipping containers. The waste will then be shipped directly from the ports of either Auckland or Christchurch in New Zealand, on its sea voyage to the port of Melbourne in Victoria, Australia, where the waste will then be transported by road to the Umicore facilities in Tottenham, where it must be recycled by recovery operation R4 '*Recycling/reclamation of metals and metal compounds*'.

Movements must not transit through any other port or roadstead.

The export will take place in twenty five (25) shipments from the date above and not after 9 December 2010.



Pursuant to Section 33 of the *Hazardous Waste (Regulation of Exports and Imports) Act 1989*, notice is given that an application has been received from TES-AMM Australia Pty Ltd, 11 Epic Place, Villawood, NSW 2163, Australia to import up to 360,000 kg of Lithium and Nickel Metal Hydride batteries to TES-AMM Singapore Pte Ltd, No. 9 Benoi Sector, Singapore 629844 for recycling/reclamation of metals and metal compounds.

The material has hazardous characteristic H13 “*capable, after disposal of yielding another material...*”. The waste identification code for this waste is A1170 “*Unsorted waste batteries*”.

The waste batteries will be packed according to UNEP guidelines for the transportation of dangerous goods packing group II with contact points protected against short circuiting by insulated tape. They will then be aggregated and packed in recyclable fibreboard boxes and palletised for shipping. They will then be shipped directly from the ports of Brisbane, Sydney, Melbourne, South Australia, and Western Australia to the port of Singapore, and then be transported by road to the disposal facilities at TESS-AMM Singapore Pte Ltd, No. 9 Benoi Sector, Singapore.

If granted an import permit, transport of the waste to TES-AMM would take place in approximately forty eight (48) shipments over a 12 month period.

This Ruling applies from 17 February 2010.

**REVOCATION OF PERMANENT BAN ON GOODS**

I, CRAIG EMERSON, Minister for Competition Policy and Consumer Affairs, hereby REVOKE the permanent ban on unsafe goods described below, made pursuant to section 65 C(7) of the Trade Practices Act, published in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette No S 65 of 16 April 2009.

**Particulars of goods:**

Children's toys having accessible materials with a lead migration level greater than 90 mg/kg of lead, when tested in accordance with the testing procedure and interpretation of results specified in Australian/New Zealand Standard AS/NZS ISO 8124.3:2003 'Safety of toys, Part 3: Migration of certain elements'.

**Summary of Reasons**

This ban is revoked because the consumer product safety standard for lead and certain elements in children's toys, which was registered on the Federal Register of Legislative Instruments on 2 February 2009, takes effect from 1 January 2010, thus making the ban redundant.
